## Executive Order 11-46

WHEREAS, there is a need to establish and increase efficiency and uniformity and to achieve cost savings in the use of information technology within the Executive Branch of state government; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to K.S.A. 75-7205, the Executive Chief Information Technology Officer (the "Executive CITO") within the Department of Administration and reporting to the Office of the Governor is best positioned to further these goals; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to K.S.A. 75-7205, the Executive CITO is charged to maintain a presence within and to advise and consult with each Executive Branch agency on all matters relating to information technology;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby direct and order that all non-Regents Executive Branch agency information technology directors and all staff performing information technology functions in all Executive Branch

state agencies, departments, or other entities under my jurisdiction shall report directly to the Executive CITO.

Furthermore, the Executive CITO is directed and charged, in addition to the duties set forth in K.S.A. 75-7205, to manage and order Executive Branch information technology systems in a uniform, efficient, service-oriented, and cost-effective manner. The Executive CITO is directed and charged to deliver information technology services, both within the Executive Branch and to all Kansans who interact with the Executive Branch through information technology systems, in such a way so as to further the priorities of service, effectiveness, prevention of fraud and abuse, and adaptation to developing technologies.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 11-46 and shall become effective immediately.

**Notice of Available Grant Funding**

Grant funds are available from the federal S.T.O.P. Violence Against Women Grant Program for calendar year 2012. The purpose of this grant program is to fund units of state or local government; Native American tribes; and nonprofit, community and faith-based organizations in developing strategies and enhancing victim services in cases involving violent crimes against women.

There is approximately \$1.5 million available for grant awards. The allocation of grant funds will be made to each of the following areas: at least 25 percent for law enforcement; at least 25 percent for prosecution; at least 5 percent for courts; at least 30 percent for nonprofit, community and faith-based victim service organizations (with 10 percent to be distributed to culturally specific community-based organizations); and 15 percent for discretionary grant projects. Federal S.T.O.P. Violence Against Women Grant funds cannot be used to supplant federal, state or local funds that would otherwise be available for targeting violent crimes against women.

Grant funds are available from the Federal Sexual Assault Services Grant Program (SASP) for calendar year 2012. The overall purpose of SASP is to provide intervention, advocacy, accompaniment (e.g., accompanying victims to court, medical facilities, police departments, etc.), support services and related assistance for adult, youth and child victims of sexual assault, family and household members of victims, and those collaterally affected by sexual assault.

This grant program recognizes the need to increase focus on sexual assault to help address the lack of available direct intervention and related assistance services and the unique aspects of sexual assault trauma. Women and men of all ages, as well as children, can be victims of sexual assault.

There is approximately \$160,000 available for grant awards. Priority will be given to applicants who are rape/sexual assault crisis centers providing direct intervention and related assistance to victims/survivors, and to dual programs that provide sexual assault and domestic violence services to enhance the provision of sexual assault-related direct intervention and related assistance services.

#### Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 1:30 p.m. Monday, January 23, in the third floor conference room, Kansas Insurance Department, 420 S.W. 9th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed rule and regulation.

The 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing.

A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows:

**K.A.R. 40-4-42c.** Standard external review procedures. This proposed amendment clarifies to whom notice must be given about providing additional information for an external review organization to consider when reviewing denials of coverage for experimental or medically unnecessary procedures. The proposed amendment would also specify that external review organizations must forward a copy of any additional information provided to the insurer or its designee.

Any external review organization not already complying with the proposed amendment would have minimal economic impact resulting from forwarding the specified information.

There will be little or no economic impact on the Kansas Insurance Department, consumers, small businesses or other governmental agencies.

#### Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a revision to a previously issued air quality construction permit. Columbian Chemicals Company applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to construct an additional product dryer on Reactor #2 at its carbon black plant near Ulysses. Emissions of particulate matter (PM), volatile organic compounds (VOC), oxides of nitrogen (NOx), sulfur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>), hydrogen sulfide (H<sub>2</sub>S), total reduced sulfur (TRS) and carbon monoxide (CO) were evaluated during the permit review process. KDHE issued the construction permit for the product dryer December 19, 1995.

