The Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS), Behavioral Health Services, announces the release of a request for proposals on May 28, 2015, to provide high acuity psychiatric hospital services for uninsured youth (HAPHY) and for those unable to be served as a result of high acuity in another facility. This RFP will be to provide those services to youth ages 6 to 18 years of age, statewide.

KDADS is seeking proposals for a geographically responsive equitable provision of these services. This request for proposals is consistent with and moves forward the KDADS Behavioral Health Services' mission, which includes partnering to promote prevention, treatment and recovery to ensure Kansans with behavioral health needs live safe, healthy, successful and self-determined lives in their communities.

A public hearing will be conducted by the Kansas Board of Cosmetology at 1 p.m. Tuesday, August 25, in the Kansas Board of Cosmetology's conference room, 714 S.W. Jackson, Suite 100, Topeka, to consider amendment to the fees charged for cosmetology profession and body art profession written and practical examinations and the removal of body art mobile facilities as a type of establishment licensed by the board. Copies of the proposed regulations may be found at www.kboc.ks.gov.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written comments from the public on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written public comments on the proposed regulations prior to the hearing to Laurel Lowrie, legal assistant, Board of Cosmetology, 714 S.W. Jackson, Suite 100, Topeka, 66603, or by email to laurel.lowrie@kboc.ks.gov.

All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views, either orally or in writing or both, concerning the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statements in an accessible format. Handicapped parking is located directly outside the east entrance to the building and on the southwest corner of 8th and Jackson. The east entrance to the building is accessible.

These regulations are proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulations and the economic impacts follows:

K.A.R. 69-11-1. Fees. Amendments to this regulation would increase the fee for examination for cosmetologist, esthetician, nail technician and electrologist apprentices. Apprentices are required to take both a written exami-

nation and a practical examination. The amendment increases the fee for examination from \$50.00 to \$75.00. The board anticipates an economic impact on apprentices of an additional \$25.00 to take each examination.

K.A.R. 69-15-1. Definitions. Amendments to this regulation would remove the definition of "mobile facility" as well as all the reference to "mobile facility" contained in the definition of "establishments" in K.A.R. 69-15-1(h). This change is not anticipated to have an economic impact.

K.A.R. 69-15-14. Cosmetic tattoo, tattoo, body piercing establishment licensing and renewal. This regulation is amended to eliminate mobile facilities as a type of establishment licensed by the board. This change is not anticipated to have an economic impact.

K.A.R. 69-15-30. Fees. This regulation is amended to increase the examination fees for tattoo artist, cosmetic tattoo artist and body piercer apprentices. The regulation is amended to increase the fee for the written examination from \$25.00 to \$75.00 and the fee for the practical examination from \$60.00 to \$75.00. The board anticipates an economic impact on apprentices of an additional \$50.00 to take the written examination and an additional \$15.00 to take the practical examination.

Administrative Regulation

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Thursday, September 17, at the office of the State Corporation Commission, 266 N. Main, Suite 220, Wichita, to consider the adoption of a proposed rule and regulation of the commission on a permanent basis.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing constitutes a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the State Corporation Commission, Conservation Division, Legal Department, 266 N. Main, Suite 220, Wichita, 67202, or by email to oilandgasregcomments@kcc.ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally regarding the adoption of the proposed regulation during the public hearing.

Any individual with a disability may request an accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulation and economic impact statement in an accessible format. K.A.R. 82-3-304. Tests of gas wells. The proposed amendment makes three main changes, along with some smaller changes: 1) it lengthens the amount of time operators have to submit initial 24-hour shut-in pressure tests on new gas wells; 2) it increases the amount of gas a well must be capable of producing before triggering certain annual testing requirements; and 3) it eliminates the need for operators to file annual exemptions for gas wells incapable of producing enough gas to trigger the annual testing requirements, which in turn eliminates the need for an annual shut-in pressure test. The annual testing requirements were historically used to set production allowables and to gather field-wide data. Production at most gas wells, however, is low enough that the tests typically have no effect on the minimum production allowable provided for by regulation at each well, and the shut-in pressures are low enough that the data gathered no longer has much value. In addition, low field pressures coupled with the nature of the tests increasingly causes lingering negative effects on production.

The principal economic impact of this amended regulation will be the savings associated with operators no longer needing to file annual exemption forms with the commission and no longer needing to conduct annual shut-in pressure tests to obtain the exemptions.

