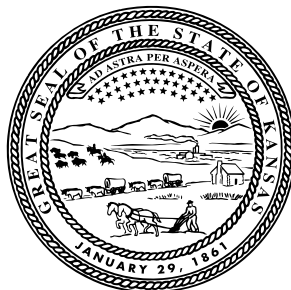

In accordance with Federal Highway Administration and Federal Transit Administration requirements, the Kansas Department of Transportation requests comments on the draft federal fiscal year 2015-2018 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) for Kansas.

The six state MPOs are the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) for the Kansas City area; the Lawrence-Douglas County Metropolitan Planning Office; the Wichita Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (WAMPO) that serves Sedgwick County and the cities of Andover and Mulvane; the Metropolitan Topeka Planning Organization; the Flint Hills Metropolitan Planning Organization that serves the cities of Manhattan, Ogden and Junction City; and the St. Joseph Area Transportation Study Organization that serves Doniphan County in the cities of Wathena and Elwood.
