The proposed action is to issue a new Class V Injection Well permit for the owner/operator listed above. The facility currently emplaces non-hazardous chloride impacted materials, under a separate UIC Class V permit, to enhance the overall stabilization of the existing salt cavern well field, which helps minimize potential subsidence. These caverns also provide a suitable place for disposal of biosolids and semi biosolids from animal manures, agricultural residuals and plant wastes, and other organic sources into the open-hole void space within an existing plugged and abandoned cavern well located on the property. Cavern AM#5 will be opened, and upon confirmation of suitable conditions, utilized for the emplacement of organic material as described in this permit. No other materials will be allowed without prior approval from KDHE. Emplacement is made into Cavern AM#5 solution mined in the Hutchinson Salt member of the Wellington Formation from approximately 561 to 781 feet below the ground surface. Emplacement pressure into the cavern will not exceed 80 psig at the well head. The maximum rate of injection will be 12,000 barrels per day. The Hutchinson Salt interval consists mostly of salt with shale interbeds and is encountered at a depth of approximately 455 feet below the ground surface. There are no Hutchinson Salt Formation waters and the disposal zone is below the USDW. All construction, monitoring, and operation of these wells shall meet the requirements that apply to Class V Injection wells under the Kansas UIC Regulations, K.A.R. 28-46-1 through 28-46-44 and other requirements of KDHE.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has prepared a draft Underground Injection Control Permit KS-05-155-002 for Advantek Cavern Solutions, LLC (ACS) in Hutchinson, Kansas.

The proposed action is to issue a five-year pilot permit for the emplacement of biosolids and other approved organics in a new well at the existing facility. The organic material will be mixed with saturated brine and injected through the inner tubing string into the open cavern space, brine from within the cavern will then be displaced and circulated to the surface between the inner tubing and casing. The displaced brine will be contained in above ground tanks for future use or injected into the Arbuckle Formation under the facility's UIC Class I permit. The facility is in Section 14, Township 24 South, Range 6 West in Reno County, Kansas. A notice in the Kansas Register dated December 23, 2021, informed the public of the availability of the proposed Underground Injection Control permit for Advantek Cavern Solutions, LLC.

111-501-152. Wagers and play. (a) All wagers at Criss Cross Poker shall be made by placing gaming chips and, if applicable, a match play coupon on the appropriate betting areas of the table layout. A verbal wager accompanied by cash shall not be accepted.

(b) A player must make an ante wager on the across cards and an ante wager on the down cards to participate in that round of play. Both ante wagers must be in the same amount.

(c) A player may also make an optional five card bonus wager. A player placing a five card bonus wager will win the wager if the five community cards constitute a pair of 6's or higher ranking hand.

(e) Once a player has placed a wager and received cards, that player must remain seated until the completion of the round of play. Only players who are seated at the table may touch the cards.

(f) Criss Cross Poker is played with one standard deck of 52 playing cards consisting of a 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, jack, queen, king and ace in each of the following four suits: hearts; diamonds; clubs; and spades.

(g) Before the first card is dealt in a round of play, all cards shall be shuffled with an automatic shuffle machine. Manual shuffling of the cards is not permitted.

(h) The dealing of cards for the game of Criss Cross Poker is as follows:

(1) To begin each round the dealer shall deal the five community cards face down on the gaming table in the form of a cross with the three across cards first placed horizontally on the gaming table, followed by one down card placed above the middle card of the across cards and then one down card placed below the middle card of the across cards;

(2) The dealer shall then deal two cards face down to the player farthest to his/her left, continuing to deal each player two cards face down in a clockwise manner. Each player shall receive two cards before the next player receives his or her cards;

(3) After all players have been given the opportunity to look at their two cards, in turn from the dealer's left to right the players have the following options:

(A) Fold and not participate further in that round of play, which will forfeit all wagers made by the player except for a five card bonus; or

(B) Make an across wager;

(4) The dealer shall then turn face up the first and last cards of the across cards, but not expose the middle card;

(5) The remaining players then have the following options:

(A) Fold and not further participate in that round of play, which will forfeit all wagers made by the player except for a five card bonus wager; or

(B) Make a down wager;

(6) The dealer shall then turn face up the top and bottom cards of the down cards, but not expose the middle card.

(7) The remaining players shall then have the following options:

(A) Fold and not further participate in that round of play, which will forfeit all wagers made by the player except for a five card bonus wager; or

(B) Make a middle card wager; and

(8) The dealer shall then reveal the middle card, which card shall be used for all remaining wagers.

(continued)

(i) The five card bonus wager is resolved immediately before revealing any of the players' cards, regardless of player fold decisions, and is based on the five community cards only. Players will be eligible for the five card bonus regardless of win or loss on any other wager. Working from right to left the dealer shall reveal each player's cards. The player uses their two cards plus the three cards on the horizontal line of the cross to form an across hand and uses their two cards plus the three cards on the vertical line of the cross to form a down hand. The middle wager is paid if either the across or down hand,

or both, qualifies as a win and is paid at the odds of the highest-ranking of those hands.

(j) The dealer shall then pay all winning wagers and collect all losing wagers. (Authorized by K.S.A. 74-8710 and 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 74-8710; effective, T-111-12-20-19, Nov. 13, 2019; amended, T-111-11-24-21, Nov. 10, 2021.)