The revised permit is to be issued in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-350, prevention of significant deterioration (PSD), which adopt the federal standards, procedures and requirements of 40 CFR 52.21 by reference. These air quality regulations apply to major stationary emission sources located in areas designated as "attainment" under the federal Clean Air Act (CAA). Attainment areas are areas where the air quality meets or exceeds the national ambient air quality standards (NAAQS).

The revisions proposed by Columbian Chemicals Company (CCC) include raising the production limits on Reactor #2 and adding a combined production limit to Reactors #2 and #3, without affected PSD applicability, or violating any state or federal regulations.

The PSD regulations require evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the BACT for each pollutant for which the emission rate exceeds the PSD significant level. The purpose of BACT is to affect the maximum degree of reduction achievable, taking into account energy, and environmental and economic impacts for each pollutant under review. In 1995, evaluation of the estimated emissions for this project indicated that only the emission rate of CO exceeded the significance levels. At that time, CCC conducted the required BACT analyses. Currently, CO no longer exceeds the significance level because a tail gas flare and boiler were constructed in 2005. However, the tail gas flare and boiler increased NOx and SO<sub>2</sub> emissions above the significance levels. Therefore, a BACT analysis is required for each of these pollutants. The BACT analyses were conducted by CCC in another permitting action (which is being put on public notice at the same time). KDHE concurred with the BACT analyses.

A public comment period has been established until December 19 to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns they may have about this proposed permitting action. All comments should be submitted in writing to James D. Stewart, KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366, or may be presented at the public hearing.

Any member of the public may request a public hearing be conducted to receive comments on the proposed

issuance of the draft air quality construction permit. Written requests to hold a public hearing should be sent to the attention of Sharon Burrell at the address listed above or by fax to (785) 291-3953 and must be received by 5 p.m. December 19.

Columbian Chemicals Company applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to seek approval of a tail gas flare and tail gas boiler at its carbon black plant near Ulysses. Emission of particulate matter equal to or less than 10 microns in diameter (PM<sub>10</sub>), volatile organic compounds (VOC), oxides of nitrogen (NO<sub>x</sub>), sulfur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>), carbon monoxide (CO), hydrogen sulfide (H<sub>2</sub>S), carbon disulfide (CS<sub>2</sub>) and carbonyl sulfide (COS) were evaluated during the permit review process.

The tail gas flare received a pollution control permit (PCP) March 11, 2004. The tail gas boiler received a construction approval (CA) June 24, 2004. Both units were constructed in 2005. Since the PCP provisions of prevention of significant deterioration (PSD) were vacated June 24, 2005, and additional items in the CA needed to be addressed, this permit was drafted to replace the PCP permit and the CA.

The permit is to be issued in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-350, prevention of significant deterioration (PSD), which adopt the federal standards, procedures, and requirements of 40 CFR 52.21 by reference. These air quality regulations apply to major stationary emission sources located in areas designated as "attainment" under the federal Clean Air Act (CAA). Attainment areas are areas where the air quality meets or exceeds the national ambient air quality standards (NAAQS).

The PSD regulations require evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the BACT for each pollutant for which the emission rate exceeds the PSD significant level. The purpose of BACT is to affect the maximum degree of reduction achievable, taking into account energy, environmental and economic impacts for each pollutant under review. Evaluation of the estimated emissions for the proposed tail gas flare and boiler project indicates that the emission rate of oxides of nitrogen and sulfur dioxide exceeds the significance levels. Columbian Chemicals Company (CCC) conducted the required BACT analyses. The department has reviewed CCC's BACT analyses and concurs with its findings that:

- the SO<sub>2</sub> BACT is limiting the carbon black feedstock oil to no more than 4.0% sulfur by weight (12 month rolling average);
- the tail gas flare NO<sub>x</sub> BACT is good combustion engineering; and
- the tail gas boiler NO<sub>x</sub> BACT is a modern properly designed burner system, primary fuel is tail gas, good combustion practices/combustion optimization; and minimize combustion temperature to reduce formation of thermal NO<sub>x</sub>.

