Kellogg, Wichita, Kansas, if that existing new motor vehicle dealer has a franchise agreement for the same line-make vehicle as that which is to be sold or offered for sale by Chrysler Group LLC, at 7675 E. Kellogg Drive, Wichita, Kansas, and provided that the existing new motor vehicle dealer is physically located such that its relevant market area, as defined in K.S.A. 8-2430(e), includes the location where the new Alfa Romeo dealership will be located.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 8-2430(a), any petition or complaint by any dealer with standing to protest must be filed with the director of the Division of Vehicles within 30 days of this notice. ## Opinion No. 2015-03

Written February 18, 2015, to Rep. John Wilson, Lawrence.

**Synopsis:** State owned equipment, including computers, may be used by incumbents and their staff for accessing cloud or web based services that may also be used for campaign purposes so long as the use does not expressly advocate for the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate or solicit or accept campaign contributions during legislative session.

Cited herein: K.S.A. 25-4143(h), 25-4153a(b) and 25-4169a.

Dear Rep. Wilson,

In response to your January 14, 2015, email request, this opinion is provided by the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission (commission), concerning application of the Campaign Finance Act, K.S.A. 25-4119e, et seq. The commission's jurisdiction is limited to applicability of this law. This opinion, provided pursuant to K.S.A. 25-4159, does not address whether some other statutory system, common law theory, or agency rule or regulation applies to your inquiry.

**Factual Statement**

We understand that you request this opinion in your capacity as a Kansas legislator. In support of your inquiry, you've provided the following information:

- Legislative Administrative Services and IT DO NOT provide any software for managing constituent contact beyond Microsoft Outlook, which is essentially just email, calendar and an address book.
- Most modern companies and offices utilize what is known as a Customer Relationship Management system (CRM). Examples include Salesforce and SugarCRM.
- I have been using a system called NationBuilder to manage contact with my constituents, as well as to manage and host my campaign website ([www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com](http://www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com)).
- NationBuilder is cloud-based, meaning it's not software I install. It can be accessed from any computer or device. **I pay for it using campaign funds.**
- NationBuilder has the capability to send e-newsletters, process donations, integrate with social media, host petitions, host surveys, and host a website. It also contains the entire voter file for my district. It's a "one-stop shop" for both campaign and constituent service management.
- Whether it's for political purposes or legislative updates, people sign-up for my newsletter on [www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com](http://www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com) and their name and contact information is added to my database.
- When people contact me about issues, whether during the campaign or during session, I record their concerns and interests (i.e. I care about the environment) using my NationBuilder database.
- The only way to access the "control panel" and functionality of NationBuilder is to access it by logging

into my website at [www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com](http://www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com). Meaning if I want to send a newsletter or add a constituent's name/email to my database, I MUST do it by logging into my website, which is also used for campaign purposes when not in session.

- I also accept donations on this website—there is a donate button.
- VoteBuilder is a tool used by the Democratic Party to manage information about voters. While used during campaign season, it's not exclusively a political tool. It's used to manage information about voters, including their interest in various issues.
- **Potential Scenarios for Using NationBuilder in my Legislative Office.** If I want to send an auto-response to a constituent who emails my legislative email, I might include a link to [www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com](http://www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com) to have them sign-up for my legislative newsletter.
- As constituents contact me, I would like my office assistant to record their contact info and issues/concerns in NationBuilder. She would be using her State of Kansas computer for this.
- If I want to track social media interactions during the legislative session, I may need to access my website which is the same site that is used during the campaign. I would like to be able to do this from my State of Kansas computer, which is how I access my legislative email, address book, etc.
- I will provide weekly updates via a blog that is hosted on my website ([www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com](http://www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com)). I would promote the blog in email correspondence with constituents who contact me at my Legislative email on my State of Kansas Computer.
- I may host petitions and surveys asking for feedback or support on key policy issues—those petitions and surveys would be housed on my website, which is powered by NationBuilder. I would promote the petitions and surveys in email correspondence with constituents who contact me at my Legislative email on my State of Kansas Computer.
- It should be noted that at no time would I ever be campaigning or conducting political activity while using a State Computer or Email, but I would simply be accessing a website and cloud-based software that serves dual purposes—Legislative Constituent services and campaign activities while not in session.

**Questions**

**1. Can my office assistant, intern and I use our State of Kansas Computers to access [www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com](http://www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com)?**

a. I've been told that because the URL of my site doesn't advocate for a specific position, like "John Wilson for State Rep", that it's okay.

**2. Can my office assistant, intern and I use our State of Kansas Computers and Legislative email to promote [www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com](http://www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com) for the purposes of signing up for e-newsletters, promoting a Legislative Updates blog and videos, promoting policy-related surveys and petitions, managing constituent contact records, and managing social media interactions?** For ex-

ample, when responding to a constituent I might say, "Thanks for your concern about the environment. I strongly support XYZ. If you would like to follow my work in the capitol and receive updates about environmental issues, visit [www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com/environment](http://www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com/environment)."