Permanent Administrative Regulations

Article 14.—CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS

66-14-1. Requirements. (a) Each licensee shall have completed 30 professional development hours (PDHs) of acceptable continuing education requirements during the two-year period immediately preceding the biennial renewal date established in K.A.R. 66-6-6 as a condition for license renewal. If the licensee exceeds the requirement in any renewal period, the licensee may carry a maximum of 15 PDHs forward into the subsequent renewal period.

(b)(1) Each professional surveyor shall complete, as part of the 30 PDHs required, at least two PDHs of preapproved continuing education activity on the Kansas minimum standards adopted by reference in K.A.R. 66-12-1(b).

(2) Each provider of a continuing education activity specified in paragraph (b)(1) shall submit an application for preapproval of the continuing education activity on a form provided by the board.

(3) To qualify for preapproval, each continuing education activity shall meet the following conditions:

(A) The activity has a definable purpose and objective.

(B) The activity is created and conducted by a person qualified in the subject area.

(C) The activity equals two contact hours.

(D) Documentation is provided to the participant upon completion of the activity.

This regulation shall be effective on and after September 1, 2015. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 74-7013 and 74-7025; effective March 1, 1996; amended Feb. 4, 2000; amended Jan. 23, 2009; amended Dec. 27, 2013; amended Sept. 1, 2015.)

66-14-2. Definitions. Each of the following terms used in this article shall have the meaning specified in this regulation:

(a) "Contact hour" means one clock-hour of at least 50 minutes.

(b) "Continuing education activity" means an activity that enhances a licensee's level of technical, professional, managerial, or ethical competence in order to further the

(continued)

goal of protecting the health, safety, and welfare of the public.

(c) "Continuing education unit" (CEU) means a unit of credit customarily used for continuing education courses. One CEU shall be the equivalent of 10 PDHs.

(d) "Dual licensee" means a person who is licensed in two technical professions.

(e) "Professional development hour" (PDH) means a unit of credit given by the board for participation in a continuing education activity as specified in this article.

(f) "Sponsor" means an individual, organization, association, institution, or other entity that provides an educational offering for the purpose of fulfilling the continuing educational requirements of these regulations.

This regulation shall be effective on and after September 1, 2015. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 74-7013 and 74-7025; effective March 1, 1996; amended Jan. 23, 2009; amended Sept. 1, 2015.)

66-14-3. Continuing education activities. (a) Continuing education activities that satisfy the continuing education requirement shall include the following:

(1) Attending professional or technical presentations at meetings, conventions, or conferences;

(2) attending in-house programs sponsored by corporations or other organizations;

(3) successfully completing seminars, tutorials, short courses, correspondence courses, televised courses, or videotaped courses;

(4) making professional or technical presentations at meetings, conventions, or conferences;

(5) teaching or instructing, as described in K.A.R. 66-14-5(a)(2);

(6) authoring published papers, articles, or books;

(7) serving as an officer or committee member of a technical profession society or organization, as described in K.A.R. 66-14-5(a)(4);

(8) successfully completing courses sponsored by a college or university; and

(9) successfully completing courses that are awarded PDHs.

(b) Each of the continuing education activities identified in paragraphs (a)(1), (2), (3), (8), and (9) shall meet all of the following conditions:

(1) The activity has a definable purpose and objective relevant to the licensee's field of practice.

(2) The program is conducted by a person qualified in the subject area.

(3) The licensee retains a record of registration and attendance.

This regulation shall be effective on and after September 1, 2015. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 74-7013; implementing K.S.A. 2014 Supp. 74-7013 and 74-7025; effective March 1, 1996; amended Feb. 4, 2005; amended Jan. 23, 2009; amended Sept. 1, 2015.)

66-14-5. Computation of credit. (a) Continuing education units shall be measured in professional development hours (PDHs) and shall be computed as follows:

(1) Successfully completing one contact hour of professional development education in coursework or seminars or making professional or technical presentations at meet-

ings, conventions, or conferences shall be the equivalent of one PDH.

(2) Teaching or instructing, as specified in K.A.R. 66-14-3(a)(5), shall constitute four PDHs for each contact hour spent in the classroom. Teaching credit shall be valid for teaching a course or seminar in its initial presentation only. Full-time faculty at a college, university, or other educational institution shall not receive teaching credit for teaching their regularly assigned courses.

