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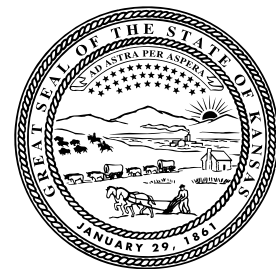

**Anticipated Consultant Scope**

KDOT anticipates the following to be included in the consultant’s scope:

- Preliminary design services
- Final design services
- Public involvement services
- Environmental documentation preparation (Permitting)
- Letting and construction phase services
- 3D electronic deliverables preparation

As stated in the project background and scope, the purpose of this effort is replacement of Bridge #132. Hydraulic design is required over the canal (FEMA FLOODWAY). A no-rise condition must be met. KDOT will consider Accelerated Bridge Construction (ABC) methods. KDOT also may consider reusing the existing foundations and piers (which were built in 1971). The scope of services to be performed by the selected design consultant shall include traffic engineering, hydrology/hydraulics, designer construction services, and permitting assistance.

A traffic management plan will need to be developed. KDOT is keen to hear from consultant innovative ways to handle closures/detours and is interested in considering alternatives. Coordination with the City of Wichita and the public will also be needed.

Cost estimates shall be provided biannually.

Consultant shall review the existing survey and check for updates of utilities and any topo that needs to be re-shot.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has received an application to expand the Acme Foundry, Inc. industrial (foundry sand) landfill. The permit modification will increase that landfill's site area from 10.93 acres to 31.81 acres and its permitted disposal area from 7.5 acres to 22.97 acres. The expansion's effect will be to increase the site's disposal capacity from about 196,900 cubic yards to about 712,600 cubic yards. The proposed landfill expansion would be constructed and operated in conformance with state solid waste regulations and accept only industrial waste as defined by Kansas statutes and generated by Acme Foundry, Inc. The proposed landfill expansion site is located on US-166 highway about 1¼ miles east of Coffeyville, Kansas in the west half of Section 32, in Township 34 South, Range 17 East in Montgomery County.

The Montgomery County Commissioners have previously certified that the landfill is consistent with the county's solid waste management plan and local land use restrictions or zoning. KDHE has reviewed the application and found it to be in conformance with the state solid waste statutes and regulations.

KDHE is today providing public notice of the intent to approve the proposed landfill expansion. However, a final decision to approve the expansion has not been made, and KDHE will consider information gathered during the public comment period before making a final decision. The State of Kansas, Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) was awarded a Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Center for Substance Abuse Training (CSAT) grant. One-time supplemental Substance Abuse Block Grant (SABG) funding is available through the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. The purpose of the grant awarded to Kansas is to expand dedicated testing and mitigation resources for people with substance use disorders. These funds will provide resources and flexibility for states to prevent, prepare for, and respond to the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) public health emergency and ensure the continuity of services to support individuals connected to the behavioral health system. Funding available is \$346,260. Grant funding must be expended by or before September 30, 2025.

#### II. Purpose

The purpose of this Request for Application (RFA) is to partner with one or two community partner(s) to identify, align, and implement COVID-19 testing and mitigation strategies in order to expand dedicated testing and mitigation resources for people with substance use disorders. Federal resources to inform planning will be the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidance for mitigation strategies (<https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/community-mitigation.html#table1>), the ARP Resources that Support COVID Testing and Mitigation Measures PowerPoint by SAMHSA (Attachment A), and the guidance letter dated 8-10-21 to SSA (Single State Authority) Directors from SAMHSA that includes examples of allowable expenditures (Attachment B). Grantees will be expected to work with the state (Kansas Department for Health and Environment (KDHE) and KDADS) as needed.

Using peer mentors when possible, grantees will promote and assist those with behavioral health needs or are in recovery to access existing COVID-19 testing clinics (<https://www.coronavirus.kdheks.gov/280/COVID-19-Testing>) or coordinate with the state (KDHE/KDADS) and local health departments to set-up new testing clinics where those with Behavioral Health (BH) needs access or are in recovery live such as Oxford Houses, CROs, or Club Houses.

