**State of Kansas****Department of Wildlife, Parks and Tourism****Permanent Administrative Regulation****Article 11.—CONTROLLED SHOOTING AREAS**

**115-11-2. Controlled shooting areas; operational requirements.** (a) Each controlled shooting area shall be posted as follows:

(1) Signs shall be made of metal, plastic, or wood and shall be not less than 15 inches by 15 inches.

(2) Signs shall legibly display the words "controlled shooting area" in block lettering that is not less than two inches in height.

(3) Signs shall be placed along the boundary of the controlled shooting area, at intervals of not more than 500 feet.

(b) The licensee shall keep the license and a copy of the laws and regulations pertaining to the controlled shooting areas posted in a conspicuous and readily available place at the headquarters of the area.

(c) If the license of the controlled shooting area is cancelled or revoked, the licensee shall remove all controlled shooting area signs from the boundary of the area within 30 days of the cancellation or revocation date.

(d) If a licensee fails to renew a controlled shooting area license, all controlled shooting area signs shall be removed from the boundary of the area before September 1.

(e) Only those game birds released on the controlled shooting area from August 15 through April 30 of the license period shall be credited toward the allowable take for the area.

(f) The licensee shall not take or permit the taking of more than 100 percent of the number of each species of game bird released on the controlled shooting area. These game bird species shall not be hunted on the area until a release of the game bird species has been made.

(g) The shooting hours for the taking of game birds released on controlled shooting areas shall be from ½ hour before sunrise to sunset.

(h) Game birds taken on a controlled shooting area shall be accompanied during transportation from the area by a form provided by the department and completed by the licensee, which shall include the number and species of game birds being transported, the name and license number of the licensee, the date of harvest, and any other relevant information required by the secretary.

(i) Except as authorized under Kansas dog training and field trial regulations, only hand-reared mallard ducks may be recaptured by trapping after release.

(j) Hunting during the established seasons and in compliance with all laws and regulations governing the hunting activity may occur on a controlled shooting area for wildlife species not included in K.S.A. 32-943, and amendments thereto, and for any wildlife species not included in the license issued for that controlled shooting area, including big game animals and wild turkeys for which the hunter has a valid permit issued by the department. The hunting, shooting, or taking of wild migratory waterfowl, however, shall be prohibited on each

controlled shooting area used for the shooting of hand-reared mallard ducks.

This regulation shall be effective on and after March 1, 2019. #### Permanent Administrative Regulations

#### Article 46.—CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT

**30-46-10. Definitions.** For the purpose of the child abuse and neglect central registry, the following definitions shall apply:

(a) "Abandon" and "abandonment" have the meaning specified in K.S.A. 38-2202, and amendments thereto.

(b) "Abuse" means "physical, mental or emotional abuse" or "sexual abuse," as these two terms are defined in K.S.A. 38-2202 and amendments thereto and as "sexual abuse" is further defined in this regulation, involving a child who resides in Kansas or is found in Kansas, regardless of where the act occurred. The term "abuse" shall include any act that occurred in Kansas, regardless of where the child is found or resides.

The term "abuse" may include the following:

(1) Terrorizing a child, by creating a climate of fear or engaging in violent or threatening behavior toward the child or toward others in the child's presence that demonstrates a flagrant disregard for the child;

(2) emotionally abandoning a child, by being psychologically unavailable to the child, demonstrating no attachment to the child, or failing to provide adequate nurturance of the child; and

(3) corrupting a child, by teaching or rewarding the child for unlawful, antisocial, or sexually mature behavior.

(c) "Affirmed perpetrator" means a person who has been determined by the secretary or the secretary's designee, by a preponderance of evidence, to have committed an act of abuse or neglect, regardless of where the person resides, but has not been substantiated so the affirmed perpetrator's name is not placed on the child abuse and neglect central registry.

(d) "Alleged perpetrator" means the person identified in the initial report or during the investigation as the person suspected of perpetrating an act of abuse or neglect.

(e) "Child" means anyone under the age of 18 or anyone under the age of 21 and in the custody of the secretary pursuant to K.S.A. 38-2255, and amendments thereto.

(f) "Child abuse and neglect central registry" means the list of names for individuals identified by the department as substantiated perpetrators.

(g) "Child care facility" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 65-503, and amendments thereto.

(h) "Department" means Kansas department for children and families.

