Grant funds are available from the Federal Victim Assistance of Crime Act (VOCA) Victim Assistance grant program for the funding period of October 1, 2011 through September 30, 2012, to eligible applicants. The purpose of this grant program is to fund public agencies and nonprofit, community and faith-based organizations that provide direct assistance to crime victims. For the purpose of these grant program guidelines, direct services are defined as those efforts that (1) respond to the emotional and physical needs of crime victims; (2) assist primary and secondary victims of crime to stabilize their lives after a victimization; (3) assist victims to understand and participate in the criminal justice system; and (4) provide victims of crime with a measure of safety, such as boarding up broken windows and replacing or repairing locks. A crime victim is a person who has suffered physical, sexual, financial or emotional harm as a result of the commission of a crime.

Executive Order 11-23

WHEREAS, the economic well-being of the great State of Kansas and the growth of liberty and economic opportunities for the citizens of Kansas and for Kansas businesses are major priorities of this Administration; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the State of Kansas that the Governor receive high-quality advice on an ongoing basis regarding State, regional, and national economic conditions; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of a Governor's Economic Advisors Council will provide an effective and efficient mechanism for the Governor to obtain advice on a broad range of economic matters;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby establish the Governor's Economic Advisors Council ("the Council"). The Council shall report directly to the Governor. The Council shall consist of a Chairperson, so designated by the Governor, and between seven (7) and twenty (20) other members appointed by the Governor. Neither the Chair nor any other member shall have a fixed term and all members shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. The Chair shall establish such rules of operation as the Council may require. The Council shall analyze and advise the Governor on issues related to the fiscal and economic condition of the State of Kansas. The Council shall meet upon the request of the Governor or the Chair, but shall not meet less frequently than once every quarter. On request and to the extent necessary, the Council shall receive staff support from and shall office within the Department of Commerce utilizing only existing Department of Commerce resources. All state entities under my jurisdiction are directed to fully cooperate with the Council, including providing such information as the Council may deem necessary and may request in furtherance of its duties.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 11-23 and shall become effective immediately.

Executive Order 11-24

Extension of Prior Conditional and
Temporary Relief Executive Order

By virtue of the authority vested in me by the Kansas Emergency Management Act, Chapter 48, Article 9, of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, to meet the inherent dangers of disasters, I hereby proclaim a State of Disaster Emergency, as follows:

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 48-925(b) provides that the Governor may issue orders and proclamations which shall have the force and effect of law under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 48-924; and

WHEREAS, on the 22nd day of May, 2011, a tornado, large hail, and extreme weather conditions resulted in an emergency disaster in the city of Joplin, in Jasper County, Missouri; and

WHEREAS, I have previously acknowledged that a State of Emergency Disaster exists and have issued Executive Order 11-10 on this topic to provide support to the citizens of Kansas and Missouri; and

WHEREAS, I have been informed by the relevant authorities that the emergency conditions that necessitated Executive Order 11-10 still persists; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order 11-10 is set to expire on August 1, 2011;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby acknowledge a state of emergency exists in the state of Missouri, and declare it necessary to assist and expedite all disaster recovery efforts. In order to accommodate this need and to provide assistance to the citizens of Missouri and Kansas in this extreme situation, I hereby order the following:

1. Executive Order 11-10 shall be extended and shall remain in full force and effect, with no break in application, for certain qualified practitioners of the healing arts as defined further herein, until November 1, 2011.
2. Practitioners of the healing arts who qualify for the extension of temporary license pursuant to this Order must meet the following criteria: a) Practitioners must have qualified for and received a temporary license from the Kansas Board of Healing Arts pursuant to the authority granted by Executive Order 11-10; b) Practitioners with a temporary license issued pursuant to Executive Order 11-10 must continue to meet all the requirements for a temporary license contained in Executive Order 11-10 and imposed by the Kansas Board of Healing Arts, which requirements remain in full force and effect; and c) Practitioners qualifying for an extension of temporary license pursuant to this Order must, in addition to the previous requirements, have applied for and be in the process of diligently and in good faith completing their application with the Kansas Board of Healing Arts for full and permanent licensure to practice in Kansas.
3. Temporary licenses granted pursuant to the authority of Executive Order 11-10 and extended pursuant to the authority of this Order shall expire on November 1, 2011 with no further extensions.

