The City of Topeka Public Works and the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) announce the availability of an Environmental Assessment (EA) for the proposed improvements to I-70 Highway from the MacVicar Avenue interchange to the Adams Street/Branner Trafficway interchange in Topeka, Kansas. The EA was prepared in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) to determine the potential environmental, cultural, and socioeconomical impacts. The purpose of the proposed improvements to the I-70 Polk-Quincy Viaduct and surrounding transportation networks is to meet current roadway and bridge design criteria, Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) standards, improve driver and pedestrian safety, increase roadway traffic capacity, balance accessibility, and to support economic development in the downtown Topeka area.

The proposed amendment to the existing regulation would eliminate the 30-day waiting period for new employees to be covered by the State Employee Health Plan (SEHP) and make coverage available from the first day of employment. The economic impact would depend on the number of new employees hired by school districts.

K.A.R. 108-1-4. Local unit of government health care **benefits plan.** The proposed amendment to the existing regulation would eliminate the 30-day waiting period for new employees to be covered by the State Employee Health Plan (SEHP) and makes coverage available from the first day of employment.