A public comment period has been established until December 19 to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns they may have about this proposed permitting action. Comments should be submitted in writing to James D. Stewart, KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366, or may be presented at the public hearing.

Any member of the public may request a public hearing be conducted to receive comments on the proposed issuance of the draft air quality construction permit. Written requests to hold a public hearing should be sent to the attention of Sharon Burrell at the address listed above or by fax to (785) 291-3953 and must be received by 5 p.m. December 19.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for public review for a period of 30 days from the date of publication during normal business hours, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., at the KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka; and a copy of the proposed permit can be reviewed at the KDHE Southwest District Office, 302 W. McArtor Road, Dodge City. To obtain or review the proposed permit and supporting documentation, contact James D. **Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, January 17, in Room 106 of the Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of K.A.R. 132-2-1 and 132-4-1, rules and regulations of the 911 Coordinating Council, on a permanent basis.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the adoption of K.A.R. 132-2-1 and 132-4-1. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Governor's Grants Program, Room 304 North, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612, or to Jennifer.Cook@ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of K.A.R. 132-2-1 and 132-4-1 during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request K.A.R. 132-2-1 and 132-4-1 and the economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Mary Greb-Hall at (785) 296-2701 or 1-800-766-3777 (TTY). The northwest entrance to the Landon State Office Building is accessible. Handicapped parking is located near the northwest entrance.

Summaries of K.A.R. 132-2-1 and 132-4-1 and the respective economic impacts follow:

**K.A.R. 132-2-1** establishes prerequisites for the selection of the local collection point administrator (LCPA) and establishes criteria for extending the LCPA contract as authorized pursuant to the Kansas 911 Act (Act) (L. 2011, ch. 84, secs. 1-19 and 25 and amendments thereto).

In order to be selected, a LCPA candidate shall at a minimum (1) have the ability to comply with all contract requirements established by the secretary of administration; (2) have at least three years of experience in public sector financial administration and accounting; (3) secure and manage accounts and services at a federally insured financial institution with a physical presence in Kansas; and (4) have the ability to provide appropriate staffing to the council to meet the council's obligations under the Act.

The LCPA is selected by the council with the advice and consent of the Legislative Coordinating Council through a competitive procurement process. The initial LCPA contract will be two years, but a third year may be added by the council if (1) the council determines the LCPA has successfully fulfilled its contractual and legal responsibilities for at least 12 months; (2) the annual audit of the 911 fee receipts and disbursements by the LCPA demonstrates appropriate recordkeeping and administration of monies; and (3) the contract extension can control cost increases for services or reduce risks of disruption of essential LCPA services.

**K.A.R. 132-4-1** establishes a regulation that authorizes the council to assess monetary penalties against providers that fail to comply with the provisions of the Act (L. 2011, ch. 84, secs. 1-19 and 25 and amendments thereto). Under the terms of the regulation, a provider can be deemed to be in delinquent status if it (1) failed to submit the provider's contact information on or before January 1, 2012, in the form and containing the information required by the council to the council or the council's designee; (2) has not previously provided service in Kansas and fails to submit the provider's contact information within three months of first offering services in Kansas, in the form and containing the information required by the council to the council or the council's designee; (3) fails to notify the council or the council's designee within 30 days of any change in the provider's contact information; or (4) fails to submit 911 fees and the return in the form required by the LCPA to the LCPA on or before the 30th of each calendar month following a return for the preceding month.

The penalty of \$500 a day or 10 percent of the 911 fees due from a delinquent provider for the corresponding month, whichever is greater, is to be assessed by written order of the council or the council's designee against any provider that is determined to be in delinquent status. Written notice of the penalty assessment, the violation and the right to a hearing is to be issued by the council.

The regulation requires any monetary penalties to be remitted to the council or the council's designee.

The council or a duly authorized agent of the council is required to administer the processes for determining and assessing penalties and hearing any appeals of the penalties in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act (KAPA).

