Notice of Hearing on Proposed
Administrative Regulations

The State Fire Marshal will conduct a public hearing at 10 a.m. Tuesday, April 8, in the Florentine Room of the Jayhawk Tower, 700 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of amendments to K.A.R. 22-8-11 and K.A.R. 22-8-12 and the revocation of K.A.R. 22-8-4 and K.A.R. 22-8-7.

This 60-day notice of the public hearing shall constitute a public comment period for the purpose of receiving written public comments on the proposed rules and regulations. All interested parties may submit written comments prior to the hearing to the State Fire Marshal, Suite 600, Jayhawk Tower, 700 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, 66603, or by email to mende.barnett@ksfm.ks.gov. All interested parties will be given a reasonable opportunity during the public hearing to present their views orally regarding the adoption of the proposed regulations. In order to provide all parties an opportunity to present their views, it may be necessary to require that each participant limit any oral presentation to an appropriate time frame.

Any individual with a disability may request accommodation in order to participate in the public hearing and may request the proposed regulations and economic impact statement in an accessible format. Requests for accommodation should be made at least five working days in advance of the hearing by contacting Mende Barnett at mende.barnett@ksfm.ks.gov or 785-296-0659.

A summary of the proposed regulations and their estimated economic impact follows. Copies of the proposed regulations and the economic impact statement may be obtained by contacting Mende Barnett at the email address or phone number listed above.

K.A.R. 22-8-4 and K.A.R. 22-8-7 (revocations). These regulations, which address checklist certificates and checklist seals for propane powered vehicles, have not been enforced and are being revoked as unnecessary.

K.A.R. 22-8-11. This regulation governs the initial training requirements for obtaining propane licenses pursuant to K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 55-1812. The proposed amendments would clarify how these requirements apply to business entities and would lower the training requirements for obtaining certain licenses, in particular cylinder filling licenses and recreational vehicle fueling licenses.

K.A.R. 22-8-12. This regulation, which specifies the continuing education requirements for propane licensees, is being amended to provide greater clarity about the required refresher training.

Economic Impact: Because K.A.R. 22-8-4 and K.A.R. 22-8-7 are not being enforced, their revocation is not expected to have any economic impact. The amendments to K.A.R. 22-8-11 will have a positive economic impact by reducing the training requirements for certain licenses. The amendments to K.A.R. 22-8-12 are designed to clarify current practice and therefore will have no economic impact.

HB 2483, AN ACT concerning motor vehicles; relating to distinctive license plates; providing for the Kansas horse council license plate, by Committee on Transportation.

HB 2490, AN ACT concerning criminal procedure; relating to trials; conduct of jury after case is submitted; amending K.S.A. 22-3420 and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Judiciary.

HB 2491, AN ACT concerning the Kansas tort claims act; relating to small claims actions; amending K.S.A. 2013 Supp. 75-6103 and repealing the existing section, by Committee on Judiciary.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment has reviewed an application from Blizzard Energy, Inc., to establish and operate a solid waste processing facility for pyrolysis of processed waste tires. Pyrolysis is a process of thermal decomposition in an oxygen-starved environment in enclosed reactor ovens. The proposed facility will receive processed (cut) waste tires from an adjacent, permitted tire processing facility. The pyrolysis process will convert the scrap tires to the following products: pyrolysis oil, carbon black, steel and synthetic gas. The pyrolysis oil will either be sold as a product, or will be refined on-site to petroleum products such as gasoline, diesel, naphtha and fuel oil. The pyrolysis oil will be generated within the pyrolysis building and stored outside in aboveground storage tanks. Pyrolysis oil to be refined will be processed in an outside "product stabilization unit" and the product will be stored outside in aboveground storage tanks. The carbon black will be milled into micron-size final product and bagged for sale. The carbon black is generated, processed and stored within the pyrolysis building. The steel wire will be collected into containers and sold as scrap metal. The steel wire is generated inside the pyrolysis building and will be stored in containers for transport outside the building. The synthetic gas is recycled as fuel for the on-site burners. The synthetic gas is generated within the pyrolysis building, piped to an outside tank for storage, and piped back into the building as fuel source for the burners.

This facility is located in the SE ¼, Section 34, Township 19S, Range 14W, Barton County, at Westport Addition, 9015-H 8th St., Great Bend, Kansas. KDHE has reviewed the application and found it to be in conformance with state solid waste statutes and regulations.
