The Kansas Department of Transportation's Office of Public Transportation is now accepting applications for the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) program U.S.C. 49-5311(f) — Intercity Bus. The purpose of the U.S.C. 49-5311(f) program is to provide funds to support the intercity bus system and its purpose as a vital link between isolated rural communities and the rest of the nation. The goal of the U.S.C. 49-5311(f) program is to support the connection between nonurbanized areas and the larger regional or national system, meet the intercity travel needs of residents in nonurbanized areas, and support the infrastructure of the intercity bus network.

The application is for reimbursement of operating deficits for state fiscal year 2015 (July 1, 2014 through June 30, 2015) for intercity bus routes in Kansas.

Notice of Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Health, Bureau of Family Health, will conduct a public hearing at 10 a.m. Friday, January 31, in Room 530 of the Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider adoption of new regulations K.A.R. 28-4-1250 through 28-4-1269, pertaining to staff secure facilities. These regulations incorporate the requirements in K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-535. They are being proposed as temporary regulations and as permanent regulations. A summary of the proposed regulations and the estimated economic impact follows:

Summary of Regulations:

K.A.R. 28-4-1250. Definitions. Provides specific definitions of terms used in regulations for staff secure facilities.

K.A.R. 28-4-1251. Applicant, permittee, and licensee requirements. Describes the application process, including license fee. Applicant must be a government subdivision or person with a governing board. If a corporation, must be in good standing with secretary of state. Applicant must develop policies and procedures for facility operation. Requires floor plan showing separation from other facilities and fire marshal's approval regarding safety of entrances and exits. Requires notification to local school district. Before opening date, staff must complete training. Addresses compliance with building codes, fire safety requirements, and zoning codes. Secretary may refuse to grant a license if applicant is not in compliance with applicable statutes and these regulations.

K.A.R. 28-4-1252. Terms of a temporary permit or license. Temporary permit or license required to operate a facility. Temporary permit or license valid only for per-

mittee or licensee and specified address; capacity shall not be exceeded; temporary permit or license must be posted. New application required if owner or location changes. Changes to building use, structure, program, or staff training requirements require prior approval of the secretary. Information is provided on license renewal, requests for exceptions, requests for amendments to the license. Withdrawal of application or closure of a facility is addressed.

K.A.R. 28-4-1253. Background checks. Requires background checks to comply with K.S.A. 65-516.

K.A.R. 28-4-1254. Administration. Describes requirements for facility operation, including organizational chart, administrative policies and procedures, and employing an administrator and a clinical director. Requires implementation of policies and procedures for facility operation. Confidentiality of residents' information must be ensured. Program, services, and living units must be separate from any other child care facility. Staff and volunteers must be informed of and follow policies and procedures. Regulations governing facilities must be kept on premises and available to staff. All contracts, agreements, policies and procedures must be reviewed annually.

K.A.R. 28-4-1255. Staff member requirements. Each individual working or volunteering must be qualified by temperament, maturity, judgment, understanding of residents. Staff member performing duties of more than one position must meet requirements for both. Describes requirements for all types of staff members and for volunteers. Lists orientation and in-service training requirements.

K.A.R. 28-4-1256. Records. Requires organized record-keeping system. Lists the required contents of records for residents, staff members, volunteers, and the facility.

K.A.R. 28-4-1257. Notification and reporting requirements. Lists the requirements for notification and reporting of incidents or events, by type. Requires a written report within five days of an incident or event.

K.A.R. 28-4-1258. Admission and release. Policies and procedures must be implemented for admissions and releases. No individual admitted unless authorized by Kansas code for care of children and K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-535. Describes the preadmission health screening and admissions procedures. Prohibits staff or volunteer from accepting permanent legal guardianship of a resident. Describes the resident release procedures.

K.A.R. 28-4-1259. Health care. Requires implementation of policies and procedures for health care of residents, including a health checklist and follow-up care. Describes requirements for the physical health of residents, emergency medical treatment, oral health, and personal health and hygiene. Describes requirements for personal health of staff and volunteers. Prohibits the use of tobacco products inside the facility or in the presence of residents.

K.A.R. 28-4-1260. Case management. Requires assignment of a case manager to provide or coordinate services to each resident. Requires a plan of care for each resident with goals and services required.

K.A.R. 28-4-1261. Program. Requires implementation of policies and procedures for the program; prohibits discrimination against any resident. Describes the program

to be provided to residents. Individualized plan of care for each resident must be reviewed and updated; describes requirements to be included in the plan. Lists the services to be provided, including mental health, substance abuse, and life skills training. Describes requirements for visitation and communication with residents by individuals outside the facility.

