The state of Kansas will conduct a public hearing from 10 a.m. to noon Wednesday, October 22, in the main conference room in the office of the Kansas Housing Resources Corporation, 611 S. Kansas Ave., Suite 300, Topeka, to provide an opportunity for citizens to review and comment upon the preliminary draft of the 2009-2013 Kansas Consolidated Plan and the 2009 Action Plan. The Consolidated Plan is the state's policy framework for federal community development and housing programs.

The proposed 2009-2013 Kansas Consolidated Plan and the 2009 Action Plan will be available for public examination beginning October 1 on the Web at www.kshousingcorp.org. Limited hard copies will be available at the public hearing site and upon request. The public comment period ends October 31.

Request for Proposals

The Kansas Department on Aging (KDOA) is accepting proposals for the 2009 Workforce Enhancement Grant for the provision of educational programs. The objective of the grant program is to improve the quality of life and quality of care for residents in both Medicare and Medicaid certified long-term care nursing facilities and long-term care units of hospitals by aiding in the development of ongoing statewide educational programs for unlicensed and licensed staff employed in these facilities. The educational program must be provided in at least two regions of the state (east, central and/or west).

Grant funds shall **not** be used to train unemployed individuals, or individuals employed in freestanding or attached assisted living facilities, residential health care facilities, home plus, boarding homes, hospitals, home health agencies or any other type of general employment. The grant also will not fund courses for certification as nurse aide, medication aide, home health aide, dietary manager or activity director. **Training provided to ineligible persons will not be reimbursed.**

Objectives of the educational programs should include increasing the basic knowledge of the participants and assisting participants to present in their nursing facility or long-term unit the information presented in the program. A financial incentive will be provided to grant applicants who develop a train the trainer format and who provide documented evidence that participants have presented a program in their nursing facility or long-term care unit.

Accepted program topics are:

- person centered care and choices
- restraint reduction

- infection control practice, including housekeeping and dietary services
- safe and sanitary practices in food handling and preparation
- care of residents with dementia
- communication and teamwork
- pressure ulcer prevention

The program proposal shall include the following:

- course objectives
- course outline with time frame
- teaching strategies
- qualifications of presenters
- method(s) for evaluating effectiveness of the educational program
- copies of any handouts provided to attendees
- number of participants for each program
- number of times the program would be offered and location of each program
- itemized budget of the anticipated costs of the program and the cost per enrollee (including meals if reimbursement desired)

The program may be offered at no cost to the nursing facility or long-term care unit or at a fee of not greater than \$10 per registrant to be paid for by the nursing facility or long-term care unit. KDOA will reimburse the entity based on the proposed budget cost per number of participants and the number of actual participants that attend the program. The ratio of attendance for reimbursement at a program is only one licensed staff for not less than two unlicensed staff. There is no limitation on the number of unlicensed staff who will be reimbursed when attending a program. **Reimbursement will not be provided for licensed staff that exceeds the ratio.**

Successful applicants must comply with all state and federal regulations. To receive reimbursement the entity must submit complete, typed reports including the detailed invoices and attendance rosters of the initial program and incentive program. Attendance roster of the initial program with the participants' original signature also must be submitted. Upon receipt of all the information and approval of KDOA, the entity will be reimbursed. The entity also must submit a quarterly evaluation of the progress of the program and participants' response.

Grant applicants must submit an original application and three copies. KDOA staff will review and approve proposals for appropriateness of course content and location at which the program will be offered. Grant proposals must be submitted to KDOA by October 31 at the close of the business day. The grant period shall be between January 1, 2009 and January 1, 2010. Administrative Regulations**

A public hearing will be conducted at 1 p.m. Thursday, December 11, in Suite 507 of the Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of proposed changes to existing rules and regulations of the Board of Technical Professions.

This 60-day notice of public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving public comments on the proposed regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Board of Technical Professions, Suite 507, Landon State Office Building, 900 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66612, or by e-mail to jeanb@ksbtp.ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulations during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request each participant to limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statement in an accessible format. The following is a brief summary of the substance of the proposed regulations:

Article 11

K.A.R. 66-11-5. Admission requirements for fundamentals of surveying examination Paragraph (b)(4) is being eliminated. The provision for admission based on experience only is no longer available.

Article 12

K.A.R. 66-12-1. Minimum standards for the practice of land surveying. This existing regulation is being re-

vised to reflect the current version of the minimum standard detail requirements for ALTA/ACSM land title surveys.

Article 14

K.A.R. 66-14-1. Requirements. This existing regulation is being condensed and revised to include a requirement that, beginning with licenses that expire on March 31, 2010, each land surveyor shall have completed two PDHs on Kansas minimum standards as part of the 30 PDHs required for renewal.