With the adoption of K.A.R. 132-2-1, the economic impact on the council is minimal as the LCPA contract is funded by an administrative fee not to exceed 1.5 percent of 911 fees collected from service users.

The economic impact on providers is minimal or nonexistent as the LCPA contract is funded with an admin-

istration fee not to exceed 1.5 percent of 911 fees collected from service users. The 911 fees statutorily required to be collected by providers from service users will not be affected by the implementation or the extension of the LCPA contract.

The economic impact on PSAPs is existent in that the LCPA contract is funded with an administration fee not to exceed 1.5 percent of 911 fees collected from service users. Therefore, the money used to fund the LCPA contract is potentially money that PSAPs may have otherwise received. However, LCPA services are necessary to facilitate the distribution of the 911 fees to PSAPs collected from providers.

The economic impact on subscriber rates will be minimal or nonexistent. The LCPA contract is funded with an administration fee not to exceed 1.5 percent of 911 fees collected from service users. Providers are statutorily required to collect the 911 fees from service users. Providers' statutory obligation will not change dependent upon the terms or length of the LCPA contract. Therefore, subscriber rates should not be affected.

With the adoption of K.A.R. 132-4-1, the economic impact on the council is minimal; the penalties collected by the council will be deposited by the LCPA into the 911 State Grant Fund.

The economic impact on any provider that does not accurately and timely remit data and fees as required by the Act could be significant depending on the severity and length of the provider's delinquency. K.A.R. 132-4-1 imposes penalties of \$500 per day or 10 percent of the 911 fees due from the delinquent provider for the corresponding month, whichever is greater. The economic impact on providers that fully comply with the data and fee remittance requirement is minimal or nonexistent.

The economic impact on PSAPs is potentially positive as any penalties collected will be deposited into the 911 State Grant Fund. All PSAPs are eligible to apply for funding from the 911 State Grant Fund.

The economic impact on subscriber rates could potentially be negative. If a provider is consistently determined to be delinquent and therefore is subject to civil penalties, a provider may find it necessary to increase subscriber rates to compensate for losses sustained by assessed civil penalties.

With the adoption of K.A.R. 132-2-1 and 132-4-1, the economic impact on other state agencies is minimal or nonexistent. The council is the only state agency involved with the LCPA contract and the assessment of civil penalties.

Summaries of K.A.R. 1-64-1 and its economic impact follow:

**K.A.R. 1-64-1** established a regulation that authorized the Secretary of Administration to assess monetary penalties against wireless carriers and voice-over Internet protocol (VoIP) providers that fail to comply with the provisions of the Wireless Enhanced 911 Act (K.S.A. 12-5321 et seq.) or the VoIP Enhanced 911 Act (K.S.A. 12-

5351 et seq.). Under the terms of the regulation, the local collection point administrator is to notify the secretary or the secretary's duly authorized agent of any wireless carrier or VoIP provider that (1) has not submitted the carrier's or provider's wireless enhanced 911 local fees or the corresponding return within 14 days of its due date; or (2) has submitted fees and a return that are substantially inconsistent with each other. A penalty of 10 percent of the enhanced 911 local fees due from a delinquent wireless carrier or VoIP provider is to be assessed by written order of the secretary against any carrier or provider that is determined to be in delinquent status. Written notice of the penalty assessment, the violation and the right to a hearing is to be issued by the secretary. Interest at an annual rate of 10 percent accrues if a wireless carrier or VoIP provider remains in delinquent status for 30 days or more after the date on which the fees and return were due.

The regulation requires any monetary penalties to be remitted to the secretary or the secretary's duly appointed agent. K.S.A. 12-5325 and 12-5354 direct any civil penalty recovered to be deposited with the local collection point administrator and subsequently routed back to the corresponding PSAP.

The secretary or a duly authorized agent of the secretary is required to administer the processes for determining and assessing penalties, hearing any appeals of the penalties in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act (KAPA), and forwarding the recovered penalties to the local collection point administrator.