**3. Can my office assistant, intern and I use our State of Kansas Computers and email to access [www.votebuilder.com](http://www.votebuilder.com) for the purposes of managing constituent interactions, identifying whether a person lives in my district, and tracking their interests in issues?** For example, I might ask my office assistant to look up "Paul Davis" in VoteBuilder to determine if he is a constituent—or to help Paul know who his Senator or Board of Education Member is.

**4. Can my office assistant, intern and I use our State of Kansas Computers and email to access social media accounts that are also used during campaign season (@wilsonforkansas and facebook.com/johnwilsonforkansas)?** This would include using a state computer to Tweet or post to social media accounts. None of these interactions would promote a candidate or otherwise be "campaigning". It would be similar to Legislative updates.

**5. Can I add the names and email address of constituents who contact me through my Legislative email to my NationBuilder Database, which also is used during campaign season for political activity?** For example, if someone emails me asking that I support KPERS, I would add their name, phone and email to NationBuilder and "tag" them with a "KPERS" tag so that I can follow-up with them at the appropriate time on future KPERS actions/bills. Reminder that I pay for NationBuilder using campaign funds, not state of Kansas Funds.

### Analysis and Opinion

In Opinion 2007-11 we stated:

...K.S.A. 25-4169a prohibits the use of public funds, equipment or supplies to expressly advocate the election or defeat of any candidate as follows:

(a) No officer or employee of the state of Kansas . . . shall use or authorize the use of public funds or public vehicles, machinery, equipment or the time of any officer or employee of . . . such governmental agency . . . to expressly advocate the nomination, election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate to state or local office. . . .

The prohibitions of K.S.A. 25-4169a apply only to express advocacy. K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 25-4143(h) defines the phrase "expressly advocate the nomination, election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate" to mean:

any communication which uses phrases including, but not limited to: (1) "Vote for the secretary of state"; (2) "re-elect your senator"; (3) "support the democratic nominee"; (4) "cast your ballot for the republican challenger for governor"; (5) "smith for senate"; (6) "Bob Jones in 98"; (7) "vote against Old Hickory"; (8) "defeat" accompanied by a picture of one of more candidates; or (9) "Smith's the one."

The activities in the above factual statement track concerns and interests of constituents and aid an officeholder's responsiveness to constituents' positions and

needs. Such tracking may provide data useful to an officeholder for campaign purposes. Yet, as described, the activities are not express advocacy.

Under the last bullet in the factual statement above you indicate "that at no time would I ever be campaigning or conducting political activity while using a State Computer or Email." This self-imposed stricture encompasses express advocacy for or against specific candidates. Adherence to the stricture would prevent express advocacy, thus would prevent violation of K.S.A. 25-4169a(a) under the provided scenarios.

Wording of the URL "[www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com](http://www.JohnWilsonforKansas.com)" does not specifically advocate the nomination, election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate. However, if an URL would contain express advocacy language, its use in the types of scenarios raised in your questions would be express advocacy.

In Opinion 2007-11 we said:

It is our opinion that a website, email or postal address expressly advocates the nomination, election or defeat of a candidate if that address contains words meeting the definition of express advocacy pursuant to K.S.A. 2006 Supp. 25-4143(h). Therefore, including a campaign or personal website, email or postal address in a communication generated or distributed using public funds, machinery or equipment is a violation of the Campaign Finance Act if that address expressly advocates for or against a candidate. Official state or local office website, email or postal addresses issued and maintained by a state or local government would not be considered express advocacy.

Consequently emails and other communications sent from state owned equipment (computers) may not contain such website URLs. To comply, a differently worded hyperlink may substitute for the URL wording.

### Conclusion

In response to your questions, since the activities do not expressly advocate the election or defeat of a clearly identified candidate, we are of the opinion that you and your staff may:

1. access your website on state owned equipment (including computers);
2. reference your website through email for purposes of promoting e-newsletters, blogs, videos, policy-related surveys and petitions, and managing constituent contacts and social media interactions;
3. use state computers and email to access [www.votebuilder.com](http://www.votebuilder.com) to manage constituent interactions and identify and tract individuals districts and interests;
4. use state computers and email to access social media accounts used during "campaign season" except for solicitation or acceptance of campaign contributions during session from persons proscribed by K.S.A. 25-4153a(b);
5. add names and email addresses to NationBuilder of constituents who contact you through your state email for future campaign or constituent service purposes.

Article 1.—GENERAL

**40-1-28. Insurance holding companies; reporting forms and instructions.** The Kansas insurance department's "policy and procedure providing insurance holding company system reporting forms and instructions," dated December 10, 2014, is hereby adopted by reference.