FURTHER, I direct that this executive order shall become effective immediately and shall continue in effect until November 1, 2011 unless extended or rescinded earlier by subsequent Executive Order.

This document shall be filed as Executive Order No. 11-24 with the Secretary of State.

Executive Order 11-25

Conditional and Temporary Relief from Motor Carrier Rules and Regulations

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 48-925(b) provides that the Governor may issue orders and proclamations which shall have the force and effect of law under subsection (b) of K.S.A. 48-924;

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Agriculture has issued drought disaster declarations in 46 counties, and Kansas has requested 4 additional counties be added to the drought declaration;

WHEREAS, I have issued Executive Order 11-18 declaring Drought Watch, Drought Warning and Drought Emergency conditions for various counties in Kansas;

WHEREAS, there is every indication that the present drought conditions will not abate in the near future; and

WHEREAS, these drought conditions may become more severe.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby declare there is a state of emergency in the state, and as a result, it is necessary to expedite all efforts to transport hay to livestock in drought stricken areas. In order to accommodate this need and to provide assistance to the citizens of Kansas in this emergency situation, I hereby order the following:

- 1. This declaration only applies to motor carriers hauling hay to livestock in drought stricken areas; and
2. In accordance with Title 49 C.F.R. 390.23, the requirements contained in the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations, Title 49 C.F.R. parts 390-399 are hereby suspended through the duration of the motor carrier's assistance in hauling hay to livestock in drought stricken areas until this order is rescinded or expanded by executive order or concurrent resolution of the legislature; and
3. All other applicable state and federal regulations shall apply, including but not limited to: Title 49 C.F.R. Part 382, Controlled Substances and Alcohol Use and Testing; the Kansas Motor Vehicle Driver's License Act, K.S.A. 8-234 et seq. and Title 49 C.F.R. part 383 Commercial Driver's License Standards as adopted by the Kansas Uniform Commercial Drivers' License Act, K.S.A. 8-2,125 et seq., the federal Minimum Levels of Financial Responsibility (insurance requirements) Title 49 C.F.R. part 387 as adopted by K.A.R. 82-4-3n and state insurance requirements as provided in K.A.R. 82-4-23; and
4. The registration and fuel tax permits as enforced by the Kansas Department of Revenue are temporarily suspended for the subject motor carriers; and
5. The licensing, certification and permitting rules and regulations as required by the Kansas Corporation Commission are temporarily suspended for the subject motor carriers; and
6. Participating motor carriers are not required to obtain an over-dimensional permit from the Kansas Department of Transportation; and
7. Participating motor carriers will be allowed to travel during nighttime hours if the over-dimensional load is marked with clearance lights and/or escort vehicles are used; and
8. Participating motor carriers are limited to a load that does not exceed 12 feet in width and does not exceed a height of 14 feet, six inches.

FURTHER, I direct that this executive order shall become effective immediately and shall continue in effect until rescinded or until drought conditions shall abate and drought emergency and disaster declarations shall be lifted.

This document shall be filed as Executive Order No. 11-25 with the Secretary of State.

Notice Concerning Kansas/Federal Water Pollution Control Permits and Applications

In accordance with Kansas Administrative Regulations 28-16-57 through 63, 28-18-1 through 15, 28-18a-1 through 32, 28-16-150 through 154, 28-46-7, and the authority vested with the state by the administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, various draft water pollution control documents (permits, notices to revoke and reissue, notices to terminate) have been prepared and/or permit applications have been received for discharges to waters of the United States and the state of Kansas for the class of discharges described below.