K.A.R. 66-14-2. Definitions. This existing regulation is being revised to include definitions for mentoring and self-study and to revise the definitions of continuing education activity and professional development hour.

K.A.R. 66-14-3. Continuing education activities. This existing regulation is being revised to add voluntary participation on a governmental or regulatory body and self-study as activities. This revision also adds the continuing education activity criteria that were formerly contained in 66-14-4.

K.A.R. 66-14-4. This regulation is being revoked. The criteria formerly contained in this regulation have been included in K.A.R. 66-14-3.

K.A.R. 66-14-5. Computation of credit. This existing regulation is being revised to include computation of credit for serving as a volunteer member of a governmental or regulatory body and for engaging in self-study. The number of PDHs allowed for mentoring is increased from five per year to six per year.

K.A.R. 66-14-7. Records. This existing regulation is being revised to include a more detailed list of the types of supporting documentation to be used. Changes that are grammatical, appropriate to format, or updated to the most current form of the statute have been made.

Fiscal Impact Statement

The fiscal impact for K.A.R. 66-11-5, K.A.R. 66-12-1, K.A.R. 66-14-1, K.A.R. 66-14-2, K.A.R. 66-14-3, K.A.R. 66-14-4, K.A.R. 66-14-5 and K.A.R. 66-14-7 is as follows:

1. There is no anticipated economic impact on the Board of Technical Professions.
2. These regulations are not mandated by federal law as a requirement for participating in or implementing a federally subsidized or assisted program.
3. There may be a cost to licensees for acquiring the continuing education that is required by these regulations. These costs would include those associated with registration and attendance at some educational offerings. This cost is not increased by the revisions being made.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed adoption of K.A.R. 68-18-1 through K.A.R. 68-18-3. The regulations are proposed for adoption as permanent regulations. A summary of the proposed regulations follows:

K.A.R. 68-18-1. Transferring unused medications. This regulation identifies the procedures that shall be followed when a donating entity transfers each unused medication to a qualifying center or clinic.

K.A.R. 68-18-2. Accepting unused medications. This regulation identifies the procedures that shall be followed when a qualifying center or clinic accepts each unused medication from a donating entity.

K.A.R. 68-18-3. Recall of unused medications. This regulation outlines the procedures to be implemented in the event of an unused medication recall.

A public hearing will be conducted at 10 a.m. Tuesday, December 2, in the fourth floor training room of the Kansas Department of Agriculture, 109 S.W. 9th, Topeka, to consider the adoption of a proposed regulation for the dairy program.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rule and regulation. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the Secretary of Agriculture, 109 S.W. 9th, 4th Floor, Topeka, 66612, or by e-mail at leslie.garner@kda.ks.gov. Comments also may be made through the department's Web site, <http://www.ksda.gov>, under the proposed regulation. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the adoption of the proposed regulation during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to request that each participant limit any oral presentation to five minutes.

The regulation is proposed for adoption on a permanent basis. A summary of the proposed regulation and its economic impact follows:

K.A.R. 4-7-723. The proposed regulation is intended to provide clarification on what is false or misleading labeling as it pertains to milk and dairy products. Specifically, this proposed regulation provides guidance to the dairy industry with respect to label claims concerning the use of recombinant bovine somatotropin, commonly known as "rBST."

Economic impact summary: The additional record/document review in the proposed regulation would have a very minimal impact on the time required to do an inspection by the department. It is estimated that 30 minutes of inspection time would be required at each dairy manufacturing plant during its quarterly inspections; it is estimated to be an additional 20 hours per year at an average cost of \$23.32 per hour or approximately \$466.40.

The proposed regulation will significantly impact dairy manufacturing plants that choose to make production claims concerning rBST on their labels. Existing milk and dairy product labels that do not comply will need to be brought into compliance within the time frames specified in the regulation. The cost of new labels or new containers will vary.

- There are no direct or indirect costs for those dairy manufacturing plants whose labels are in compliance or who do not make any claims relative to rBST use.
- The cost to dairy manufacturing plants of maintaining required verification documents is minimal.
- Plants that use adhesive labels that must be changed can expect an estimated one-time cost of approximately \$3,800 per product label for a typical three-color printing plate and artwork change. This can be a significant cost for a major manufacturing plant

with as many as 80 to 120 different labels. Any existing label inventory remaining after the specified date in the regulation must be disposed of.

- Plants utilizing reusable glass bottles will need to replace their entire inventory within time frames established in the proposed regulation since label information is permanently printed on each glass container. Cost to replace glass bottles is approximately \$2.50 each.
- The regulation applies to any dairy manufacturing plant offering products for sale in Kansas. The regulation applies to both in-state and out-of-state plants.
