In accordance with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) requirements, the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) requests comments on the draft Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2017-2020 Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) for Kansas.

The STIP is a project-specific publication that lists KDOT administered projects, regardless of funding source, including projects for counties and cities as well as projects on the state highway system for a four-year period (October 1, 2016 to September 30, 2020). In addition, an index of projects being advance constructed, summarizing the conversion year(s) and conversion amount by phase for each project listed, is provided. Projects that are developed or revised after the preparation of this STIP document will use the STIP amendment process.

Supplementing the project information is a narrative that briefly describes KDOT's public involvement process, project selection process, program financing and fiscal constraint anticipated for the STIP, and an overview of KDOT's public transportation program. Also, included within the STIP narrative are brief descriptions of the programs administered by entities other than KDOT. These programs which are required by federal law to be included in the STIP are: the Federal Lands and Tribal Transportation programs administered by the Office of Federal Lands Highway and the Bureau of

Indian Affairs; Recreational Trails, administered by Kansas Wildlife, Parks and Tourism; and the Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs) administered by each of the Metropolitan Planning Organizations for the six urbanized areas of Kansas. The six state MPOs are: the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) for the Kansas City area; the Lawrence-Douglas County Metropolitan Planning Office; the Wichita Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (WAMPO) that serves Sedgwick County and the Cities of Andover and Mulvane; the Metropolitan Topeka Planning Organization, the Flint Hills Metropolitan Planning Organization that serves the cities of Manhattan, Ogden and Junction City and the St. Joseph Area Transportation Study Organization that serves Doniphan County in the cities of Wathena and Ellwood.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) and the Unified Government of Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas' Department of Air Quality (DAQ) are soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Saint-Gobain North America has applied for a Class I operating permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et al. The purpose of a Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Saint-Gobain North America, 20 Moores Road, Malvern, PA 19355, owns and operates a fiberglass manufacturing plant producing building insulation and loose-fill insulation located at 103 Funston Road, Kansas City, KS 66115.

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Luke Rodriguez at the address listed above, or by fax to 913-342-5634, and must be received by noon Monday, September 12, 2016, in order for the secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period,

A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Lynelle Ladd, KDHE, BOA, no later than noon Monday, September 12, 2016 in order for the secretary of Health and Environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition pe-

#### Notice of Public Hearing on Proposed Administrative Regulations

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE), Division of Environment, Bureau of Air, will conduct a public hearing at 10 a.m. Thursday, October 13, 2016, in the Azure Conference Room, fourth floor, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed amended air quality regulations K.A.R. 28-19-11, 28-19-300 and 28-19-304. Upon adoption of these proposed amended regulations, KDHE will submit these regulations to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) for approval into the State Implementation Plan (SIP).

A summary of the proposed regulations and the estimated economic impact follows.

#### Summary of Regulations:

**K.A.R. 28-19-11.** KDHE proposes to amend K.A.R. 28-19-11 to comply with the USEPA SIP call and avoid a Federal Implementation Plan if the state does not comply. Amendments remove the authority of KDHE to declare excess emissions from a startup, shutdown, malfunction or scheduled maintenance event "not a violation" of applicable emission limitations and standards.

**K.A.R. 28-19-300.** KDHE proposes to amend K.A.R. 28-19-300 to implement the revised National Ambient Air Quality Standard (NAAQS) for Fine Particulate Matter (PM<sub>2.5</sub>) and to clarify and refine applicability criteria for sources subject to the Kansas Minor New Source Review (NSR) permitting program.

**K.A.R. 28-19-304.** KDHE proposes to amend K.A.R. 28-19-304 to update the NSR preconstruction permitting program fee structure from an estimated capital cost mechanism to one based on complexity of source and permit type. Current preconstruction permitting fees were established January 23, 1995, and have not been amended or evaluated since inception.

**Economic Impact:**

The proposed amendments impose no additional costs to the implementing agency, other governmental agencies, units, or the general public.

Costs to the regulated community and consumers: Sources required to obtain a minor NSR construction approval or permit will incur a cost ranging from \$750 for an approval or \$1,000 to \$4,000 for a permit depending on the source category. If the source is required to obtain a Prevention of Significant Deterioration or Nonattainment NSR permit they will incur a cost ranging from \$3,000 to \$18,000 depending on the complexity of the project and the requirement for refined modeling.

The time period between the publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing constitutes a 60-day public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to 5 p.m. on the day of the hearing to Douglas Watson, Chief, Air Monitoring and Planning Section, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. **K.A.R. 105-5-2, K.A.R. 105-5-3, K.A.R. 105-5-6, K.A.R. 105-5-7 and K.A.R. 105-5-8** establish the hourly rate to be paid to the private attorneys who accept court appointments to defend indigent persons in the absence of a public defender. The rate to be paid to assigned counsel is increased from \$65 per hour to \$70 per hour and each of the "caps" for the severity level of the charge is similarly increased from the "cap" at \$65 per hour to the "cap" at \$70 per hour. These amendments reflect action taken by the Board under its statutory authority to adjust



the rate of compensation to more closely approach the rate set by statute of \$80 per hour.

K.A.R. 105-11-1 incorporates by reference the "Attorney Cost Reimbursement Tables: Assigned Counsel and Public Defender." This table lists the average actual cost to the agency for attorney costs on each level of felony.

**Economic Impact.**

The Board anticipates that the continued proration of the assigned counsel hourly rate down from \$80/hour

to \$70/hour will save \$680,000 to the state general fund. (136,000 hours x \$5.00)
