Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Monday, January 14, in the third floor conference room, 401 S.W. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, to consider the adoption of an amendment to a permanent regulation of the Division of Workers Compensation.

The 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the director of the Division of Workers Compensation, 401 S.W. Topeka Blvd., Suite 2, Topeka, 66603-3105, or by email to jose.castillo@dol.ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit oral presentation to 10 minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Jose Castillo at 785-296-4000, ext. 2159, or jose.castillo@dol.ks.gov. Parking for individuals with disabilities is located on the west side of the building.

The following is a brief summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact:

K.A.R. 51-9-17 mandates use of the International Association of Industrial Accident Boards and Commissions (IAIABC) Claims Release 3 electronic data interchange (EDI) national standard for regulatory reporting of workers compensation claims. The purpose of the revisions is to mandate that all workers compensation injuries and claims shall be reported using the current Release 3 standard, and that the current paper reporting systems and voluntary EDI Release 1 systems will be discontinued. The implementation of this will begin in April 2013 and continue through the end of calendar year 2013.

The division estimates the cost to the agency and its stakeholders to be minimal.

Opinion No. 2012-09

Written November 7, 2012, to Tarren Bragdon, CEO, Foundation for Government Accountability, Naples, Florida.

Synopsis: The Foundation for Government Accountability is a state-level (Florida) conservative policy organization, as opposed to an organization that is national in scope. Additionally, the Foundation's mission does not appear to serve, inform, educate and strengthen state legislatures in all states. The Foundation, thus, does not fall within the exception provided by K.S.A. 46-237(h). As such, Kansas legislators are thus, not able to accept a scholarship from the Foundation to attend the 2012 Medicaid Cure Summit. Kansas legislators who attend the summit conference without a scholarship may accept meals pursuant to K.S.A. 46-237(d).

Dear Mr. Bragdon:

This opinion is in response to your request for an opinion from the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission (Commission), concerning application of the state conflict of interest laws, K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.* We note at the outset

that the Commission's jurisdiction is limited to the applicability of K.S.A. 46-215 *et seq.*, and the Commission's opinion does not address whether some other statutory system, common law theory, or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry.

Factual Statement

Some Kansas legislators have been given the opportunity to accept a scholarship from the Foundation for Government Accountability (Foundation) to cover costs of attending the Foundation's 2012 Medicaid Cure Summit to be held in Florida. The Foundation is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation based in Florida with an interest concerning action by Kansas legislators in relation to Medicaid reform. The goal of the Summit sponsored by the Foundation is to discuss with participants the principles that inform affordable Medicaid reform strategies that improve patient health, workshops that educate participants on how to talk about bold reforms, not limited to Medicaid, and to create opportunities for participants to network with one another.

The three identified goals of the Foundation according to its mission statement are:

- (1) To make Florida the most economically vibrant state through sound public policy centered on the free market, limited government and an individual's right to succeed.
- (2) To engage policymakers, the media and the public with rigorous analysis, captivating outreach and tireless advocacy to advance market-based economic policies that create opportunity and prosperity.
- (3) To hold all levels of Florida government accountable to taxpayers, and to provide the public with peace of mind that an organization exists to ensure their priorities are at the forefront of public policy debates.

Question

The question you pose is whether Kansas legislators may accept a scholarship from the Foundation for Government Accountability to cover costs of attending the Foundation's 2012 Medicaid Cure Summit conference to be held in Florida.

Analysis and Opinion

K.S.A. 46-237(a) provides, in pertinent part:

Except as provided by this section, no state officer or employee, candidate for state office or state officer elect shall accept, or agree to accept any (1) economic opportunity, gift, loan, gratuity, special discount, favor, hospitality or service having an aggregate value of \$40 or more in any calendar year ... from any one person known to have a special interest, under circumstances where such person knows or should know that a major purpose of the donor is to influence such person in the performance of their official duties or prospective official duties.

The definition of "person" includes a non-profit corporation such as the Foundation for Government Accountability.¹ The term "special interest" means "an interest of any person concerning action or non-action by the legislature or any legislative matter affecting such person as distinct from affect upon the people of the state

as a whole."² Based on the Foundation's mission statement and conference agenda, the Foundation has a special interest concerning action by Kansas legislators in relation to Medicaid reform.

However, an exception to K.S.A. 46-237(a) is found in section (h) of that statute:

... but nothing in this act ... shall be construed to prohibit any legislator from accepting reimbursement for actual expenses for travel, subsistence, hospitality, entertainment and other expenses incurred in attending and participating in meetings, programs and activities sponsored by ... any national, nonprofit, nonpartisan organization established for the purpose of serving, informing, educating and strengthening state legislatures in all states of the nation, when paid from funds of such organization and nothing shall be construed to limit or prohibit the expenditure of funds of and by any such organization for such purposes.

As two of the Foundation's goals are specific to the state of Florida, with the third ambiguous concerning whether the policymakers, public and media are nationwide, the Commission is not convinced that the Foundation is a national organization. Likewise, the Commission is not convinced that the Foundation is an organization established for the purpose of serving, informing, educating and strengthening state legislatures in all states.

It appears to the Commission that the Foundation is a state-level (Florida) conservative policy organization, as opposed to an organization that is national in scope. Additionally, the Foundation's mission does not appear to serve, inform, educate and strengthen state legislatures in all states.

For these reasons, the Commission finds that the Foundation does not fall within the exception provided by K.S.A. 46-237(h). Kansas legislators are, thus, not able to accept a scholarship from the Foundation to attend the 2012 Medicaid Cure Summit.

You also ask whether Kansas legislators who attend the Foundation's 2012 Medicaid Cure Summit conference without a scholarship may accept meals pursuant to K.S.A. 46-237(d), which states:

Hospitality in the form of food and beverages is presumed not to be given to influence a state officer or employee, candidate for state office or state officer election in the performance of official duties or prospective official duties, except when a particular course of official action is to be followed as a condition thereon.

Based on information known to the Commission concerning the Foundation's 2012 Medicaid Cure Summit conference, Kansas legislators who attend the summit conference without a scholarship may accept meals pursuant to K.S.A. 46-237(d).