The proposed actions concerning the draft documents are based on staff review, applying the appropriate standards, regulations and effluent limitations of the state of Kansas and the Environmental Protection Agency. The final action will result in a Federal National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Authorization and/or a Kansas Water Pollution Control permit being issued, subject to certain conditions, revocation and reissuance of the designated permit or termination of the designated permit.

Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency Region VII have received a Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) hazardous waste Part A and Part B permit renewal application from Nexeo Solutions, LLC (Nexeo), formerly Ashland Distribution, located at 5420 Speaker Road, Kansas City, Kansas. KDHE and the EPA are providing notice of their intent to renew a jointly issued RCRA hazardous waste storage permit to Nexeo, the owner and operator of the facility.

The facility was originally permitted to store hazardous wastes in 1988 and assigned the EPA identification number KSD057889313. The permit was renewed in 2000, and again the facility has submitted the necessary applications for the renewal of its permit to continue operating the hazardous waste storage facility.

In October 1985, the state of Kansas received final authorization from the EPA to implement its own hazardous waste management program in lieu of the federal program except for the portions covered by the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA) of 1984. The KDHE portion of the permit (Part I) will be issued under the authority of K.S.A. 65-3430 et seq. and K.A.R. 28-31-4 through 28-31-279a, and the EPA portion of the permit (Part II) will be issued under the authority of sections 3001(g), 3001(h), 3002 (b), 3004(d), 3004 (u) and (v), 3005 and 6001 of RCRA.

Part I of the permit will authorize Nexeo to receive and store hazardous waste in approved containers generated

from on-site and off-site generators. A maximum of 9,240 gallons of containerized liquid and solid hazardous waste may be stored in the permitted storage area. The materials stored at the facility will include ignitable, corrosive, reactive, toxic, and listed liquid or solid hazardous wastes. The container storage area complies with 40 CFR Part 264 Subparts I and CC, and Part 270 requirements for container storage areas. Emergency equipment is available at the facility and appropriate warning signs are posted. The EPA portion (Part II) of the joint permit will address the requirements of HSWA.

(Editor's Note: The following regulation, which was published in the July 21, 2011 Kansas Register, contained an error in subsection (a). The correct version appears below. The effective date of the regulation remains August 5, 2011.)

Article 12.—WIRE-STRINGING RULES

82-12-7. Utility requirements for telecommunication supply lines. A utility may proceed with construction of any telecommunication supply line if both of the following requirements are met:

(a) Before beginning construction, the utility shall give written notice to all of the following entities that have facilities within ½ mile of any contemplated telecommunication supply line construction or change in construction:

(1) Railroads; and

(2) any other utilities, unless the utilities have executed a joint use or other agreement covering the area in which the construction is proposed.

(b) The proposed telecommunication supply line construction shall meet the following requirements:

(1) Be within the utility's certified area; and

(2) not result in any objection from other utilities or railroads that have been given written notice as required by subsection (a). (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 66-183; effective Aug. 11, 1995; amended Aug. 5, 2011.)

**Article 4.—ENTITLEMENT TO LEGAL
 REPRESENTATION**

105-4-2. Definition of terms. Terms used to determine eligibility for indigents' defense services shall have the following meanings: (a) Liquid assets. The defendant's liquid assets shall be defined as cash in hand, stocks and bonds, accounts at financial institutions, real property or homestead having a net value greater than \$50,000, and any other property that can be readily converted to cash, with the following exceptions:

(1) The defendant's car having a value of less than \$20,000, clothing, household furnishings, and any personal property that is exempt from attachment or levy of execution by K.S.A. 60-2304, and amendments thereto; and

(2) any other property, except a homestead having a net value greater than \$50,000, that is exempt from attachment or levy of execution by K.S.A. 60-2301 et seq., and amendments thereto.

The net value of the homestead shall be the fair market value less the mortgage, other encumbrances, and the reasonable cost of sale. The net value of any property transferred after the date of the alleged commission of the offense shall be included in the determination of the defendant's liquid assets.