When working with this population where untreated behavioral health needs may exist, the contractors will screen, assess, and coordinate treatment for the individual. There are also several behavioral facilities still experiencing closures due to COVID. Many people with behavioral health needs do not have a safe place to quar-

antine and providers have expressed that it is difficult to get people to return to treatment after quarantine. Where possible, contractors will assist providers with finding safe locations for people to quarantine and assist with hotel costs for those without a safe place to quarantine as funding is available. Also, by using peer support where possible, contractors will assist providers when needed in reengaging people in treatment after quarantine.

Please be advised that the federal funding for this project has only been guaranteed through September 30, 2025.

#### III. Eligibility

and Requirements Governing the Provision  
of Medical Services**

**WHEREAS**, securing the health, safety, and economic well-being of residents of the State of Kansas is this Administration's top priority;

**WHEREAS**, Kansas is facing a crisis created by the substantial change in usual healthcare operations and the level of care it is possible to deliver due to the pandemic and public health emergency of COVID-19;

**WHEREAS**, the United States Departments of Health and Human Services declared a public health emergency for COVID-19 beginning January 27, 2020, with more than 56 million cases of the illness and more than 825,000 deaths as a result of the illness across the United States;

**WHEREAS**, as of January 3, 2022, there have been over 534,000 positive cases of COVID-19 in Kansas, spread among all counties, with over 7,000 deaths as a result of the illness;

**WHEREAS**, the increase in positive COVID-19 cases affects Kansas healthcare staff since, for patient safety, they are isolated from being able to provide healthcare while they wait out their isolation and quarantine period;

**WHEREAS**, as of January 6, 2022, COVID-related admissions to Kansas hospitals and pediatric patients are at or near the highest rate since the start of the pandemic and

are creating capacity issues in Emergency Rooms, hospital floors and Intensive Care Units for all patients;

**WHEREAS**, the continued spread of COVID-19 throughout Kansas and the potential for further spread in the days and weeks ahead is part of the toughest surge the medical community has had to face since the pandemic began in 2020, and threatens local health care systems with overload of hospital beds, personal protective equipment, testing and treatment supplies, and other critical resources for responding to the COVID-19 pandemic;

**WHEREAS**, to address the dangers of the above conditions, suspension of certain state statutes and regulations is necessary;

**WHEREAS**, responding effectively to the urgent and steep demands created by the COVID-19 pandemic will require the help of as many health care professionals as possible, working in whatever capacities are appropriate to their respective education, training, and experience. To ensure health care professionals and facilities are fully enabled to provide the critical assistance and care needed by this state and its residents during this unprecedented emergency, it is reasonable and necessary to provide limited and temporary relief from certain restrictions and requirements governing the provision of medical services; and

**WHEREAS**, in these challenging times this Administration will do whatever it can to avoid immediate dangers to the health, safety, and welfare of Kansans, including providing guidance and support for local authorities who are making difficult and important decisions to protect the health and safety of their populations, as well as certainty to the broader population that essential functions will not be interrupted.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, including the authority granted me by K.S.A 48-924 and K.S.A 48-925, in order to address the conditions noted above related to COVID-19, I hereby direct and order the following:

1. Any and all provisions in Kansas Statutes relating to supervision, delegation, and related issues by and to healthcare providers that are licensed, registered or certified and ancillary workers, are temporarily suspended, in whole or part, to the extent necessary to allow licensed, registered, or certified health care professionals to provide, within a designated health care facility at which the professional is employed or contracted to work, medical services that are necessary to support the facility's response to the COVID-19 pandemic and are appropriate to the professional's education, training, and experience, as determined by the facility in consultation with the facility's medical leadership.
  - a. Medical services may be provided under this section without supervision from a licensed physician or nurse, without criminal, civil, or administrative penalty related to a lack of supervision or to the lack of a supervision agreement;
  - b. The suspensions under this section include, but are not limited to, the following:

- i. K.S.A. 65-28a08, 65-28a09 and K.A.R. 100-28a-6, 100-28a-10, 100-28a-13, 100-28a-14, and 100-28a-17 as they relate to supervision, delegation, and related issues to the extent necessary to permit physician assistants to provide medical services appropriate to the professional's education, training, and experience, without a written practice agreement with a physician and without criminal, civil, or administrative penalty related to a lack of such agreement;
  - ii. K.S.A. 65-1130, 65-1158 and K.A.R. 60-11-101, 60-11-104a, 60-11-104, 60-11-105, and 60-11-107 and related provisions of Kansas law, as they relate to supervision, delegation, and related issues to the extent necessary to permit advanced practice registered nurses to provide care without a written collaborative agreement and protocols, and including nurse anesthetists, to provide medical services appropriate to the professional's education, training, and experience, without physician supervision or direction and without criminal, civil, or administrative penalty related to a lack of such supervision;
  - iii. K.S.A. 65-1113 and related provisions of Kansas law, as they relate to supervision, delegation, and related issues to the extent necessary to permit registered nurses and licensed practical nurses to order the collection of throat or nasopharyngeal swab specimens from individuals suspected of being infected by COVID-19, for purposes of testing;
  - iv. K.S.A. 65-1113 and related provisions of Kansas law, as they relate to supervision, delegation, and related issues to the extent necessary to permit licensed practical nurses to provide medical services appropriate to the professional's education, training, and experience, without registered nurse supervision and without criminal, civil, or administrative penalty related to a lack of such supervision;
  - v. K.S.A. 65-1626a and related provisions of Kansas law, as they relate to supervision, delegation, and related issues to the extent necessary to permit licensed pharmacists to provide care for routine health maintenance, chronic disease states, or similar conditions, as appropriate to the professional's education, training, and experience, without physician supervision and without criminal, civil, or administrative penalty related to a lack of such supervision.
  - vi. K.S.A. 65-1115, 65-1116, 65-1117, and K.A.R. 60-3-112, 60-3-15, and 60-3-111 and related provisions of Kansas law, as they relate to supervision, delegation, and related issues to the extent necessary to permit registered nurses and licensed practical nurses, who hold a license that is exempt, inactive, or has lapsed within the past five (5) years, to provide medical services appropriate to their education, training, and experience and without criminal, civil, or administrative penalty related to only having an exempt, inactive, or has lapsed license.
- c. Nothing in this section diminishes the ability of unlicensed health care professionals to practice in Kansas, which statutes provide certain exceptions to licensure and which statutes remain in full force and effect.
2. Notwithstanding any law, regulation, or executive order to the contrary, and without the need for a clinical affiliation agreement, a designated health care facility is temporarily authorized:
    - a. To allow students who are enrolled in programs to become licensed, registered, or certified health care professionals to volunteer or work within the facility in whatever roles that are necessary to support the facility's response to the COVID-19 pandemic and are appropriate to the students' education, training, and experience;
    - b. To allow licensed, registered, or certified health care professionals and emergency medical personnel who are serving in the military in any duty status, to volunteer or work within the facility in whatever roles that are necessary to support the facility's response to the COVID-19 pandemic and are appropriate to the service members' education, training, and experience; and
    - c. To allow medical students, physical therapists, and emergency medical personnel to volunteer or work within the facility as "respiratory therapist extenders" under the supervision of physicians, respiratory therapists, or advanced practice registered nurses. Such extenders may assist respiratory therapists and other health care professionals in the operation of ventilators or related devices. Nothing in this section shall be taken to preclude such extenders from providing any other services that are necessary to support the facility's response to the COVID-19 pandemic and are appropriate to their education, training, and experience, as determined by the facility in consultation with the facility's medical leadership.
  3. Any and all provisions in Kansas law are temporarily suspended, in whole or part, to the extent necessary to allow health care professionals licensed and in good standing in any state or territory in the United States, provided that no such professional may practice if such profession is not authorized in the state of Kansas, to practice in Kansas without criminal, civil, or administrative penalty related to lack of licensure. A license that has been suspended or revoked is not considered a license in good standing, and a licensee with pending disciplinary action is not considered to have a license in good standing. Any license that is subject to a limitation in another state is subject to the same limitation in

this state. This shall not be construed to waive the jurisdictional authority of the appropriate regulatory body over health care professionals practicing pursuant and consistent with this order.