With the revocation of K.A.R. 1-64-1, the economic impact on the Department of Administration associated with the administration of the penalty process will be eliminated.

With the revocation of K.A.R. 1-64-1, the economic impact on any wireless carrier or VoIP provider that does not accurately and timely remit data and fees as required by the Wireless Enhanced 911 Act and the VoIP Enhanced 911 Act will be eliminated.

Revocation of K.A.R. 1-64-1 is not anticipated to have an economic impact on PSAPs as penalties were not issued under the regulation. Therefore, PSAPs did not receive additional revenue as a result of assessed penalties authorized by the implementation of K.A.R. 1-64-1.

It is assumed that because penalties were not actually assessed to wireless carriers and VoIP providers, there was not an identifiable impact on subscriber rates or fees. Therefore, the revocation should not trigger a change in subscriber rates or fees.

Article 9.—MEDICAL AND HOSPITAL

**51-9-7. **111-4-3134. "Power 7s" instant ticket lottery game number 414.** (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct an instant winner lottery game entitled "Power 7s" commencing on or after October 1, 2011. The rules for this game are contained in K.A.R. 111-3-1 *et seq.* and 111-4-3134.

(b) The "play and prize symbols" and "captions" for this game are as follows:

(c) For this game, a play symbol shall appear in each of 10 play spots within the play area or areas.

(d) The ticket numbers in each book of tickets in this game shall start with 000 and end with 299.

(e) The three letters comprising the retailer validation codes used in this game shall appear in three of eight varying locations among the play symbols. The retailer validation codes for this game and their meanings are as follows:

(f) The price of instant tickets sold by a retailer for this game shall be \$1.00 each.

(g) "Power 7s" is a tic-tac-toe game. The player will remove the scratch-off material to reveal nine play symbols and one prize symbol. A player can win in one of two ways. If a player reveals three "X" symbols or three "O" symbols in any one row, column, or diagonal, the player wins the prize amount show in the prize box. If a player finds three "7" symbols in any one row, column, or diagonal, the player wins double the prize shown.

(h) Each ticket in this game may win up to one time.

(i) Approximately 900,000 tickets shall be ordered initially for this instant game. Additional ticket orders shall have the same prize structure, the same number of prizes per prize pool of 300,000 tickets, and the same odds as were contained in the initial ticket order.

(k) The odds of winning a prize in this game are approximately one in 4.07. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8720; effective, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011.)

**Article 15.—RAFFLE GAMES**

**111-15-1. Name of the game; rules and regulations.** The Kansas lottery shall conduct a lotto game entitled "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" beginning on or about October 1, 2011, for a drawing to be conducted on or about December 30, 2011.

The rules and regulations for the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-15-1 through 111-15-10, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-12-7-10, Sept. 8, 2010; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011.)

**111-15-2. Definitions.** The following definitions shall apply to the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game:

(a) "Available ticket(s)" or "ticket(s) available for sale" means one or any number of tickets from one through 150,000 that is available to sell during the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game.

(b) "Check-A-Ticket Machine" means an electronic machine operated by the Kansas lottery for the purpose of determining whether or not an online ticket is a winning ticket.

(c) "Computer pick" or "quick pick" means the selection of a six-digit number by the computer system, which appears on a ticket and is played by a player in the game. This is the only type of ticket sold by a retailer for the game.

(d) "Drawing" means the formal process of selecting winning numbers which determine the number of winners for each prize level of the game.

(e) "Early Bird Drawings" means a series of drawings for prizes to be held on October 9, 16, 23, 30, 2011, and November 6, 2011, before final raffle drawings on December 30, 2011.

(f) "Electronic drawing machine" or "random number generator" means the electronic device approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery to electronically select the winning numbers for this drawing.

(g) "Game ticket" or "ticket" means a computer generated ticket issued by a terminal to a person as a receipt for the ticket a person has purchased.

