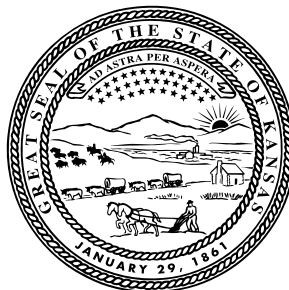

Office of the Governor**Executive Order 12-09****Approving an Operations Plan for the Governor's Drought Response Team**

WHEREAS, the Kansas Emergency Management Act (K.S.A. 48-901 *et seq.*) states that the Governor shall be responsible for meeting the dangers to the state and people presented by disasters, including drought; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas Water Office is charged by statute (K.S.A. 74-2608) with advising the Governor when drought conditions exist within the state and with recommending assembly of the Governor's Drought Response Team; and

WHEREAS, the Kansas Emergency Management Act authorizes the Governor, when advised that drought conditions exist within the state, to declare by proclamation that a state of drought exists; and

WHEREAS, there is no statutory or regulatory guidance regarding the operations of the Governor's Drought Response Team; and

WHEREAS, such guidance is needed to ensure that the State of Kansas responds in a timely and appropriate manner to the impacts of drought upon its people, resources and the environment;

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, I hereby:

1. approve the June 2012 Operations Plan for the Governor's Drought Response Team, and
2. order implementation of this Operations Plan by the various state agency members of the Governor's Drought Response Team as stated in the Operations Plan.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order 12-09 and shall become effective immediately.

WHEREAS, the Director of the Kansas Water Office has informed me, pursuant to K.S.A. 74-2608, of the drought conditions within the state; and

Administrative Regulations

A public hearing will be conducted at 9 a.m. Thursday, September 20, in the Landon State Office Building, Room 900-N, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612-1220, to consider the adoption of amendments to an existing rule and regulation on a permanent basis effective 15 days after publication in the Kansas Register. Telephone conference is not available.

Chapter 187, 2005 Session Laws of Kansas transferred specific powers, duties and regulatory authority from the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services to the Division of Health Policy and Finance (DHPPF) within the Department of Administration, and then transferred those powers, duties and regulatory authority to the Kansas Health Policy Authority (KHPA), effective July 1, 2006. Executive Reorganization Order (ERO) #38 has transferred these powers, duties and regulatory authority to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Health Care Finance. The ERO provides that KDHE will be the single state agency for Medicaid, Medikan and HealthWave in Kansas effective July 1, 2011.

This 30-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the proposed regulation as stated in K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 77-421(a)(3). All interested parties may submit written comments before the hearing to Rita Haverkamp, KDHE, Division of Health Care Finance, Room 900-N, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612-1220, or by email at RHaverkamp@kdheks.gov. At the hearing, the Division of Health Care Finance will give all interested parties a reasonable opportunity to present their views, but it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes. Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. A summary of the regulation and the economic impact follows:

Article 5.—PROVIDER PARTICIPATION, SCOPE OF SERVICES, AND REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE MEDICAID (MEDICAL ASSISTANCE) PROGRAM

129-5-1. Prior authorization. The following changes will be made to regulation 129-5-1 regarding prior authorization of pharmaceutical products:

These therapeutic classes of drugs have been evaluated by the Preferred Drug List Advisory Committee and found to be clinically equivalent to agents within their respective drug classes. To ensure the most clinically appropriate utilization of these drugs in the most cost-effective manner, the following drugs will require prior authorization:

- Adjunct antiepileptic drugs: clobazam, lacosamide, rufinamide
- Angiotensin II receptor antagonists: azilsartan
- Anticholinergic urinary incontinence drugs: darifenacin, topical oxybutynin
- Beta-blockers: nebivolol
- Short-acting, inhaled beta 2 agonists: levalbuterol inhaler, pirbuterol inhaler
- Intranasal corticosteroids: ciclesonide
- Proton pump inhibitors: dexlansoprazole
- Nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory drugs: diclofenac patches, topical diclofenac, intranasal ketorolac
- HMG-CoA reductase inhibitors: pitavastatin
- Nonsedating antihistamines: levocetirizine
- Triptans: almotriptan, Alsuma[™], Sumavel[®]
- Insulin: insulin detemir
- Hypnotics: eszopiclone
- Serotonin 5-HT₃ receptor antagonist antiemetics: ondansetron film
- Combination products for hypertension: telmisartan-amlodipine
- Long-acting, inhaled beta 2 agonists: arformoterol, indacaterol
- Agents for gout: febuxostat