(b) Household income. The defendant's household income shall be defined as the defendant's income and the income of all other persons related by birth, marriage, or adoption who reside with the defendant. Income shall include the total cash receipts before taxes from all resources, including money, wages, and the net receipts from nonfarm or farm self-employment. Income shall include regular payments from a governmental income maintenance program, alimony, child support, public or private pensions, annuities, and income from dividends, interest, rents, royalties, or periodic receipts from estates or trusts.

(c) Transfer of property.

(1) If the defendant has transferred property after the alleged commission of the offense, the court shall determine the reason for the transfer of property and whether adequate monetary consideration was received. If adequate monetary consideration was not received, the court shall presume that the transfer was made for the purpose of establishing eligibility unless the defendant furnishes clear and convincing evidence that the transfer was made exclusively for another purpose.

(2) If a transfer was made either for the purpose of establishing eligibility or without adequate monetary consideration, and the property is reconveyed to the defendant or an adjustment is made by which the defendant receives full value, the defendant shall, if otherwise qualified, be eligible to receive legal representation at state expense. (Authorized by K.S.A. 22-4504 and 22-4522; implementing K.S.A. 22-4504; effective May 1, 1984;

amended Nov. 1, 1996; amended, T-105-7-22-11, July 22, 2011.)

105-4-3. Affidavit of indigency. A standard format for an affidavit of indigency shall include the following information: (a) The defendant's liquid assets and household income;

(b) the defendant's household expenses;

(c) any extraordinary financial obligations of the defendant;

(d) the size of the defendant's household; and

(e) any transfer of property by the defendant after the date of the alleged commission of the offense.

If the information provided by the defendant on the affidavit is unclear, incomplete, contradictory, or questionable, further inquiry may be conducted by the board, the court, the county or district attorney, or other officer assigned by the court. The affidavit of indigency forms shall be published and distributed annually to the judicial administrator and to the administrative judge of each district. (Authorized by K.S.A. 22-4522; implementing K.S.A. 22-4504; effective May 1, 1984; amended May 1, 1985; amended, T-105-7-22-11, July 22, 2011.)

Article 4.—INSTANT GAMES AND DRAWINGS

TRUCK AND BUCKS DRAWING

111-4-3055. Name of drawing. The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Truck and Bucks Drawing," and will accept entries on and after the day Kansas lottery "Truck and Bucks" instant tickets are first offered for sale to the general public and ending on Friday, May 6, 2011, as specified in these rules. The drawing will be held soon at approximately 4:00 p.m. on Friday, May 6, 2011, at the 3i Show in Garden City, Kansas, or other time and location as determined by the executive director. Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R.

111-4-3055 through 111-4-3060 and K.A.R. 111-3-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-27-11, Jan. 16, 2011.)

111-4-3056. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Truck and Bucks Drawing" means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas Lottery at the 3i Show in Garden City, Kansas, or other location as determined by the executive director, at the time described in K.A.R. 111-4-3055, in which one participant is selected to win various prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-3057.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas "Truck and Bucks" instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under the rules of the "Truck and Bucks" instant game.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the "Truck and Bucks Drawing" entries are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution.

(e) "Bare arm technique" means a type of drawing where the person drawing the winning ticket from the receptacle or drum wears a long-sleeved shirt with sleeve rolled up above the elbow, a short-sleeved shirt (sleeve not extending past the elbow) or a no-sleeve shirt which exposes the drawer's bare arm and looks away from the drawing drum or receptacle while drawing. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-27-11, Jan. 16, 2011.)

111-4-3057. Prize. (a) One grand prize package will be given away at the "Truck and Bucks Drawing," which will be conducted on May 6, 2011. The grand prize winner shall receive a 2011 GMC Canyon ZQ8 crew cab truck, or similar vehicle, property taxes, registration fee, title fee, and cash, together with mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes. The grand prize package has an approximate value of \$42,857.

(b) All prizes are subject to lottery validation, set-offs and deductions authorized by law.