(3) Authoring a published paper, article, or book shall be the equivalent of one of the following:

(A) 10 PDHs for each book or peer-reviewed paper in the licensee's area of professional practice; or

(B) two PDHs for each paper or article in the licensee's area of professional practice.

(4) Serving as an officer or committee member of a technical profession society or organization shall be the equivalent of two PDHs. Professional development hours shall be limited to two PDHs for each organization and shall not be earned until the completion of each year of service.

(5) Successfully completing one university semester hour of credit shall be the equivalent of 45 PDHs.

(6) Successfully completing one university quarter hour of credit shall be the equivalent of 30 PDHs.

(b) Final authority regarding the approval of continuing education activities shall rest with the board.

66-14-7. Records. (a) Each licensee shall maintain records on forms prescribed and furnished by the board to support the professional development hours claimed by the licensee.

The records shall include the following:

(1) A log showing the type of continuing education activity claimed, the number of professional development hours earned, and other information as applicable; and

(2) supporting documentation, which may include documentation of either of the following:

(A) Presentations or attendance at meetings, conventions, conferences, programs, seminars, and similar activities, which shall be documented by verification records in the form of completion certificates or other documents supporting evidence of attendance; or

(B) authoring published papers, articles, or books, which shall be documented by proof of publication.

(b) Each licensee shall maintain the records specified in subsection (a) for at least four years and shall provide a copy to the board, upon request.

66-14-10. Licensure in another jurisdiction. (a) Except as specified in subsections (b) and (c), the board's

continuing education requirements may be satisfied if a licensee meets all of the following conditions:

(1) The licensee is licensed to practice one of the technical professions in another jurisdiction.

(2) The licensee resides in the jurisdiction specified in paragraph (a)(1).

(3) The licensee meets the continuing education requirements of the jurisdiction in which the licensee resides.

(b) If a licensee resides in a jurisdiction that requires no continuing education, the licensee shall meet the continuing education requirements of this article.

(c) Each professional surveyor shall comply with K.A.R. 66-14-1(b).

66-14-11. Dual licensee. Each dual licensee shall earn at least 20 of the required PDHs for each renewal period, including the carryover permitted by this regulation, in each technical profession. The number of PDHs that may be carried over into the next renewal period for each dual licensee shall not exceed 15 in each technical profession.

Article 17.—SPECIFIC ONLINE DRAWING RULES

111-17-18. Kansas City Royals second-chance drawing. (a) The Kansas lottery may conduct a second-chance online event drawing entitled “Kansas City Royals Second-Chance Drawing.” The rules for this drawing are contained in K.A.R. 111-16-1 *et seq.* and 111-17-18. The Kansas lottery will accept online entries into the drawing beginning at 5:00 a.m. June 1, 2015, and ending at noon on July 31, 2015. The drawing will be conducted sometime after entry into the drawing has closed, but before noon on August 7, 2015.

(b) The specific winning or non-winning ticket eligible for entry into this second-chance online event drawing shall be an online Kansas lottery single \$6 or more Powerball ticket, including Power Play. The entry ticket must be purchased and dated during the period June 1, 2015, through July 31, 2015. The entry ticket may include multiple plays or multi-draws on a single ticket, but must actually be purchased between June 1, 2015, and July 31, 2015.

(c) The Kansas lottery shall award one grand prize to a player who entered the “Kansas City Royals Second-

Chance Drawing” using the ticket specified in subsection (b) above. The grand prize shall consist of game tickets for four persons to attend the Kansas City Royals versus Minnesota Twins baseball game in the Crown Club suite on September 8, 2015, an autographed baseball, and lunch for the winner and three guests with Denny Matthews on a date to be determined by the Kansas lottery.

(d) There will be one drawing held to select the winner of the grand prize. The drawing shall select six entrants. The first entrant drawn in the drawing shall be awarded the grand prize identified in subsection (c). The next five entrants drawn in this drawing (identified as numbers 2 through 6) will be used as alternate winners, if necessary, in the order drawn.

(e) The winner of the prize shall be notified via email that he or she has won a prize. The winner shall be instructed how to verify his or her personal identification.

(f) The winner shall be sent a claim form via U. S. mail at the time the winner is notified he or she has won a prize.