(h) "Online lottery game" means a lottery game connected by telephone lines, satellite, radio, or other similar communication methodology, owned or controlled by the lottery, to a central computer in which each player selects numbers out of a larger predetermined set or sets of numbers.

(i) "Order drawn" means the sequential order in which a "WINNING" ticket or tickets are selected during the drawing process.

(j) "Pari-mutuel prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, shall be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game.

(k) "Retailer" or "agent" means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(l) "Serial number" means the identifying number printed on the top line of the ticket.

(m) "Set Prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, and which will be equal to the prize amount established by these rules for the prize level.

(n) "Terminal" means a device authorized by a party lottery to function in an on-line, interactive mode with the lottery's computer system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets and transmitting reports.

(o) "Ticket Number" means the six-digit number that was selected by the computer, which appears on the face of the ticket and is identified on the ticket as such.

(p) "Validation" or "validate" means the process of determining whether a ticket presented for a prize is a winning ticket.

(q) "Winning number" or "winning numbers" means a six-digit number which is selected by an electronic drawing machine to be a winner of a prize in this drawing.

(r) "Winning ticket" or "winning tickets" means a raffle ticket which was available for sale for this game where the ticket number matches a winning number drawn for the raffle, in exact order, reading from left to right. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011.)

**111-15-3. Game description; retail sale of tickets.**

(a) "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" is a raffle drawing which offers a total of 150,000 online tickets available for sale. Each ticket shall bear a "TICKET NUMBER" on the face of the ticket. The Kansas lottery will conduct "Holiday Millionaire Raffle Early Bird Drawings" according to the following schedule, unless otherwise determined by the executive director:

For each early bird drawing, one ticket number will be drawn to determine the winner of one \$10,000 prize. A ticket must be purchased before 8:59 p.m. the day of the

drawing to be eligible for that drawing. In the event a ticket wins the prize in an early bird drawing, the ticket will remain eligible for any remaining drawings, including the final drawing held on December 30, 2011. Then, on a date specified in these rules, an electronic drawing machine, which has been approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery, shall randomly select a total of 1,016 "WINNING NUMBERS." Each "WINNING NUMBER" consists of a six-digit number as it appears in exact order reading from left to right. A player wins by exactly matching his or her "TICKET NUMBER" to a "WINNING NUMBER" that was selected in the drawing. The first "WINNING NUMBER" selected during the drawing process shall be the grand prize winner. The second, third, fourth, fifth, and sixth "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process shall be the second prize winners. The next 10 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of the seventh (7th) "WINNING NUMBER" through the sixteenth (16th) "WINNING NUMBER," shall be the third prize winners. The next 500 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of the seventeenth (17th) "WINNING NUMBER" through the five hundred sixteenth (516th) "WINNING NUMBER," shall be the fourth prize winners. The next 500 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of the five hundred seventeenth (517th) "WINNING NUMBER" through the one thousand sixteenth (1,016) "WINNING NUMBERS" shall be the fifth prize winners. If 145,000 of the 150,000 tickets that are available for sale are sold, all prizes shall be paid as a cash lump sum payment. If less than 145,000 tickets available for sale are sold, all prizes shall be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game. To play the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle," a player shall purchase a "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" ticket which bears a ticket number on the face of the ticket.

(b) A "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" ticket shall sell for \$20 (twenty) dollars.

(c) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(d) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer.

(e) All tickets sold by a retailer shall be a "computer pick" or "quick pick" ticket.

(f) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall be the submission of the original winning ticket to and receipt of said ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent.

(g) The only guaranteed methods of win checking a ticket to determine whether the ticket bears a winning number shall be through the Kansas lottery check-a-ticket machines, or submission of a ticket to the Kansas lottery or an authorized retail agent.

(h) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that are printed in error. Exchange tickets may be printed by

the lottery for early bird drawing winners at the discretion of the executive director.

(i) There shall be a total of 150,000 available tickets for sale.

(j) Ticket sales will begin at the start of the business day central time on or about October 1, 2011.

(k) Ticket sales will end on or about the close of business day central time on December 29, 2011, or whenever all 150,000 tickets that are available for sale are sold, whichever comes first.

