Request for Comments

The following ICFsMR cost center limits are being set forth for public comment. Comments should be sent to Rhonda Boose, reimbursement manager, Financial and Information Services, Department for Aging and Disability Services, 503 S. Kansas Ave., Topeka, 66603. The comment period will expire 30 days from the publication of this notice.

K.A.R. 30-10-214 provides for the annual review and adjustment of Class II ICFsMR cost center limits, approved by the secretary of KDADS or designee, based on current cost information supplied by the enrolled, licensed providers of ICF-MR services, and formula set forth in the Kansas State Medicaid Plan (Attachment 4.19-D, Part II, Subpart O, page 1). The formula is as follows: Total allowable costs, including an inflation factor, are compared to the amount to be reimbursed under the current limits. The formula threshold requires that 60 percent of all ICFsMR are reimbursed 90 percent of their allowable costs. If less than 60 percent of the facilities are reimbursed 90 percent of their allowable costs, then the cost center limits are adjusted until the threshold is met. The inflation factor is based on the Data Resources, Inc. (DRI) — WEFA, National Skilled Nursing Facility Total Market Basket Index.

To determine where to make the adjustments, two major cost centers are analyzed according to the following prescription:

- Administrative costs are based on facility size.
- Habilitation costs are based on facility size and level of care (LOC).

The cost analysis for 2012 showed that 68 percent of the Class II ICFsMR were being reimbursed 90 percent or more of their allowable costs. Per the state plan the analysis indicates that adjustments are not required.

Recommendations

Based on cost report analysis and available funding, cost center limits for Class II ICFsMR are as follows:

Emissions of particulate matter (PM), PM equal to or less than 10 microns in diameter (PM₁₀), PM equal to or less than 2.5 microns in diameter (PM_{2.5}), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), oxides of nitrogen (NO_x), sulfur dioxide (SO₂), carbon monoxide (CO), sulfuric acid mist (H₂SO₄), hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) and greenhouse gases (GHGs) were evaluated during the permit review process.

The proposed permit is to be issued in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-350, prevention of significant deterioration (PSD), which adopt the federal standards, procedures and requirements of 40 CFR 52.21 by reference. These air quality regulations apply to major stationary emission sources located in areas designated as "attainment" under the federal Clean Air Act (CAA). Attainment areas are areas where the air quality meets or is better than the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS).

The PSD regulations require evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the best available control technology (BACT) for each regulated pollutant, including GHGs, for which the emission rate exceeds the PSD significant level. The purpose of BACT is to affect the maximum degree of reduction achievable, taking into account energy, environmental and economic impacts for each regulated pollutant under review. Evaluation of the estimated emissions for the proposed Lacey Randall Generation Project indicates that the emission rates of NO_x, CO, PM, PM₁₀, PM_{2.5}, VOCs and GHGs all exceed the significance levels. The facility conducted the required BACT analyses. The department has reviewed the BACT analyses for the Lacey Randall Generation Project and concurs with its findings as follows:

- For the Wartsila 4SLB RICE, lean burn combustion with clean burn technology and selective catalytic re-

duction (SCR) is BACT for NO_x, oxidation catalyst and good combustion practices are BACT for CO and VOC, combustion controls and low ash fuels are BACT for PM, PM₁₀ and PM_{2.5}, use of efficient lean burn engines, use of pipeline quality natural gas fuel, and good combustion practices are BACT for GHGs;

- For the fuel gas heater, low NO_x burners are BACT for NO_x, good combustion practices are BACT for CO, VOC, PM, PM₁₀ and PM_{2.5}, and use of pipeline quality natural gas as fuel and good combustion practices are BACT for GHGs.
- For the emergency diesel generator, combustion control is BACT for NO_x, CO, VOC, PM, PM₁₀ and PM_{2.5}, and selection of the most efficient engines that meet the project needs is BACT for GHGs;
- For the emergency fire pump, combustion control is BACT for NO_x, CO, VOC, PM, PM₁₀ and PM_{2.5}, and selection of the most efficient engines that meet the project needs is BACT for GHGs.
- For the circuit breakers, use of state-of-the-art enclosed sulfur hexafluoride technology with leak detection systems and a density monitor alarm system is BACT for GHGs.
- For the fuel oil storage tank, the use of a submerged fill pipe is BACT for VOC.

