The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE), Division of Environment, Bureau of Water, will conduct a public hearing at 10:00 a.m. Tuesday, March 21, 2023, in Room 530, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 SW Jackson, Topeka, Kansas, to consider the adoption of proposed amended public water supply regulation K.A.R. 28-15-56, regarding the public water supply project loan program.

A summary of the proposed regulation and estimated economic impact follows:

Summary of Regulation:

K.A.R. 28-15-56. Project eligibility. Aligns the proposed regulation with the statute change required by K.S.A. 2022 Supp. 65-163d that removed the prohibition against financing projects that trigger the Water Transfer Act, K.S.A. 82a-1501 through 82a-1508. Allows loans from the public water supply loan fund to finance the costs of projects that would have triggered the Water Transfer Act.

Economic Impact:

Cost to the agency: The proposed regulation will not result in increased costs to the agency.

Cost to the public and regulated community: There will be no costs related to the proposed regulation that are reasonably expected to be incurred by businesses, local governments, public utility ratepayers, or members of the public. The public water supply loan fund is a voluntary financing program for municipalities.

Costs to other governmental agencies or units: There will be no costs related to the proposed regulation that are reasonably expected to be incurred by other governmental agencies or units because they are not eligible to use the public water supply loan fund.

A detailed economic impact is provided in the economic impact statement that is available from the designated KDHE contact staff person or at the Kansas State Revolving Fund website, as listed below.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulation. Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 34. — DISCRIMINATION BECAUSE OF DISABILITY

21-34-1. Definitions. Each of the following terms, as used in this article of the commission's regulations and in K.S.A. 44-1001 et seq. and amendments thereto, shall have the meaning specified in this regulation:

(a) "Covered entity" means an employer, labor organization, employment agency, or joint labor-management

committee.

(b) "Direct threat" means a significant risk of substantial harm to the health or safety of an individual or others that cannot be eliminated or reduced by reasonable accommodation.

(c) "Essential function" means the fundamental job duties of the employment position that an individual with a disability holds or seeks. The term "essential function" shall not include the marginal functions of the position.

(d) "Has a record of such impairment" means has a history of, or has been misclassified as having, a mental or physical impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities.

(e) "Illegal use of drugs" means the use of drugs, the possession or distribution of which is unlawful under the controlled substances act, 21 U.S.C. 812. This term shall not include the use of a drug taken under the supervision of a licensed health care professional, or other uses authorized by controlled substances act or other provisions of federal or Kansas law.

(f) "Physical or mental impairment" means either of the following:

(1) Any physiological disorder or condition, cosmetic disfigurement, or anatomical loss affecting one or more body organs or body systems; or

(2) any mental or psychological disorder, including an intellectual disability, organic brain syndrome, emotional or mental illness, and learning disabilities.

(g) "Qualified individual with a disability" means an individual with a disability who meets the requisite skill, experience, education, and other job-related requirements of the employment position that the individual holds or seeks and who, with or without reasonable accommodation, can perform the essential functions of the position.

(h) "Qualification standards" means the personal and professional attributes, including the skill, experience, education, physical, medical, safety and other requirements, established by a covered entity as requirements that an individual must meet in order to be eligible for the position held or sought.

(i) "Substantially limits," when used regarding an individual, means that the individual has, is regarded as having, or has a record of having a physical or mental impairment that affects or is perceived as affecting the individual's ability to perform a major life activity that most people in the general population can perform. This term shall not require that the individual be prevented, or significantly or severely restricted, from performing a major life activity. Article 54. — OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

100-54-13. Professional liability insurance. (a) Each individual licensed by the board as an occupational therapist shall, before rendering professional services within Kansas, submit to the board evidence that the individual has one of the following types of professional liability insurance coverage:

(1) Individual coverage of not less than \$100,000 per claim, subject to an annual aggregate of not less than \$300,000 for all claims made during the period of coverage; or

(2) coverage through the individual's employer under an additional insured policy for which the limit is not less than \$1,000,000 per claim, subject to an annual aggregate of not less than \$3,000,000.

(b) Each individual licensed by the board as an occupational therapist and rendering professional services in Kansas shall submit, with the annual application for renewal of the license, evidence that the individual has the professional liability insurance coverage specified in subsection (a). The exhibits shall include all documents reviewed and relied upon by the external independent third-party reviewer for its decision.

(f) The department's summary shall be submitted to the presiding officer and the appellant within 30 days as specified in subsection (a) or by the date approved by the presiding officer as specified in subsection (b) unless there is an administrative or other emergency beyond the control of the presiding officer or the department. The due date for the department's summary may be modified by the presiding officer before or after the administrative or other emergency. specified in subsection (a) or by the date approved by the presiding officer as specified in subsection (b) unless there is an administrative or other emergency beyond the control of the presiding officer or the department. The due date for the department's summary may be modified by the presiding officer before or after the administrative or other emergency.