(l) The game will close on or about 4:30 a.m. on December 30, 2011.

(m) The drawing shall be conducted on or about December 30, 2011, before noon central time, at a secure location as determined by the executive director, after the game is closed and the external auditor has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(n) Each player shall have the sole responsibility for verifying the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the ticket. The purchase of a ticket is done at the player's own risk through the online retailer who is deemed to be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

(o) If, for any reason, a player's bet is not accepted, the liability of the Kansas lottery or its agents shall be limited to a refund of the amount of the ticket purchase price.

(p) Winning ticket numbers shall be made available to the public on or about noon, December 30, 2011. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8718; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-12-7-10, Sept. 8, 2010; amended, T-111-12-29-10, Dec. 9, 2010; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011.)

**111-15-5. Expected prize payout.** (a) In the event 145,000 or more of the tickets available for sale in this raffle game are sold, all prizes awarded shall be paid as set cash prizes, with the following expected approximate prize payout percentages:

(b) In the event less than 145,000 tickets available for sale in this raffle game are sold, all prizes awarded as described in subsection (a) above shall be paid as pari-mutuel prizes, as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game. In that instance, the money available from the funding sources for this game shall be divided among the winning tickets/plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. Any pari-mutuel prizes awarded shall be calculated rounding down to the nearest dollar. Monies left over after prizes have been rounded down shall be applied to the general prize reserve pool for subsequent lottery games. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710;

effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011.)

**111-15-11. Liability and limitations.** (a) Any liability incurred by the Kansas lottery as a result of any malfunction or error shall be limited to the purchase price of any eligible entering ticket.

(b) Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the Kansas lottery is not responsible for incomplete, illegible, misdirected, late, lost, damaged or stolen entries; or for lost, interrupted, inaccessible or unavailable networks, satellites, Internet Service Providers (ISP), website or other connections; or for miscommunications; failed, jumbled, scrambled, delayed, or misdirected computer, telephone or cable transmission; or for any technical malfunctions, failures, or difficulties; printing errors; clerical, typographical or other error in the offering or announcement of any prize or in any prize notification documents, or other errors of any kind or nature; or for the incorrect or inaccurate capture of information or the failure to capture information.

(c) The Kansas lottery shall have the option to substitute any prize(s) with a prize of approximate equal value at its sole discretion.

(d) The Kansas lottery may discontinue this event at any time. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8720; effective, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011.)

**Article 17.—SPECIFIC ONLINE DRAWING RULES**

**111-17-2. Tech the Halls second-chance online event drawings.** (a) The Kansas lottery shall conduct a series of three second-chance online event drawings entitled "Tech the Halls Second-Chance Online Event Drawings." The Kansas lottery will accept online entries into the drawings no earlier than October 1, 2011, and no later than January 17, 2012. The drawings will be conducted at approximately 12:00 p.m. on January 20, 2012. Specific tickets eligible for entry into this second-chance online drawing shall be announced on the Kansas lottery's website at www.kslottery.com as part of the "Tech the Halls Second-Chance Online Event Drawings."

(b) The Kansas lottery will award 40 Wii bundles as prizes to players who entered the online event drawings

using the following \$1 Kansas lottery instant tickets: Holiday Treats, Happy Holidays, 'Twas the Knot Before Christmas, and Nutcracker Sweet. The Kansas Lottery will award 40 Blackberry playbook tablets as prizes to players who entered the online event drawings using the following \$2 Kansas lottery instant tickets: Peng-win Bingo, Jolly Elf Crossword, and Kitty Claus/Holiday Hounds. The Kansas lottery will award 40 LCD or LED HD televisions as prizes to players who entered the online event drawings using the \$5 Kansas lottery instant ticket named Holiday Countdown.