K.A.R. 28-4-1262. Behavior management. Requires implementation of policies and procedures for the behavior management of residents, including a rule book of expected behaviors. Lists the prohibited punishments; states that no staff member or volunteer shall make sexual remarks or advances or engage in physical intimacies or sexual activities with any resident or exercise undue influence or duress. Prohibits use of medication, herbal or folk remedies, or drugs to control behavior. No resident forced to participate in publicity or promotional activities.

K.A.R. 28-4-1263. Staff member schedule; supervision of residents. Describes requirements for staff schedules and ratios of staff members to residents. Describes requirements for supervision of residents. Requires implementation of policies and procedures for determining when increased direct supervision of a resident is required.

K.A.R. 28-4-1264. Emergency plan; safety, security and control. Describes requirements for an emergency plan. Requires fire and tornado drills. Requires implementation of policies and procedures for supervision, inspection, and accountability to promote safe and orderly operations. Lists requirements for the policies and procedures. Describes requirements for storage and use of hazardous substances and unsafe items. Lists requirements for first-aid supplies.

K.A.R. 28-4-1265. Environmental requirements. Describes general building requirements and requirements for location and grounds. Lists the requirements if a swimming pool is on the premises. Addresses structural requirements and the use of space, including sleeping rooms, living units, and space for visitation and screening/search of residents and visitors. Describes requirements for bathrooms and drinking water. Lists the building maintenance standards.

K.A.R. 28-4-1266. Food services. Describes requirements for sanitary practices, nutrition, food service and preparation, food storage and refrigeration, meals or snacks prepared on the premises, meals and snacks catered, table service and cooking utensils.

K.A.R. 28-4-1267. Laundry. Requires laundry facilities be located separate from food preparation areas. Requires adequate space for storage of clean and dirty linen and clothing. Addresses laundering of blankets. Describes requirements for mattresses.

K.A.R. 28-4-1268. Transportation. Requires implementation of policies and procedures for transporting residents. Safety checks required on transporting vehicles. Addresses insurance, first-aid kit in each vehicle, seat belts. Describes health and safety requirements for residents in any vehicle. Requires each resident be transported directly to designated location with no unauthorized stops.

K.A.R. 28-4-1269. Animals. Lists the requirements if animals are on the premises.

Economic Impact:

Cost to the agency: There is no additional cost to the agency. Costs will be absorbed in the current budget.

Cost to licensees: These regulations were developed to implement provisions of K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 65-535, concerning human trafficking. While similar types of residential child care facilities are licensed by the department, this is a new type of residential facility. The costs are therefore unknown at this time.

Costs to other governmental agencies or units: There is no known additional cost associated with implementation of the facility licensing regulations.

The time period between publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed new regulations. At any time during the public comment period any interested parties may submit written comments to Dorothy Tenney, KDHE, Child Care Licensing Program, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 200, Topeka, 66612-1274, by fax at 785-296-0803, or by email to dtenney@kdheks.gov. Written comments will be accepted until 5 p.m. on the day of the hearing. During the hearing, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed new regulations as well as an opportunity to submit their written comments. In order to give each individual an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary for the hearing officer to request that each presenter limit any oral presentation to an appropriate time frame.

K.A.R. 54-4-1. Public library internet access policy; adoption and review. This is a new regulation that establishes procedures to ensure that appropriate technology protection measures are implemented to protect Kansas citizens, particularly minors, from visual depictions of child pornography, material that is harmful to minors, or obscene. The economic impact on the State Library is marginal. The economic impact on the public library will depend on the filtering software and the number of public access computers. The State Library does not anticipate any economic impact on other governmental agencies or private businesses or individuals.

Temporary Administrative Regulations

Article 2.—LOTTERY RETAILERS

111-2-311. Cosentino's Price Chopper grocery give-a-way. (a) The term of this promotion shall be from 12:00 a.m. October 1, 2013, through midnight on October 31, 2013.

(b) During the term of this promotion with participating chain numbers 1436 and 1732 Cosentino's Price Chopper stores in Kansas, for every Super Kansas Cash single ticket purchase of \$3 or more, the player shall receive an entry for the "Grocery Give-A-Way" promotion drawing. Lottery terminals shall automatically dispense an entry form for each \$3 or more Super Kansas Cash single ticket purchase at participating Cosentino's Price Chopper Kan-

sas lottery retailers during the term of this promotion. The qualifying Super Kansas Cash purchase may be for a single draw or for multiple draws.

(c) During the term of this promotion, drop boxes for the deposit of entries shall be provided by the lottery and placed at all participating Cosentino's Price Chopper locations. All drop boxes shall be retrieved by the Kansas lottery at the end of the promotion.