(g) A player who is the first winner selected in this drawing to receive the grand prize must return his or her completed claim form and must be received by the Kansas lottery within seven days following the date of the online event drawing. If an alternate winner is used, the alternate winner must return his or her completed claim form within seven days following the date the alternate winner was sent a claim form via U. S. mail.

(h) A completed claim form can be mailed by the winner via U.S. Mail to: Kansas lottery, 128 North Kansas Avenue, Topeka, Kansas 66603, or the winner can deliver the completed claim form by hand to the Kansas lottery claims center in Topeka, Kansas, during the claim center’s normal business hours.

(i) If a player fails to answer any email, respond to any request for information, or fill out any forms required by the Kansas lottery within the time allotted in the winner’s notification of winning a grand prize, said win shall be forfeited and the prize awarded to another alternate winner.

(j) The Kansas lottery reserves the right to substitute prizes at its sole and total discretion of approximate equal value.

(k) Each person who enters the “Kansas City Royals Second-Chance Drawing” agrees to release the Kansas City Royals, its parent and affiliated companies, the Kansas lottery and their respective officers, directors, employees, agents, and sponsors from liability of any kind or nature for any loss, claims, damages, or injuries of any kind associated with participation in the drawing or with acceptance and use of any prize.

(l) In the event any game in the prize package awarded for this drawing is postponed, changed, or canceled in whole or in part, no cash prize substitutions or other compensation shall be provided.

Senate Substitute for HOUSE BILL No. 2135

AN ACT making and concerning appropriations for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016, for state agencies; authorizing certain transfers, imposing certain restrictions and limitations, and directing or authorizing certain disbursements, procedures and acts incidental to the foregoing.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) For the fiscal years ending June 30, 2016, appropriations are hereby made, restrictions and limitations are hereby imposed, and transfers, disbursements, procedures and acts incidental to the foregoing are hereby directed or authorized as provided in this act.

(b) This act shall not be subject to the provisions of K.S.A. 75-6702(a), and amendments thereto.

Sec. 2.

DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION

(a) (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of K.S.A. 75-3722, 75-6704, and amendments thereto, or any other statute, during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016, the director of the budget shall continuously monitor the status of the state general fund with regard to estimated and actual revenues and approved and actual expenditures and demand transfers: Provided, That periodically, the director of the budget shall estimate the amount of the unencumbered ending balance of moneys in the state general fund for fiscal year 2016 and the total amount of

anticipated expenditures, demand transfers and encumbrances of moneys in the state general fund for fiscal year 2016: Provided further, That if the amount of such unencumbered ending balance in the state general fund is less than \$100,000,000, the director of the budget: (A) Shall determine the amount of moneys appropriated in each account of the state general fund or each special revenue fund appropriated for fiscal year 2016 for any agency of the executive branch of state government that are not required to be expended or encumbered for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016; and (B) shall certify each such amount: And provided further, That, during fiscal year 2016, the director of the budget shall certify each amount appropriated from the state general fund, to the director of accounts and reports and, upon receipt of such certification, the amount so certified is hereby lapsed: And provided further, That, during fiscal year 2016, the director of the budget shall certify each amount appropriated from each special revenue fund, to the director of accounts and reports and, upon receipt of such certification, the amount so certified is hereby transferred to the state general fund: And provided further, That, at the same time as the director of the budget transmits each such certification to the director of accounts and reports, the director of the budget shall transmit a copy of such certification to the director of legislative research: And provided further, That the aggregate of all amounts lapsed from appropriations from the state general fund and amounts transferred from special revenue funds pursuant to this subsection, shall not exceed \$100,000,000.

(b) The provisions of this section shall not apply to the legislature or any agency of the legislative branch of state government; or the judicial branch or any agency of the judicial branch of state government.

(c) The provisions of this section shall not apply to: (1) Any item of appropriation for debt service for payments pursuant to contractual bond obligations; (2) any item of appropriation for employer contributions for the employers who are eligible employers as specified in K.S.A. 74-4931(1), (2) and (3), and amendments thereto, under the Kansas public employees retirement system pursuant to K.S.A. 74-4939, and amendments thereto; (3) any item of appropriation for the department of education, except the provisions of this section shall apply to the operating expenditures (including official hospitality) account of the state general fund of the department of education; or (4) any demand transfer to the school district capital improvements fund for distribution to school districts pursuant to K.S.A. 75-2319, and amendments thereto.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.
