**Notice of Available Grant Funding**

Grant funds are available from the Federal Sexual Assault Services Grant Program (SASP) for calendar year 2015. The purpose of SASP is to provide intervention, advocacy, accompaniment (e.g., accompanying victims to court, medical facilities, police departments), support services and related assistance for adult, youth and child victims of sexual assault; family and household members of sexual assault victims; and those collaterally affected by the sexual assault victimization. This grant program recognizes the need to place increased focus on sexual assault in order to address the lack of available direct intervention and related assistance services and the unique aspects of sexual assault trauma. Women and men of all ages, as well as children, can be victims of sexual assault.

There is approximately \$281,770 available for grant awards. Available grant funds may be awarded to rape crisis centers and other nonprofit, nongovernmental organizations or tribal programs for programs and activities that provide rape and sexual assault services for the defined grant project purposes. Priority will be given to applicants that are rape/sexual assault crisis centers providing direct intervention and related assistance to victims/survivors; to dual programs that provide sexual assault and domestic violence services to enhance the provision of direct intervention and related assistance

services tailored for victims of sexual assault; and for projects that increase support for underserved populations.

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality operating permit. Tallgrass Interstate Gas Transmission, LLC – Syracuse Compressor Station has applied for a Class I operating permit renewal in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-510 et al. The purpose of a

Class I permit is to identify the sources and types of regulated air pollutants emitted from the facility; the emission limitations, standards and requirements applicable to each source; and the monitoring, record keeping and reporting requirements applicable to each source as of the effective date of permit issuance.

Tallgrass Interstate Gas Transmission, LLC, 370 Van Gordon St., Lakewood, CO 80228, owns and operates the Syracuse Compressor Station, a natural gas compressor station located at Section 31, T21S, R40W, Hamilton County, Kansas.

A copy of the proposed permit, permit application, all supporting documentation and all information relied upon during the permit application review process is available for public review during normal business hours, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., at the KDHE, Bureau of Air, 1000 S.W. A person may request a public hearing be held on the proposed permit. The request for a public hearing shall be in writing and set forth the basis for the request. The written request must be submitted to Cathy Richardson, KDHE, Bureau of Air, not later than noon December 1 in order for the secretary of health and environment to consider the request.

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has a 45-day review period, which will start concurrently with the public comment period, within which to object to the proposed permit. If the EPA has not objected in writing to the issuance of the permit within the 45-day review period, any person may petition the administrator of the EPA to review the permit. The 60-day public petition period will directly follow the EPA's 45-day review period. Interested parties may contact KDHE to determine if the EPA's 45-day review period has been waived.

Any such petition shall be based only on objections to the permit that were raised with reasonable specificity during the public comment period provided for in this notice, unless the petitioner demonstrates that it was impracticable to raise such objections within such period, or unless the grounds for such objection arose after such period. #### Request for Comments

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is proposing to issue a five-year Phase II Acid Rain Permit to the Hutchinson Energy Center (Plant Code: 1248) pursuant to Title IV (Acid Deposition Control) of the Federal Clean Air Act and implementing regulations found in 40 CFR Parts 72 through 78. The effective date of the permit is from January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2019.

One (1) utility boiler is affected by this permit action, identified as Unit No. 4 in 40 CFR Part 73 Table 2, located at 3200 E. 30th St., Hutchinson, KS 67502, and operated by Westar Energy, P.O. Box 889, Topeka, KS 66601, and would receive 16 sulfur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) allowances for each year from 2015 through 2019. The Hutchinson Energy Center proposes to comply with the Acid Rain Program emission requirements by holding enough allowances to cover all sulfur dioxide emissions.

**115-2-3. Camping, utility, and other fees.** (a) Each overnight camping permit shall be valid only for the state park for which it is purchased and shall expire at 2:00 p.m. on the day following its effective date.

(b) Any annual camping permit may be used in any state park for unlimited overnight camping, subject to other laws and regulations of the secretary. This permit shall expire on December 31 of the year for which it is issued.

Article 7.—FISH AND FROGS

**115-7-3. Fish; taking and use of baitfish or minnows.** (a) Baitfish may be taken for noncommercial purposes by any of the following means:

(1) A seine not longer than 15 feet and four feet deep with mesh not larger than ¼ inch;

(2) a fish trap with mesh not larger than ¼ inch and a throat not larger than one inch in diameter;

(3) a dip or cast net with mesh not larger than ½ inch; or

(4) a fishing line.

(b) Each fish trap shall be tagged with the operator’s name and address when the fish trap is in use.

(c) Baitfish taken, except gizzard shad, shall not exceed 12 inches in total length.

(d) The possession limit shall be 500 baitfish.

(e) Live baitfish, except for bluegill and green sunfish from non-designated aquatic nuisance waters and baitfish from designated aquatic nuisance waters, may be caught and used as live bait only within the common drainage where caught. However, live baitfish shall not be transported and used above any upstream dam or barrier that prohibits the normal passage of fish. Bluegill and green sunfish collected from non-designated aquatic nuisance waters may be possessed or used as live bait anywhere in the state. Live baitfish collected from designated aquatic nuisance waters shall be possessed or used as live bait only while on that water and shall not be transported from the water alive.

(f) No person shall import live baitfish that does not meet the requirements of K.A.R. 115-17-2 and K.A.R. 115-17-2a.

**115-7-10. Fishing; special provisions.** (a) A person who takes any fish from a body of water shall not tag, mark, brand, clip any fin of, mutilate, or otherwise disfigure any fish in a manner that would prevent species identification, examination of fins, recovery of tags, or determination of sex, age, or length of the fish before releasing the fish back into the body of water, unless a permit authorizing this activity has been issued to that person by the department.

(b) No person may possess any live fish upon departure from any designated aquatic nuisance body of water, except during a department-permitted fishing tournament. During a department-permitted fishing tournament, any individual may possess live fish upon departure from designated aquatic nuisance waters along the most direct route to the weigh-in site if the individual possesses a department authorization certificate as a par-



ticipant in the tournament. Designated aquatic nuisance waters shall be those specified in the department's "Kansas designated aquatic nuisance waters tables," dated July 24, 2014, which is hereby adopted by reference.

(c) Each person who purchases live baitfish from a commercial bait dealer shall possess the receipt while fishing with the live baitfish.

(d) No person may fish or collect bait within a fish passage, fish ladder, fish steps, or fishway. "Fish passage, fish ladder, fish steps, or fishway" shall mean a structure that facilitates the natural migration of fish upstream on, through, or around an artificial barrier or dam.