(c) The winner of the grand prize shall return to the lottery a completed claim form as provided by the lottery no later than 5:00 p.m. on the fourteenth day following the day the claim form is mailed to the person whose name was drawn or the person named on the ticket drawn will no longer be eligible for the prize. In such an event, the first eligible alternate entry drawn for that prize pursuant to subsection (e) of K.A.R. 111-4-3059 shall be declared the winner. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-27-11, Jan. 16, 2011.)

111-4-3058. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Truck and Bucks Drawing" to be conducted on May 6, 2011, shall be accomplished as follows:

(1) Obtain a valid "Truck and Bucks" Kansas instant lottery ticket.

(2) Determine if the ticket is a winning ticket in accordance with "Truck and Bucks" game rules. If the ticket is

a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Truck and Bucks Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the "Truck and Bucks Drawing."

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) A receptacle or drum shall be available and entries may be made at the Kansas lottery selling location at the 3i Show beginning May 4, 2011, until approximately 4:00 p.m. on May 6, 2011.

(6) Players may also deposit entries for the "Truck and Bucks Drawing" at any Kansas lottery event or location at which the lottery has specifically designated a receptacle for deposit of said entries until 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 3, 2011.

(7) Entries other than those entered in Kansas lottery designated receptacles, shall be mailed with proper postage to "Truck and Bucks Drawing," P. O. Box 1453, Great Bend, Kansas 67530-1453. Mailed entries must be received by morning mail pickup on Tuesday, May 3, 2011. More than one entry may be mailed in one envelope.

(8) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "Truck and Bucks Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(9) The drawing will be conducted at approximately 4:00 p.m. on Friday, May 6, 2011.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time in the drawing.

(c) Only valid non-winning "Truck and Bucks" tickets which are mailed to the "Truck and Bucks Drawing," at the above-stated address with proper postage and received by the morning mail pickup in Topeka, Kansas, on Tuesday, May 3, 2011, and non-winning "Truck and Bucks" tickets entered into any other receptacle designated by the lottery or at the 3i Show as provided in the rules herein shall be eligible for the drawing. All tickets so mailed or deposited shall be secured by the lottery until the drawing is conducted.

(d) Eligible entrants in the "Truck and Bucks Drawing" must be 18 years of age or older.

(e) Completing the information form on the non-winning ticket and entering the ticket into the drawing constitutes authorization to publicly identify the person whose entry is drawn. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-27-11, Jan. 16, 2011.)

111-4-3059. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of the winners in the "Truck and Bucks Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Truck and Bucks Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office in Great Bend, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Great Bend post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, May 3, 2011. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, May 3, 2011, the envelopes con-

taining mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. All mailed entries shall then be placed in a secure receptacle, transported to the 3i Show, and placed in the drawing receptacle or drum with all entries deposited at the 3i Show and into any other receptacle designated by the lottery.

(b) The drawing shall be held at the 3i Show in Garden City, Kansas, or other location as determined by the executive director, and shall be open to the public with lottery security personnel present. The drawing shall be audio and video taped.

(c) At the drawing on Friday, May 6, 2011, lottery security personnel will be present with the person designated by the executive director to perform the drawing. Prior to the drawing, if a drum is used, the drum shall be sealed and the contents mixed by rotating the drum at least 10 times. If a receptacle other than a drum is used, the contents shall be thoroughly mixed with a shovel or by other means.

(d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove two entries, one at a time, from the receptacle or drum. The person whose name appears on the first entry drawn shall be the winner of the grand prize identified in K.A.R. 111-4-3057, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After one entry has been drawn on May 6, 2011, and the entry has been verified as valid, five more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time, which entries drawn will serve as alternate entries for the grand prize. If the ticket is a winning ticket, it is not eligible for the "Riverfest Riches Drawing" and shall be redeemed in accordance with the instant game rules, except that any ticket winning a free admission button for the 2011 Wichita River Festival may instead be used to enter the drawing, and if so utilized, shall be considered a "non-winning ticket" for purposes of entry into the drawing.