4. Notwithstanding any law or regulation to the contrary, a designated health care facility is temporarily authorized to use qualified volunteers or qualified personnel affiliated with other designated health care facilities, as if the volunteers or personnel were affiliated with the facility. This section is subject to any terms and conditions that may be established by the Secretary of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment.
5. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, all health care providers, including but not limited to "health care provider" as defined in K.S.A. 40-3401, and also including registered nurses, advanced practice registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, pharmacists, unlicensed volunteers, military personnel, or students and other support personnel and all entities or individuals referenced in K.S.A. 48-915, making clinical and triage decisions and rendering assistance, testing, care or advice in the care of patients reasonably suspected or confirmed to be infected with COVID-19, rendered in response to any Kansas Department of Emergency Management mission related to the COVID-19 outbreak, and the proclamation issued declaring a state of disaster emergency pursuant to K.S.A. 48-924, shall be deemed immune from suit pursuant to K.S.A. 48-915, unless it is established that any adverse event or injury was caused by the willful misconduct, gross negligence, recklessness, or bad faith of such facility or health care provider. Nothing in this Executive Order shall be construed to modify, impair or supersede State law governing legal standards, procedures or judicial interpretation used in any civil action against an entity or individual where this Order is deemed not to cover such an entity or individual because of an allegation of willful misconduct or for any other reason.
  - a. Nothing in this Executive Order shall be construed to limit or change the protections from liability provided under K.S.A. 48-915, K.S.A. 65-2891, K.S.A. 75-6101, *et seq.*, or any other state or federal statute.
  - b. The liability protections addressed in paragraph 5 of this order are not intended to extend to medical treatment or procedures performed in the ordinary or customary course of practice.
6. Any and all provisions in Kansas law or regulations are temporarily suspended to the extent that they require for any health care professional, as a condition of licensure, certification, registration, or the renewal of a license, certification, or registration, or reinstatement within five (5) years of a lapsed license:
  - a. An exam, to the extent that the exam's administration has been canceled while the emergency declaration is in effect;

- b. Fingerprinting, as locations to have fingerprints taken are substantially unavailable on account of closures arising from the COVID-19 pandemic;
  - c. Continuing education while the emergency declaration is in effect; and
  - d. Payment of a fee.
7. For individuals who hold professional certifications in basic life support, advanced cardiac life support, or first aid, such certifications shall continue to remain in effect while the emergency declaration is in effect, even if they are otherwise due to expire during the emergency.
8. Any law or regulation is temporarily suspended to the extent that it requires fingerprinting of any individual as a condition of licensure and certification for hospitals, nursing homes, county medical care facilities, or psychiatric hospitals.
9. For purposes of this Order, "designated health care facility" means the following facilities, including those which may operate under shared or joint ownership:
  - a. The entities listed in K.S.A. 40-3401(f);
  - b. State-owned surgical centers;
  - c. State-operated hospitals and veterans facilities;
  - d. Entities used as surge capacity by any of the entities listed in subsections (a)-(c) of this section;
  - e. Adult Care Homes; and
  - f. Any other location specifically designated by the Governor or the Secretary of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment to exclusively treat patients for COVID-19.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 22-01. It shall become effective immediately and remain in force until rescinded, until revoked in accordance with K.S.A. 48-925(b), or until the statewide State of Disaster Emergency proclaimed on January 6, 2022, ends, whichever is earlier.

