**Re: Elections—Advance Voting—Advance Voting; Ballots and Ballot Envelopes; Declaration, Form; Failure of Elector to Complete Declaration; Effect; Challenged and Objected to Ballots.**

**Elections—Original Canvass of Elections—Rules for Canvassers; Validity of Ballots or Parts Thereof; Technical Error; Advance Voting; Ballot Envelope; Declaration.**

**Synopsis:** Failure to complete the address portion of the affidavit printed on the advance voting ballot envelope is a technical error that, by itself, does not invalidate the ballot contained therein. Absent any other issues regarding the ballot, the votes cast thereon should be counted. **Synopsis:** Retroactive tax legislation proposed during the 2013 legislative session and affecting tax year 2013 is constitutional if the legislation is justified by a rational legislative purpose. The non-wage business income tax exemption provisions of Senate Substitute for House Bill 2117, passed during the 2012 legislative session, can be implemented in their current form. **Synopsis:** A county is not required to bid in the county's interest on real property at a tax foreclosure sale held pursuant to a court order. The delinquent taxpayer continues to own property for which a foreclosure judgment has been rendered until such property is sold to the successful bidder at a public auction and the successful bidder is issued a deed therefor, or when the property is sold or transferred in accordance with K.S.A. 2011 Supp. 79-2803a(b). The redemption period for delinquent property begins to run from the date the county bids off the property in the name of the county pursuant to K.S.A. 79-2306. A summary of the proposed regulations and the economic impact follows:

**K.A.R. 91-42-1 and K.A.R. 91-42-2.** These regulations govern the use of emergency safety interventions (seclusion and restraint) with all students in all Kansas schools. The purpose of the regulations is to establish definitions and requirements in the event emergency safety interventions are used in Kansas schools.

No economic impact is anticipated for the State Board of Education, school districts, other governmental entities, private businesses or individuals.

The city's total indebtedness that is subject to debt limitation, as of January 2, 2013, is estimated to be \$3,388,324, which is 5.65 percent of the assessed valuation of the city.

This action consists of reissuing an existing Kansas Water Pollution Control Permit for an existing nonoverflowing lagoon treatment facility. The proposed permit contains requirements for monitoring biochemical oxygen demand, total suspended solids, ammonia, E. coli, total phosphorus, pH, flow and water level in the irrigation system from final cell. The permittee also is required to provide KDHE with a map showing the field(s) to be irrigated and a basic soil analyses of the irrigated fields.

Persons wishing to comment on the draft documents and/or permit applications must submit their comments in writing to the Kansas Department of Health and Environment if they wish to have the comments considered in the decision-making process. Comments should be submitted to the attention of the Livestock Waste Management Section for agricultural-related draft documents or applications, or to the Technical Services Section for all other permits, at the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Water, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 420, Topeka, 66612-1367.

All comments regarding the draft documents or application notices received on or before December 22 will be considered in the formulation of the final determinations regarding this public notice. Please refer to the appropriate Kansas document number (KS-AG-12-346/348, KS-Q-12-173/192, KS-NQ-12-023) and name of the applicant/permittee when preparing comments.

After review of any comments received during the public notice period, the secretary of health and environment will issue a determination regarding final agency action on each draft document/application. If response to any draft document/application indicates significant public interest, a public hearing may be held in conformance with K.A.R. 28-16-61 (28-46-21 for UIC).

All draft document/applications and the supporting information including any comments received are on file and may be inspected at the offices of the Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Bureau of Water. These documents are available upon request at the copying cost assessed by KDHE. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Kansas Health and Environmental Laboratory, Quality, Preparedness and Certifications Section, Breath Alcohol Laboratory Program, will conduct a public hearing at 2 p.m. Thursday, January 24, in the Azure Conference Room, fourth floor, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of amended regulation K.A.R. 28-32-13 pertaining to laboratory records.

A summary of the proposed regulation and the estimated economic impact follows:

**Summary of Regulation:**

**28-32-13.** The proposed amendment to this regulation removes the requirement that local law enforcement agencies and organizations that conduct breath alcohol testing submit quarterly reports regarding the testing to KDHE. The information that is currently submitted in these reports is retrieved by KDHE staff during required annual site inspections and inspections of Intoxilizer 8000 units at the law enforcement agencies and organizations. Since the data is already retrieved by KDHE staff, the requirement to generate and submit quarterly reports is not needed.

**Economic Impact:**

**Cost to individuals:** There is no known increase in costs to private citizens or regulated providers.

**Cost to the agency:** It is anticipated that the costs incurred by KDHE to implement this regulation will be negligible. The annual site inspections of local law enforcement agencies and organizations and their testing units are already being conducted by KDHE personnel within the current budget. In addition, the proposed amendment will reduce KDHE staff requirements to review and maintain the quarterly reports from local agencies and organizations.

**Costs to other governmental agencies or units:** The proposed amendment will reduce the costs to local agencies and organizations associated with producing quarterly reports.

The time period between publication of this notice and the scheduled hearing serves as the required public comment period of at least 60 days for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed amended regulation. At any time during the public comment period interested parties may submit written comments to Christine M. Houston, KDHE, 6700 S.W. Topeka Blvd., Bldg. 740, Topeka, 66620, by email to [chouston@kdheks.gov](mailto:chouston@kdheks.gov) or by fax to 785-296-8068. During the hearing, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally on the proposed amended regulation as well as an opportunity to submit their written comments. In order to give each individual an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary for the hearing officer to request that each presenter limit any oral presentation to an appropriate time frame.