(3) If the ticket is a valid non-winning ticket, the ticket is eligible for the drawing and the holder of the ticket may use it to enter the "Riverfest Riches Drawing."

(4) The holder of the non-winning ticket must complete the information form on the back of the ticket in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on a non-winning ticket entered.

(5) A receptacle or drum shall be available and entries may be made at the Kansas lottery selling location at the Wichita River Festival until approximately 6:00 p.m. on June 11, 2011.

(8) The holder of the ticket is not required to personally attend the "Riverfest Riches Drawing" or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

(9) The drawing will be conducted soon after 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, June 11, 2011.

(b) There is no limit on the number of entries a person may make, but a person may only win one time in the drawing.

111-4-3065. Selection of winners. The following process shall be used for the selection of the winners in the "Riverfest Riches Drawing:"

(a) Kansas lottery personnel shall pick up all mail containing "Riverfest Riches Drawing" tickets at the United States Post Office in Topeka, Kansas, with the final pick up at the Topeka post office in the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, June 7, 2011. Following the morning mail pickup on Tuesday, June 7, 2011, the envelopes containing mailed entries will be transported to lottery headquarters and opened by lottery personnel. (d) The designated individual shall then unseal the drum, if a drum is used, and using the bare-arm technique, while looking away, remove one entry from the receptacle or drum. The persons whose names appear on

the entry drawn shall be the winner of the grand prize identified in K.A.R. 111-4-3063, subject to validation by the lottery as set forth in these rules.

(e) After the entry has been drawn on June 11, 2011, and the entry has been verified as valid, six more valid entries will be drawn, one at a time, which entries drawn will serve as alternate entries for the grand prize. The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, 4A, 5A, and 6A. (h) Only non-winning "Riverfest Riches" instant tickets are eligible for the drawing.

(i) All "Riverfest Riches" tickets remaining in the drum or receptacle on June 11, 2011, after the winners and alternates have been selected, and all entries not received in compliance with these rules, shall be destroyed pursuant to K.A.R. 111-3-34. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-27-11, Jan. 16, 2011.)

111-4-3066. Certification of drawing. (a) The "Riverfest Riches Drawing" shall be personally observed by a member of the Kansas lottery security department and a member of the Kansas lottery marketing department or other person or persons designated by the executive director of the lottery.

(b) Upon completion of the drawing, the security official and the event manager shall issue a report to the executive director, certifying that the name of each prize winner is correct, and that to the best of their knowledge the procedures required by these rules were followed in selecting the prize winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-27-11, Jan. 16, 2011.)

The Kansas lottery shall conduct a drawing entitled "Kansas 150," and will accept entries on and after the day Kansas lottery "Kansas 150" instant tickets are first offered for sale to the general public and ending on August 9, 2011. The drawing will be held on or about August 12, 2011. Rules applicable to this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-4-3067 through 111-4-3071 and K.A.R. 111-3-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-27-11, Jan. 16, 2011.)

111-4-3068. Definitions. (a) All definitions contained in the Kansas lottery act (K.S.A. 74-8701 *et seq.*) and lottery regulations are hereby incorporated by reference and govern unless otherwise indicated.

(b) "Kansas 150 Drawing" means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Kansas Lottery on the dates described in K.A.R. 111-4-3067, in which participants are selected to win prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-4-3069.

(c) "Non-winning ticket" means any valid Kansas "Kansas 150" instant game lottery ticket not eligible to win a prize under the rules of that instant game.

(d) "Receptacle" or "drum" means a container in which non-winning Kansas instant game lottery tickets are placed and from which the entries for this drawing are drawn. Receptacles or drums may be sealable and shall be capable of being mixed or rotated for the purpose of ensuring random distribution. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-27-11, Jan. 16, 2011.)