The following drugs will require prior authorization to ensure appropriate utilization because of safety issues, potential for off-label use, abuse potential, cost effectiveness and/or clinical appropriateness:

- Miscellaneous biologic agents: denosumab, rilonacept
- Hereditary angioedema agents: C1 esterase inhibitor, ecallantide, icatibant
- Anti-hepatitis C virus agents: boceprevir, telaprevir
- Cystic Fibrosis agents: ivacaftor
- Agents for gout: pegloticase
- Phenylketonurics: sapropterin
- Topical anesthetics: lidocaine

- Antithrombin agents: eltrombopag
- Anti-malarials: quinine
- Hormone analog for precocious puberty: histrelin acetate
- Agents for chorea associated with Huntington's disease: tetrabenazine
- Enzyme preparations: collagenase clostridium histolyticum
- Agents for cataplexy: sodium oxybate

Federal Mandate: This regulation change is not federally mandated.

Economic Impact: It is expected that these changes will reduce Medicaid expenditures by \$540,340 SGF and \$713,719 FFP, annually.

Bearer of Cost: The cost of reviewing prior authorization will be borne by DHCF. If a Medicaid consumer wishes to have a drug despite a PA denial the cost will be borne by the consumer.

Affected Parties: Medicaid consumers, pharmacists, prescribers and the Medicaid agency.

Other Methods: There were no other appropriate methods for the desired outcome.

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Thursday, October 18, at the office of the State Corporation Commission, 130 S. Market, Room 2078, Wichita, to consider the adoption of proposed permanent regulations for compressed air energy storage (CAES).

This 60-day notice of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to Lane Palmateer, Litigation Counsel, State Corporation Commission, 130 S. Market, Room 2078, Wichita, 67202, or by email to oilandgasregcomments@kcc.ks.gov. In addition, interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views regarding the adoption of the proposed regulations during the public hearing.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements be provided in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least 10 days in advance of the hearing by contacting Lane Palmateer at 316-337-6200.

Copies of the proposed regulations and the economic impact statement may be obtained from the commission's office at the address above or from the commission's website at <http://kcc.ks.gov>. Access through the website will not result in a fee. The provision of a physical copy of the regulations may result in the costs being assessed to the requesting party.

Summaries of the proposed regulations and economic impact statement follow:

K.A.R. 82-3-1200. This regulation defines the terms used in the CAES regulations.

K.A.R. 82-3-1201. This regulation requires a license for the CAES operator, describes the license application process and creates a requirement of financial assurance.

K.A.R. 82-3-1202. This regulation requires that the operator designate a signatory for any permit application, amendment application and facility permit transfer. It also specifies that any report not signed by a licensed professional geologist, licensed professional engineer or licensed professional land surveyor must be signed by a plant or operations manager, a superintendent, a cavern or reservoir storage specialist or a person holding a position with equivalent responsibility.

K.A.R. 82-3-1203. This regulation requires the issuance of a permit for a CAES facility before the commencement of operations and describes the permit application.

K.A.R. 82-3-1204. This regulation describes the notice requirements for a CAES permit application. The regulation describes how protests can be filed and describes the notice requirements for any hearing on the application.

K.A.R. 82-3-1205. This regulation requires an application to amend a CAES permit for certain activities or changes. The regulation also sets out the notice required for the amendment application.

K.A.R. 82-3-1206. This regulation describes the requirements for transferring a CAES permit to a different operator.