(d) After the term of this promotion has ended on October 31, 2013, one entry and two alternate entries shall be drawn by the Kansas lottery pursuant to standard lottery drawing procedures for each of the participating Price Chopper grocery store locations. The drawing is to be held during the week of November 7, 2013, at Cosentino's corporate office.

(e) The winner from each store location will win \$100 in groceries. The Kansas lottery will give each store a \$75 instant ticket credit. Cosentino's will pay the additional \$25 per store for the total \$100 prize.

(f) The game promotion procedure set forth hereinabove shall be repeated for the second eligible contestant and possible alternate winners. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-11-6-13, Sept. 11, 2013.)

111-2-312. Method of entry. (a) Entry into the "Grocery Give-A-Way" promotion shall be accomplished as follows.

(1) During the term of this promotion, with every qualifying purchase of \$3 or more Super Kansas Cash on a single ticket, an entry form shall be automatically produced by the lottery online terminal.

(2) The purchaser must complete the information on the entry form in a legible manner. Only one name shall appear on each entry form.

(3) The completed entry form must be placed into the designated drawing receptacle provided at any participating Cosentino's Price Chopper location no later than midnight on October 31, 2013.

(4) The holder of the entry is not required to personally attend the drawing or be present at the time of the drawing to be determined a winner.

The rules and regulations for the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game are contained in K.A.R. 111-15-1 through 111-15-11 and K.A.R. 111-15-21, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-6-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-12-7-10, Sept. 8, 2010; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-10-18-12, Sept. 12, 2012; amended, T-111-11-6-13, Sept. 11, 2013.)

111-15-2. Definitions. The following definitions shall apply to the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game:

(a) "Available ticket(s)" or "ticket(s) available for sale" means one or any number of tickets from one through 175,000 that is available to sell during the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" game.

(b) "Check-A-Ticket Machine" means an electronic machine operated by the Kansas lottery for the purpose of determining whether or not an online ticket is a winning ticket.

(c) "Computer pick" or "quick pick" means the selection of a six-digit number by the computer system, which appears on a ticket and is played by a player in the game. This is the only type of ticket sold by a retailer for the game.

(d) "Drawing" means the formal process of selecting winning numbers which determine the number of winners for each prize level of the game.

(e) "Early Bird Drawings" means a series of drawings for prizes to be held on October 13, 20, and 27, 2013, and November 3 and 10, 2013 before final raffle drawings on December 31, 2013.

(f) "Electronic drawing machine" or "random number generator" means the electronic device approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery to electronically select the winning numbers for this drawing.

(g) "Game ticket" or "ticket" means a computer generated ticket issued by a terminal to a person as a receipt for the ticket a person has purchased.

(h) "Online lottery game" means a lottery game connected by telephone lines, satellite, radio, or other similar communication methodology, owned or controlled by the lottery, to a central computer in which each player selects numbers out of a larger predetermined set or sets of numbers.

(i) "Order drawn" means the sequential order in which a "WINNING" ticket or tickets are selected during the drawing process.

(j) "Pari-mutuel prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, shall be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game.

(k) "Retailer" or "agent" means a person or entity authorized by the Kansas lottery to sell lottery tickets.

(l) "Serial number" means the identifying number printed on the top line of the ticket.

(m) "Set Prize" means all prizes that are advertised to be paid by a single cash payment as outlined in these rules, and which will be equal to the prize amount established by these rules for the prize level.

(n) "Terminal" means a device authorized by a party lottery to function in an on-line, interactive mode with the lottery's computer system for the purpose of issuing lottery tickets and entering, receiving and processing lottery transactions, including purchases, validating tickets and transmitting reports.

(o) "Ticket Number" means the six-digit number that was selected by the computer, which appears on the face of the ticket and is identified on the ticket as such.

(p) "Validation" or "validate" means the process of determining whether a ticket presented for a prize is a winning ticket.

(q) "Winning number" or "winning numbers" means a six-digit number which is selected by an electronic drawing machine to be a winner of a prize in this drawing.

(r) "Winning ticket" or "winning tickets" means a raffle ticket which was available for sale for this game where the ticket number matches a winning number drawn for the raffle, in exact order, reading from left to right. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-10-12-11, Sept. 14, 2011; amended, T-111-10-18-12, Sept. 12, 2012; amended, T-111-11-6-13, Sept. 11, 2013.)

111-15-3. Game description; retail sale of tickets.