(f) The fifth winner drawn in the "Kansas 150 Drawing" shall receive his or her choice of the remaining six original Kansas 150 paintings identified hereinabove, having an approximate value of \$3,143, and mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

(g) The sixth winner drawn in the "Kansas 150 Drawing" shall receive his or her choice of the remaining five original Kansas 150 paintings identified hereinabove, having an approximate value of \$3,143, and mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

(h) The seventh winner drawn in the "Kansas 150 Drawing" shall receive his or her choice of the remaining four original Kansas 150 paintings identified hereinabove, having an approximate value of \$3,143, and mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

(i) The eighth winner drawn in the "Kansas 150 Drawing" shall receive his or her choice of the remaining three original Kansas 150 paintings identified hereinabove, having an approximate value of \$3,143, and mandatory federal and state income withholding taxes.

The alternate entries will be marked in order drawn, 1A, 2A, 3A, and 4A. Each winner shall have until 5:00 p.m. on the thirtieth day following the drawing to present the fully-executed claim form to lottery headquarters. 111-4-3072. "\$100,000 Crossword" instant ticket lottery game number 364. (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "\$100,000 Crossword" commencing on or after February 1, 2011. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-3072.

(b) The "play symbols" for this game are as follows: A - B - C - D - E - F - G - H - I - J - K - L - M - N - O - P - Q - R - S - T - U - V - W - X - Y - Z - and symbol of a money bag. There are no "play symbol captions" in this game puzzle.

(c) For this game, a play symbol shall appear in each of 20 play spots within the "YOUR LETTERS" play area, in each of five play spots within the "BONUS WORD" play area, and a variable number of times within the crossword puzzle grid.

(d) The ticket numbers in each book of tickets in this game shall start with 000 and end with 029.

(e) The three letters comprising the retailer validation codes used in this game shall appear in three of eight varying locations among the play symbols. The retailer validation codes for this game and their meanings are as follows:

(g) The "\$100,000 Crossword" game consists of two separate crossword puzzles, with four separate play areas. The play areas include "YOUR LETTERS," "DOUBLER PUZZLE" (Puzzle 1), "MEGA PUZZLE" (Puzzle 2), and a "BONUS WORD." The player will scratch the "YOUR LETTERS" play area to reveal 20 "YOUR LETTERS." The player will then match each "YOUR LETTER" with the corresponding letters in each crossword puzzle and the "BONUS WORD" by removing the translucent scratch-off material covering the matching letter. A player wins according to the prize legend associated with each crossword puzzle. Each puzzle plays separately.

(b) "Watch to Win" drawing promotion means the act of drawing prizes conducted by the Multi-State Lottery Association on the dates described in K.A.R. 111-5-195, in which participants are selected to win prizes as described in K.A.R. 111-5-197.

(c) "Secret word" means the secret word revealed during the Powerball drawing shows conducted during this promotion. The "secret word" is the word used by the player to enter the online drawing.

(d) "Online drawing" refers to the drawing which selects the promotion winners for each drawing.

(e) "RNG" refers to the random number generator drawing machine used to select the drawing winners.

(f) "kslottery.com" refers to the Kansas lottery's website where a player can click the link to Powerball.com.

(e) Prizes listed are for all participating MUSL states. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2009 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-1-27-11, Jan. 16, 2011.)

111-5-198. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Watch to Win" drawing promotions shall be accomplished as follows:

(b) No purchase is necessary to win a promotional prize.

(c) Entries are for the next promotional prize drawing only.

(d) Entrants may only submit entries on the Powerball.com website or a website linked directly to Powerball.com.

(e) Any entries mailed or hand delivered to the lotteries or MUSL offices will not qualify for any promotional prize and will be discarded.

(f) Entries are limited to one entry per adult, per household, as indicated by address, for each individual promotional prize drawing.

(g) An adult in a household may win up to one prize in each drawing.

(h) Duplicate or fraudulent entries for a single draw will void all entries for that entrant.

111-5-199. Selection of winners. (a) Following the close entries, and prior to the next Powerball drawing show, the MUSL staff will use a random number generator to select winners for the prizes for that promotional prize drawing. (b) The drawing will be held under the supervision of the MUSL drawing manager and an independent auditor. All drawings will be video recorded. All MUSL drawings are public events.