K.A.R. 82-3-1207. This regulation sets out the conditions under which the commission may modify, suspend or cancel a CAES permit.

K.A.R. 82-3-1208. This regulation creates requirements regarding the site selection for a CAES facility, including the requirement that the operator submit a site selection plan.

K.A.R. 82-3-1209. This regulation specifies the required design and construction of CAES wells, including the requirement that the operator submit a drilling and completion plan.

K.A.R. 82-3-1210. This regulation creates requirements for the construction and equipment of a CAES facility, including the submission of a storage facility integrity plan.

K.A.R. 82-3-1211. This regulation creates requirements for an operator performing a workover on a CAES well, including the required submission of a workover plan.

K.A.R. 82-3-1212. This regulation creates requirements for the operation, monitoring and measurement requirements for cavern CAES wells.

K.A.R. 82-3-1213. This regulation creates requirements for the operation, monitoring and measurement requirements for reservoir CAES wells.

K.A.R. 82-3-1214. This regulation specifies long-term monitoring, measurement and testing requirements for cavern CAES facilities and wells to ensure mechanical integrity.

K.A.R. 82-3-1215. This regulation specifies long-term monitoring, measurement and testing requirements for reservoir CAES facilities and wells to ensure mechanical integrity.

K.A.R. 82-3-1216. This regulation requires the CAES operator to submit and comply with a safety and emergency response plan.

K.A.R. 82-3-1217. This regulation requires the CAES operator to perform a safety inspection on an annual basis and describes the various aspects of the safety inspection.

K.A.R. 82-3-1218. This regulation describes the conversion of a cavern CAES well to plugging-monitoring status, which is a necessary step before plugging a cavern CAES well. The regulation includes the requirement that the operator submit a plugging-monitoring status plan.

K.A.R. 82-3-1219. This regulation creates requirements for the plugging of any cavern or reservoir CAES well, including the submission of a plugging plan. The regulation also specifies circumstances in which plugging a well may be required.

K.A.R. 82-3-1220. This regulation describes the circumstances under which a reservoir CAES facility or well may be temporarily abandoned.

K.A.R. 82-3-1221. This regulation creates requirements for the decommissioning and abandonment of a CAES facility.

K.A.R. 82-3-1222. This regulation specifies reporting and record retention requirements for CAES operators.

K.A.R. 82-3-1223. This regulation lists the regulatory fees applicable to CAES operators and facilities.

Economic Impact Statement: The direct regulatory cost to industry includes the following fees: 1) the \$1,500 license application fee; 2) the \$1,500 permit application fee; 3) additional \$1,500 fees for the submission of certain plans and the performance of certain activities; 4) an annual fee of \$18,890 for each CAES facility; and 5) an annual fee of \$305 for each CAES well. There will be indirect regulatory costs due to various activities performed to ensure compliance with the CAES regulations, including preparation of the license application, the preparation of a permit application, periodic well testing, ongoing project monitoring and reporting. Indirect costs will be substantial but cannot be accurately estimated until a CAES facility is in operation in Kansas.

The commission will incur costs from allocating employee hours, authorizing travel to CAES facilities, potentially hiring specialized contractors, and allocating office space and supplies. Until a CAES application is filed, however, the agency's costs are expected to be minimal.

Facility Description: The proposed action is to reissue an existing Class V Injection Well Permit. Fluids to be injected consist of treated recovered groundwater, which was originally contaminated by the release of hydrocarbons. The treated groundwater will be injected to remediate the soil and aquifer, maintain hydraulic control of the site and return treated groundwater to the aquifer. Injection is into the Wellington Formation through perforated pipe set at a depth of approximately 13 feet below ground level and extending horizontally for a length of 300 feet. The maximum wellhead injection pressure is 5 psig. The maximum rate of flow for this project is 201,600 gallons per week. All construction, monitoring and operation of these wells will meet the requirements that apply to Class V injection wells under the Kansas UIC regulations, K.A.R. 28-46-1 through 28-46-44, and other requirements of KDHE.