(c) There will be three drawings held to select winners of prizes. Each drawing shall select 65 winners. The first 40 winners drawn in each drawing will be awarded prizes. The next 25 winners drawn in each drawing will be used as alternate winners, if necessary, in the order drawn. The winners of the first drawing conducted will be selected from among the \$1 instant Kansas lottery tickets specified in subsection (b) above to receive prizes of Wii bundles. The winners of the second drawing conducted will be selected from among the \$2 instant Kansas lottery tickets specified in subsection (b) above to receive prizes of Blackberry playbook tablets. The winners of the third drawing conducted will be selected from among the \$5 instant Kansas lottery tickets specified in subsection (b) above to receive prizes of LCD or LED HD televisions.

(d) A winner of a prize will be notified via email that he or she has won a prize. The winner will be instructed how to verify his or her personal identification.

(e) A winner will be sent a claim form via email at the time the winner is notified he or she has won a prize.

(f) A player must return his or her completed claim form, and original non-winning ticket entered into the online event drawings within 30 days following the date of the online event drawing.

(g) Completed claim forms and winning ticket(s) can be mailed by the winner via U.S. Mail to: Kansas lottery, 128 North Kansas Avenue, Topeka, Kansas 66603, or the winner can deliver the completed claim form and winning ticket to the Kansas lottery claims center in Topeka, Kansas.

(h) If a player fails to answer any email, respond to any request for information, or fill out any forms required by the Kansas lottery within the time allotted in the winner's notification of winning a prize, said win shall be forfeited and the prize awarded to another alternate winner.

(i) Rules applicable to this online event drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-17-2 and K.A.R. 111-16-1, *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011.)

#### **Article 301.—SPECIFIC LOTTERY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES**

**111-301-5. Wagers.** (a) Prior to the first card being dealt for each round of play, each player at the game of blackjack shall make a wager against the dealer which shall win if:

(1) The score of the player is 21 or less and the score of the dealer is in excess of 21;

(2) The score of the player exceeds that of the dealer without either score exceeding 21; or

(3) The player has achieved a score of 21 in two cards and the dealer has achieved a score of 21 in more than two cards.

(b) Except as otherwise provided in these rules a wager made in accordance with this section shall be void when the score of the player is the same as the dealer; provided, however, that a player's wager shall be lost when the dealer has a blackjack and the player has a score of 21 which is not a blackjack.

(c) Except as otherwise provided in these rules, no wager shall be made, increased or withdrawn after the first card of the respective round has been dealt.

(d) All wagers at blackjack shall be made by placing gaming chips on the appropriate areas of the blackjack layout.

(e) After each round of play is complete, the dealer shall collect all losing wagers and pay off all winning wagers, except that if the cards in a player's hand exceed a total of 21 points ("busts"), the wager for that hand shall be lost and the wager shall be immediately collected by the dealer. All winning wagers made in accordance with these rules shall be paid at odds of one to one with the exception of a blackjack which shall be paid at odds of three to two.

(f) Once the first card of any hand has been removed from the shoe by the dealer, no player shall handle, remove or alter any wagers that have been made until a decision has been rendered and implemented with respect to that wager except as permitted by these rules.

(g) Once a wager on the insurance line, a wager to double down, or a wager to split pairs has been made and confirmed by the dealer, no player shall handle, remove or alter such wagers until a decision has been rendered and implemented with respect to that wager except as permitted by these regulations.

(h) A double down wager shall win if the total of the player's cards exceeds the total of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total of twenty-one (21). A double down wager shall push or tie if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are equal. A double down wager shall lose if the total of the player's cards exceeds twenty-one (21) or is less than the total of the dealer's cards. A double down wager shall be paid at the rate of one to one on both the original wager and the double down portion of the wager. A player may not double down after splitting pairs.

(i) A split bet shall win if the total of the player's cards exceeds the total of the dealer's cards without exceeding a total of twenty-one (21). A split bet shall lose if the total of the player's cards exceeds twenty-one (21) or is less than the total of the dealer's cards. A split bet shall tie or push if the player's hand and the dealer's hand are equal. A split bet shall be paid at the rate of one to one on both the original wager and the split wager. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2010 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-24-09, Dec. 3, 2009; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011.)