An ambient impact analysis was performed on the potential air emissions of NO₂, PM₁₀, PM_{2.5} and CO from the Lacey Randall Generation Project.

- Detailed modeling for the 1-hour and annual NO₂ demonstrated that the proposed Lacey Randall Generation Project will not cause or significantly contribute to any violation of the 1-hour or annual NO₂ NAAQS. It also demonstrated that 4.44% of the annual NO₂ Class II area maximum allowable increment is expected to be consumed by the proposed project. The EPA has not established a Class II area maximum allowable increment for 1-hour NO₂. Accordingly, no calculation of the potential consumption of such increment is possible.
- Detailed modeling for PM₁₀ demonstrated that the proposed Lacey Randall Generation Project will not cause or significantly contribute to any violation of the 24-hour PM₁₀ NAAQS. It also demonstrated that 25.9% of the 24-hour PM₁₀ and 6.41% of the annual PM₁₀ Class II area maximum allowable increment are expected to be consumed by the proposed project.
- Detailed modeling for PM_{2.5} demonstrated the proposed Lacey Randall Generation Project will not cause or significantly contribute to any violation of the 24-hour or annual PM_{2.5} NAAQS. It also demonstrated that 86.2% of the 24-hour PM_{2.5} and 27.2% of the annual PM_{2.5} Class II area maximum allowable increment are expected to be consumed by the proposed project.
- The CO screening modeling analysis demonstrated no significant impact on the 1-hour or 8-hour ambient air quality and that the emissions would not cause or contribute to any violation of ambient air standards. The EPA has not established any Class II maximum allowable increments for CO. Accordingly, no calcu-

lation of the potential consumption of such increment is possible.

- An analysis of visibility was conducted for Scott State Park. The VISCREEN model results indicate no exceedances of the screening criteria. No adverse impacts on soils and vegetation in the area are expected.
- Any federal land manager who has reason to believe they may have a Class I area adversely impacted by the emissions from the proposed project has the opportunity to present KDHE with a demonstration of the adverse impact on the air quality-related values of the federal Class I area during the comment period.

A public comment period has been established until noon January 21 allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns they may have about this proposed permitting action. All comments should be submitted in writing to Mindy Bowman, KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, 66612-1366.

Any member of the public may request a public hearing be conducted to provide comments on the proposed issuance of the draft air quality construction permit. A written request to hold a public hearing should be sent to the attention of Mindy Bowman at the address listed above or by fax to 785-291-3953 and must be received by noon January 21. If a pertinent request is received, a public hearing is tentatively scheduled by KDHE on Wednesday, January 22, at the Colby Community Building in the Little Theater Room, 285 E. 5th St., Colby. The hearing will begin at 5 p.m. and continue until audience members have an opportunity to submit comments. If no pertinent requests to hold the public hearing are received by noon January 21, the public hearing will be cancelled. A notice of the cancellation will be posted at the KDHE website at <http://www.kdheks.gov/bar/publicnotice.html>.

If a hearing is conducted, all interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their views orally or by submission of written materials during the hearing. In order to give all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to limit oral presentations to a specific time limit.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed materials in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation must be made not later than January 13 by contacting the Bureau of Air at 785-296-6421.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process for the PSD permit is available for public review for a period of 30 days from the date of publication during normal business hours, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., at the KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Suite 310, Topeka, and at the KDHE Northwest District Office, 2301 E. 13th St., Hays. Article 2.—AMBULANCE SERVICES; PERMITS AND REGULATIONS

109-2-2. Application for ambulance service permit and ambulance license; permit renewal and license renewal. (a)(1) An applicant may apply for only one ambulance service permit for each ambulance service that the applicant seeks to operate. Each applicant shall indicate the class of service for the permit requested as type I ambulance service, type II ambulance service, type IIA ambulance service, or type V ambulance service.

(2) An applicant may apply for only one ambulance license for each ambulance that the applicant seeks to operate. Each applicant shall indicate the class of ambulance for each license requested.

(b) All ambulance service permit and ambulance license application and renewal forms shall be submitted in a format required by the executive director.