(a) "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" is a raffle drawing which offers a total of 175,000 online tickets available for sale. Each ticket shall bear a "TICKET NUMBER" on the face of the ticket. The Kansas lottery will conduct "Holiday Millionaire Raffle Early Bird Drawings" according to the following schedule, unless otherwise determined by the executive director:

For each early bird drawing, one ticket number will be drawn to determine the winner of one \$10,000 prize. A ticket must be purchased before 8:59 p.m. the day of the drawing to be eligible for that drawing. In the event a ticket wins the prize in an early bird drawing, the ticket will remain eligible for any remaining drawings, including the final drawing held on December 31, 2013. For the final drawing, an electronic drawing machine, which has been approved by the executive director of the Kansas lottery, shall randomly select a total of 2,551 "WINNING NUMBERS." Each "WINNING NUMBER" consists of a six-digit number as it appears in exact order reading from left to right. A player wins by exactly matching his or her "TICKET NUMBER" to a "WINNING NUMBER" that was selected in the drawing. The first "WINNING NUMBER" selected during the drawing process shall be the grand prize winner. The second (2nd) through twenty-sixth (26th) "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process shall be the second prize winners. The next 25 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of the twenty-seventh (27th) "WINNING NUMBER" through the fifty-first (51st) "WINNING NUMBER," shall be the third prize winners. The next 2,500 "WINNING NUMBERS" selected during the drawing process, which shall be drawn in the order of the fifty-second (52nd) "WINNING NUMBER" through the two thousand five hundred fifty-first (2,551st) "WINNING NUMBER," shall be the fourth prize winners. If 169,000 of the 175,000 tickets that are available for sale are sold, all prizes shall be paid

as a cash lump sum payment. If less than 169,000 tickets available for sale are sold, all prizes shall be paid on a pari-mutuel basis as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game. To play the "Holiday Millionaire Raffle," a player shall purchase a "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" ticket which bears a ticket number on the face of the ticket.

(b) A "Holiday Millionaire Raffle" ticket shall sell for \$20 (twenty) dollars.

(c) Tickets shall not be sold to any person under the age of 18 years. Each retailer may require a person purchasing tickets to produce proof of age.

(d) Each ticket shall be purchased from a terminal operated by a retailer.

(e) All tickets sold by a retailer shall be a "computer pick" or "quick pick" ticket.

(f) A validated ticket shall be the only proof of a game play. The only method of claiming a prize or prizes shall be the submission of the original winning ticket to and receipt of said ticket by the lottery or its authorized agent.

(g) The only guaranteed methods of win checking a ticket to determine whether the ticket bears a winning number shall be through the Kansas lottery check-a-ticket machines, or submission of a ticket to the Kansas lottery or an authorized retail agent.

(h) A ticket shall not be voided or cancelled by returning the ticket to the selling retailer, including tickets that are printed in error. Exchange tickets may be printed by the lottery for early bird drawing winners at the discretion of the executive director.

(i) There shall be a total of 175,000 available tickets for sale.

(j) Ticket sales will begin at 5:00 a.m. central time on October 1, 2013.

(k) Ticket sales will end at 2:00 a.m. central time on December 31, 2013, or whenever all 175,000 tickets that are available for sale are sold, whichever comes first.

(l) The game will officially close on 4:30 a.m. on December 31, 2013.

(m) The drawing shall be conducted on December 31, 2013, before noon central time, at a secure location as determined by the executive director, after the game is closed and the drawing official has verified that the game is closed, under conditions and procedures promulgated by the executive director of the lottery.

(n) Each player shall have the sole responsibility for verifying the accuracy and condition of the data printed on the ticket. The purchase of a ticket is done at the player's own risk through the online retailer who is deemed to be acting on behalf of the player in entering the play or plays.

(o) For any reason or under any circumstance, the liability of the Kansas lottery or its agents shall be strictly limited to a refund of the amount of the ticket purchase price.

(p) Winning ticket numbers shall be made available to the public on or about noon, December 31, 2013. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710; implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8718; effective, T-111-10-8-09, Sept. 9, 2009; amended, T-111-12-7-10, Sept. 8, 2010; amended, T-111-12-29-10, Dec. 9, 2010; amended, T-

111-15-5. Expected prize payout. (a) In the event 169,000 or more of the tickets available for sale in this raffle game are sold, all prizes awarded shall be paid as set cash prizes, with the following expected approximate prize payout amounts:

(b) In the event less than 169,000 tickets available for sale in this raffle game are sold, all prizes awarded as described in subsection (a) above shall be paid as pari-mutuel prizes, as a cash lump sum payment of the total cash held for all tickets sold in this game. In that instance, the money available from the funding sources for this game shall be divided among the winning tickets/plays in proportion to their respective prize percentages. Any pari-mutuel prizes awarded shall be calculated rounding down to the nearest dollar. Monies left over after prizes have been rounded down shall be applied to the general prize reserve pool for subsequent lottery games. 111-15-21. Instant win cash prizes. The Kansas lottery shall offer all Kansas lottery players purchasing a Holiday Millionaire raffle ticket the chance to win a \$50 cash prize (up to 5,000 winners based on sell out) instantly. Beginning with the sale of "Holiday Millionaire" raffle tickets at 5:00 a.m. central time on October 1, 2013,

through the close of sales at 2:00 a.m. on December 31, 2013, a coupon will be generated by the lottery selling terminal with every thirty-fifth (35th) Holiday Millionaire raffle ticket sold amongst all selling Kansas lottery locations throughout the state of Kansas. The coupon generated may be given to the player by the store clerk who sold the thirty-fifth ticket. The coupon shall be redeemed by the player for \$50 cash. The coupon can be redeemed at any Kansas lottery selling location or at the Kansas lottery headquarters or regional locations, or the coupon can be mailed to the Kansas lottery in accordance with established procedures for ticket redemption for the Holiday Millionaire raffle game. A winning icon shall be printed on the corresponding thirty-fifth Holiday Millionaire raffle ticket that consists of a pig encircled by the words, "Kansas Lottery \$50 Winner." (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-11-6-13, Sept. 11, 2013.)

Article 17.—SPECIFIC ONLINE DRAWING RULES

111-17-11. Tech the Halls second-chance drawing.

(a) The Kansas lottery may conduct a second-chance online drawing entitled "Tech the Halls Drawing." The Kansas lottery will accept entries into the drawing only through the Kansas Lottery website starting at midnight, October 2, 2013, and ending at noon on January 28, 2014. The drawing will be conducted sometime after entry into the drawing has closed, but before noon on January 31, 2014.

(b) The specific non-winning ticket eligible for entry into this second-chance online event drawing shall be the \$10, "Winner Wishes," game number 512.

(c) The Kansas lottery shall award one grand prize and five secondary prizes in the second-chance drawing. The grand prize shall consist of \$500 cash, and each secondary prize shall consist of \$100 cash.

(d) The drawing shall select 15 entrants. The first entrant drawn (identified as number 1) shall be awarded the grand prize identified in subsection (c). The next five entrants drawn (identified as numbers 2 through 6) shall be awarded a secondary prize identified in subsection (c). The next nine entrants drawn in this drawing (identified as numbers 7 through 15) will be used as alternate winners, if necessary, in the order drawn. An alternate winner will be awarded the first available unclaimed prize.

(e) A winner of a grand prize or a secondary prize shall be notified via email that he or she has won a prize. The winner shall be instructed how to verify his or her personal identification.

(f) A winner shall then be sent a claim form via U. S. mail at the time email notification is sent.

(g) A player who is among the winners selected in this drawing to receive a grand prize or a secondary prize must return his or her completed claim form, which must be received by the Kansas lottery within 30 days following the date of the winners being notified via email. Alternatively, a player who is among the entrants selected as alternate winners in this drawing to receive a prize and as identified in subsection (d) must return his or her completed claim form within 30 days following the date the alternate winner was sent a claim form via U. S. mail.

(h) Completed claim forms and non-winning ticket(s) can be mailed by the winners via U.S. Mail to: Kansas lottery, 128 North Kansas Avenue, Topeka, Kansas 66603, or the winners can deliver the completed claim form and non-winning ticket by hand to the Kansas lottery claims center in Topeka, Kansas, during normal business hours between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., excluding holidays and weekends.

(i) If a player fails to answer any email, respond to any request for information, or fill out any forms required by the Kansas lottery within the time allotted in the winner's notification of winning a prize, said win shall be forfeited and the prize awarded to another alternate winner.

(j) A player can enter the online event drawing an unlimited number of times, but can win a prize in the drawing only one time.

(k) Each person who enters a Kansas lottery "Winner Wishes" ticket, game number 512, agrees to release the

Kansas lottery and their respective officers, directors, employees, agents, and sponsors from liability of any kind or nature for any loss, claims, damages, or injuries of any kind associated with participation in the drawing or with acceptance and use of any prize.

(l) Any player entering the "Tech the Halls Second-Chance Drawing" agrees to public disclosure.

(m) The Kansas lottery reserves the right to substitute prizes at its sole and total discretion of approximate equal value.

(n) Rules applicable to this online event drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-17-11 and K.A.R. 111-16-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-11-6-13, Sept. 11, 2013.)
