The Kansas Department of Health and Environment is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Abengoa Bioenergy Biomass of Kansas, LLC (ABBK), located at 16150 Main Circle Drive, Suite 200, Chesterfield, MO 63017, has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300 to append the permit previously issued by the KDHE on May 27, 2014, for a biomass-to-ethanol and a biomass-to-energy production facility located in Section 18, Township 33 South, Range 37 West, Stevens County, Kansas, near Hugoton, Kansas. The proposed permit will append the May 27, 2014, permit to install a 96.6 MMBtu/hr natural-gas-fired temporary rental boiler to support operations of the existing 500 MMBtu/hr biomass-fired stoker boiler until a permanent 99 MMBtu/hr natural gas-fired standby boiler, which is proposed to be installed through a separate modification of the May 27, 2014, permit, can be built.

Emissions of oxides of nitrogen (NO_x), sulfur dioxide (SO₂), carbon monoxide (CO), carbon dioxide equivalents (CO₂e), volatile organic compounds (VOCs), particulate matter (PM), PM less than or equal to 10 microns (PM₁₀), PM less than or equal to 2.5 microns (PM_{2.5}) and hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) were evaluated during the permit review process.

The proposed permit is to be issued in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-350, prevention of significant deterioration (PSD), which adopt the federal standards, procedures and requirements of 40 CFR 52.21 by reference. These air quality regulations apply to major stationary emission sources located in areas designated as "attainment" under the federal Clean Air Act (CAA). Attainment areas are areas where the air quality meets or is better than the National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS).

The PSD regulations require evaluation of emission reduction techniques to identify the best available control technology (BACT) for each regulated pollutant, including GHGs, for which the emission rate exceeds the PSD significant level. The purpose of BACT is to affect the maximum degree of reduction achievable, taking into account energy, environmental and economic impacts for each regulated pollutant under review. Evaluation of the estimated emissions for the ABBK project indicates that the emission rates of NO_x, CO, SO₂, VOCs, PM, PM₁₀, PM_{2.5} and CO₂e all exceed the significance levels. The fa-

cility conducted the required BACT analyses. This permit required a BACT review for the temporary rental natural gas-fired boiler. The KDHE has reviewed the BACT analyses submitted by ABBK for the project and concurs with its findings. The BACT analysis and findings are summarized in Section IX of the Permit Summary Sheet.

An ambient impact analysis was not required. 40 CFR 52.21 (i)(3) states that the requirements for dispersion modeling shall not apply to PSD permits if emissions would impact no Class I area and no area where an applicable increment is known to be violated, and would be temporary. The proposed rental boiler meets these criteria; therefore, dispersion modeling was not required. No increase in increment consumption will result from the temporary rental boiler operations.

The federal land manager of any adversely impacted federal Class I area has the opportunity to provide the secretary of health and environment with a demonstration that the emissions from the proposed source will have an adverse impact on air quality-related values in the federal Class I area.

A public comment period has been established until noon September 28, 2015, to allow citizens the opportunity to express any concerns they may have about this proposed permitting action. The Kansas Department of Health and Environment, Division of Environment, Bureau of Waste Management, will conduct a public hearing at 1:30 p.m. Monday, September 28, in Room 530, Curtis State Office Building, 1000 S.W. Jackson, Topeka, to consider the adoption of the proposed State of Kansas Coal Combustion Residuals Part 256 Plan.

On April 17, 2015, the EPA published recently adopted regulations in 40 CFR Parts 257 and 261 related to the "Disposal of Coal Combustion Residuals from Electric Utilities" (the CCR rule). The proposed plan demonstrates KDHE's intent and approach to assess compliance with and enforce the CCR rule in Kansas. This plan also addresses the original requirements of Part 256 solid waste management plans by explaining how existing state laws and regulations have accomplished the 35-year-old goals required in those plans. This plan cites existing KDHE laws, regulations and permit conditions that authorize KDHE to assess compliance and enforcement related to all aspects of the CCR rule. In addition, it explains the state's intention to adopt the specific CCR regulations by reference over the next 12 to 18 months to more directly address all requirements.