(c)(1) Each initial and each renewal applicant for a ground ambulance service permit and ambulance license shall meet one of the following requirements:

(A) Obtain a mechanical and safety inspection from a person doing business as or employed by a vehicle maintenance service or a city, county, or township or from a certified mechanic as defined in K.A.R. 109-1-1, for each ambulance within 180 days before the date of ambulance service application renewal; or

(B) have a long-term vehicle maintenance program with requirements equivalent to or exceeding the requirements of the mechanical and safety inspection form.

(2) In order for an ambulance license to be renewed, the mechanical safety inspection forms shall not contain any deficiencies identified that would compromise the safe transport of patients.

(d) Each initial and each renewal application for an air ambulance shall include a valid standard airworthiness certificate for each aircraft, evidence of an air safety training program, and an informational publication.

(e)(1) Each new ground ambulance shall meet one of the following requirements:

(A) Be required to have a mechanical or safety inspection submitted on forms required by the board or shall require documentation from the manufacturer indicating that the vehicle has undergone a predelivery inspection without deficiencies; or

(B) have a long-term vehicle maintenance program with requirements equivalent to or exceeding the requirements of the mechanical and safety inspection form.

(2) Each used or retrofitted ground ambulance shall be required to have a mechanical and safety inspection.

(f) Each ambulance service permit and ambulance license shall expire on April 30 of each year. Any such permit or license may be renewed annually in accordance with this regulation. If the board receives a complete application for renewal of an ambulance service permit or an ambulance license on or before April 30, the existing permit or license shall not expire until the board has taken

final action upon the renewal application or, if the board's action is unfavorable, until the last day for seeking judicial review.

(g) If the board receives an insufficient initial application or renewal application for an ambulance service permit or ambulance license, the applicant or operator shall be notified by the board of any errors or omissions. If the applicant or operator fails to correct the deficiencies and submit a sufficient application within 30 days from the date of written notification, the application may be considered by the board as withdrawn.

(h) An application for ambulance service permit or permit renewal shall be deemed sufficient if all of the following conditions are met:

(1) The applicant or operator either completes all forms provided with the application for ambulance service permit or permit renewal or provides all requested information online. No additional information is required by the board to complete the processing of the application.

(2) Each operator submits the list of supplies and equipment carried on each ambulance validated by the signature of the ambulance service's medical director to the board each year with the operator's application for an ambulance service permit.

(3) The applicant or operator submits payment of the fee in the correct amount for the ambulance service permit or permit renewal and ambulance license fees.

(4) Each operator provides the inspection results to the board on forms provided by the executive director with the application for renewal.

(i) Each publicly subsidized operator shall provide the following statistical information to the board with the application for renewal of a permit:

(1) The number of emergency and nonemergency ambulance responses and the number of patients transported for the previous calendar year;

(2) the operating budget and, if any, the tax subsidy;

(3) the charge for emergency and nonemergency patient transports, including mileage fees; and

(4) the number of full-time, part-time, and volunteer staff.

(j) Each private operator shall provide the following statistical information to the board with the application for renewal of a permit:

(1) The number of emergency and nonemergency ambulance responses and the number of patients transported for the previous calendar year;

(2) the charge for emergency and nonemergency patient transports, including mileage fees; and

(3) the number of full-time, part-time, and volunteer staff.

(k) As a condition of issuance of an initial ambulance service permit, each ambulance service operator shall provide with the application the ambulance service's operational policies and approved medical protocols pursuant to K.A.R. 109-2-5.

(l) The operator of each type I, type II, type IIA, and type V ground ambulance service shall develop a list of supplies and equipment that is carried on each ambulance. This list shall include the supplies and equipment required by the board for the license type and any additional supplies or equipment necessary to carry out the patient care activities as indicated in the services medical protocols in accordance with K.S.A. 65-6112 and amendments thereto. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 65-6110 and 65-6111; implementing K.S.A. 2012 Supp. 65-6110, K.S.A. 65-6127, and K.S.A. 65-6128; effective May 1, 1985; amended July 17, 1989; amended Jan. 31, 1997; amended Dec. 29, 2000; amended Jan. 27, 2012; amended Jan. 3, 2014.)