Licensure, Certification, and Registration for  
Persons and Licensure of "Adult Care Homes"  
During State of Disaster Emergency**

**WHEREAS**, securing the health, safety, and economic well-being of residents of the State of Kansas is this Administration's top priority;

**WHEREAS**, Kansas is facing a crisis created by the substantial change in usual healthcare operations and the level of care it is possible to deliver due to the pandemic and public health emergency of COVID-19;



**WHEREAS**, the United States Departments of Health and Human Services declared a public health emergency for COVID-19 beginning January 27, 2020, with more than 56 million cases of the illness and more than 825,000 deaths as a result of the illness across the United States;

**WHEREAS**, as of January 3, 2022, there have been over 534,000 positive cases of COVID-19 in Kansas, spread among all counties, with over 7,000 deaths as a result of the illness;

**WHEREAS**, on April 2, 2020, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) issued the *COVID-19 Long-Term Care Facility Guidance* to all states regarding the recommendations to help mitigate the spread of the 2019 Novel Coronavirus and to advise states on how to comply with CMS and CDC guidance to keep residents and patients safe and to maintain adequate staff levels and thereby to reduce the imminent threat of new outbreaks of COVID-19;

**WHEREAS**, on April 13, 2020, CMS issued a supplemental guidance *2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) Long-Term Care Facility Transfer Scenarios (QSO-20-25-NH)* to all states, which further provided details of how to transfer/discharge residents between facilities for the purpose of cohorting residents based on COVID-19 status as well as other aspects of how to provide care in long-term care facilities;

**WHEREAS**, as authorized by the *COVID-19 Long-Term Care Facility Guidance* and additional guidance issued by CMS, blanket federal waivers for certain CMS requirements of participation for adult care homes have been issued; thus suspension/waiver of certain state statutes, regulations, and administrative rules has been necessary to reduce the risk of further exposure and spread of COVID-19 and to assist with mitigation efforts during the COVID-19 public health emergency;

**WHEREAS**, "adult care homes," for purposes of this order, are defined as any nursing facility, nursing facility for mental health, intermediate care facility for people with intellectual disability, assisted living facility, residential healthcare facility, home plus, boarding care home, and adult day care facility; all of which are classifications of adult care homes and are required to be licensed by the secretary for aging and disability services in accordance with K.S.A. 39-923(a);

**WHEREAS**, the continued spread of COVID-19 throughout Kansas and the potential for further spread in the days and weeks ahead is part of the toughest surge the medical and adult care home communities have faced since the pandemic began in 2020, and threatens local health care systems with overload of hospital beds, personal protective equipment, testing and treatment supplies, and other critical resources for responding to the COVID-19 pandemic;

**WHEREAS**, after two years of working of under pandemic conditions, adult care homes are finding it increasingly difficult to hire and retain staff who are willing to work in a facility. The reasons for staff leaving the industry are similar to what other health care providers have been reporting. Adult care homes, like hospitals,

are currently operating at crisis staffing levels, struggling to maintain sufficient numbers of licensed and certified staff to provide safe and appropriate care to vulnerable residents. Providing flexibilities to allow adult care homes to rapidly expand staffing capacity for vulnerable residents that reside in adult care homes is a priority of this Administration;

**WHEREAS**, responding effectively to the urgent and steep demands created by the COVID-19 pandemic will require the help of as many health care professionals, certified staff, and other temporary staff as possible, working in adult care homes in whatever capacities are appropriate to their respective education, training, and experience. To ensure adult care homes are fully enabled to provide the critical assistance and care needed by this state and its residents during this unprecedented emergency, it is reasonable and necessary to provide limited and temporary relief from certain restrictions and requirements governing the provision of services provided in adult care homes;

**WHEREAS**, in these challenging times this Administration will do whatever it can to avoid immediate dangers to the health, safety, and welfare of Kansans, including providing guidance and support for local authorities who are making difficult and important decisions to protect the health and safety of their populations, as well as certainty to the broader population that essential functions will not be interrupted; and

**WHEREAS**, to address the dangers of the above conditions, suspension of certain state statutes and regulations is necessary.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, pursuant to the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Kansas, including the authority granted me by K.S.A 48-924 and K.S.A 48-925, in order to address the conditions noted above related to COVID-19, I hereby direct and order the following:

#### **Provisions Specific to Persons**

1. Renewal deadlines shall be extended for any occupational or professional license, certificate, or registration issued by KDADS or any board, commission, or other licensing authority under the jurisdiction of KDADS or the Board of Adult Care Home Administrators (BACHA).
2. A temporary license, certification, or registration may be issued for persons who were previously licensed, certified, or registered by KDADS or any board, commission, division, or other licensing authority under the jurisdiction of KDADS or BACHA as long as the person was in good standing prior to the lapse of the license, certification, or registration. Additionally, the license, certificate, or registration may not have been issued more than five years from the date of this order.
3. KDADS and any board, commission, division, or other licensing authority under the jurisdiction of KDADS or BACHA shall extend the deadlines for any continuing education requirements mandated by statute or regulation until the termination of the State of Disaster Emergency.

- 4. KDADS and any board, commission, division, or other licensing authority under the jurisdiction of KDADS or BACHA shall waive any late fee associated with any license, certificate or registration associated with Sections 1 and 2 above.
- 5. For purposes of this Order, "in good standing" shall include a license, certificate or registration that is subject to probation, or non-disciplinary conditions, limitations, or restrictions, but shall not include a license, certificate or registration that is revoked, cancelled, or surrendered. If the records of KDADS or any board, commission, division, or other licensing authority under the jurisdiction of KDADS or BACHA reflect an individual has a prohibiting offense, such license, certificate, or registration shall not be considered "in good standing." Any license, certificate, or registration that is subject to disciplinary conditions, limitations, or restrictions shall remain subject to such conditions, limitations, or restrictions.
- 6. A temporary aide authorization may be issued for persons who receive minimum training within the nursing facility as set forth by KDADS. The facility, at a minimum, needs to ensure persons with a temporary aide authorization are competent to perform/execute their duties, including but not limited to: infection control, proper patient handling, and how to effectively assist with the performance of activities of daily living.
- 7. A temporary authorization may be issued for persons who were not previously licensed, certified, or registered by Kansas or any other state in the United States of America. The individuals who may be served by those who hold this temporary authorization are individuals who only require minimal supervision or assistance with activities of daily living. The facility, at a minimum, needs to ensure persons with a temporary authorization are competent to perform/execute their duties, including but not limited to: infection control, proper patient handling, and how to effectively assist with the performance of activities of daily living.

**Provisions Specific to Facilities/Units/Locations**

- 8. The Secretary of KDADS shall have authority to issue a provisional license, pursuant to K.S.A. 39-929, to an adult care home that submits a checklist, on a form approved by KDADS; and a detailed plan for isolation/cohorting of residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Secretary's approval of the checklist and plan may require temporary suspension of standards, requirements, rules, and regulations related to the physical environment, a change in bed capacity, or change in bed classification for the adult care home. The requirement of K.S.A. 39-929 that the state fire marshal approve issuance of the provisional license shall be suspended only if KDADS has approved the adult care home's submission of the checklist and plan for cohorting residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. The provisional license shall be valid until the termination of the State of Disaster Emergency. Oth-

erwise, if a provisional license is issued by KDADS for reasons other than the isolation/cohorting of residents in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, all requirements of K.S.A. 39-929 shall be effective.

This document shall be filed with the Secretary of State as Executive Order No. 22-02. It shall become effective immediately and remain in force until rescinded, until revoked in accordance with K.S.A. 48-925(b), or until the statewide State of Disaster Emergency proclaimed on January 6, 2022, ends, whichever is earlier.

**66-7-1. Applications.** (a) In addition to the appropriate, completed application form and fee, each applicant shall also have the following submitted to the board office:

(1) An official transcript to verify any educational credit; and

(2) verification of any practical experience for which credit is claimed on reference forms approved by the board, which shall be submitted directly to the board office by the individual providing the reference.

(b) Each applicant for a license by reciprocity shall also submit the following:

(1) Verification of any exams previously taken; and

(2) verification of a current active license.

(c) Each applicant for occupational licensing by reciprocity under K.S.A. 2020 Supp. 48-3406, as amended by L. 2021, ch. 70, sec. 1, and amendments thereto, shall also submit one of the following, in addition to meeting the requirements in subsections (a) and (b):