(i) "Investigation" means the gathering and assessing of information to determine if a child has been harmed, as defined in K.S.A. 38-2202 and amendments thereto, as the result of abuse or neglect, to identify the individual or individuals responsible, and to determine if the incident perpetrated by the individual or individuals should be affirmed or substantiated.

(j) "Neglect" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 38-2202, and amendments thereto, involving a child who resides in Kansas or is found in Kansas, regardless of where the act or failure to act occurred.

The term "neglect" may include the following:

The birth of an infant who is identified as being affected by or having withdrawal symptoms resulting from prenatal exposure to a legal or an illegal substance; and

(2) failure of the parent or caregiver to meet that individual's responsibilities to provide for the child's education as required by law.

(k) "Sexual abuse" has the meaning specified in K.S.A. 38-2202, and amendments thereto. With respect to the determination by the department for children and families of an affirmed or substantiated finding of sexual abuse, difference in age and maturity between the perpetrator and victim and issues of force or coercion may be considered.

(l) "Substantiated perpetrator" and "perpetrator" mean a person, regardless of where the person resides, who has been substantiated by the secretary or the secretary's designee, by a preponderance of evidence, to have either intentionally committed an act of abuse or neglect or failed or refused to protect a child when a reasonable person would have anticipated that the act of abuse or neglect would result in or create a likelihood of serious harm, injury, or deterioration to the child. The substantiated perpetrator's name is placed on the Kansas child abuse and neglect central registry, and the person is thereby prohibited from residing, working, or volunteering in a child care facility pursuant to K.S.A. 65-516, and amendments thereto.

(m) "Unsubstantiated alleged perpetrator" means a person who has been determined by the secretary or the secretary's designee, by a preponderance of evidence, to have not committed an alleged act of abuse or neglect. **30-46-13. Right to interview.** Each alleged perpetrator shall have an opportunity to be interviewed before a finding affirming or substantiating the perpetrator under K.A.R. 30-46-15 is issued. **30-46-15. Notice of decision.** (a) Each affirmed perpetrator shall be notified in writing of the secretary's decision to affirm the perpetrator for an incident of child abuse or neglect. The notice shall specify the reasons for the finding and shall inform the affirmed perpetrator of the perpetrator's right to appeal the decision.

(b) Each substantiated perpetrator shall be notified in writing of the secretary's decision to substantiate the perpetrator for the purpose of placing the name of the perpetrator in the child abuse and neglect central registry. The notice shall specify the reasons for the finding and shall inform the substantiated perpetrator of the perpetrator's right to appeal the decision.

(c) Each unsubstantiated alleged perpetrator shall be notified in writing of the secretary's decision that based on a preponderance of evidence, the alleged perpetrator has not committed an alleged act of abuse or neglect. **30-46-17. Expungement of record of perpetrator from child abuse and neglect central registry.** (a) Application for expungement.

(1) Any perpetrator of abuse or neglect may apply in writing to the secretary to have the perpetrator's record expunged from the child abuse and neglect central registry when three years have passed since the perpetrator's name was entered on the child abuse and neglect central registry. Thereafter, if the expungement is denied, an application for expungement may be submitted by the perpetrator to the secretary no more than once every 12 months after the date of the most recent expungement review panel hearing.

(2) Each application for expungement shall be referred to the expungement review panel.

The panel shall consist of the director of prevention and protection services or the director's designee, the chief legal counsel of the department or the counsel's designee, and a representative of the public appointed by the secretary. The director of prevention and protection services or the director's designee shall chair the panel.

(b) Expungement review panel hearing.

(1) A review hearing shall be convened by the panel, at which time the applicant may present evidence supporting expungement of the applicant's name from the child abuse and neglect central registry. The applicant shall have the burden of providing the panel with the basis for granting the expungement. Evidence in support of or in opposition to the application and a recommendation may be presented by the regional office that conducted the original investigation.

(2) Recommendations of the review panel shall be determined by majority vote. The following factors shall be considered by the panel in making its recommendation:

(A) The nature and severity of the act of abuse or neglect;

(B) the number of findings of abuse or neglect involving the applicant;

(C) specification of whether the applicant was a child

at the time of the finding of abuse or neglect for which expungement is requested and the age of the applicant at the time of the incident;

(D) circumstances that no longer exist that contributed to the finding of abuse or neglect by the applicant; and

(E) actions taken by the applicant since the incident to prevent the reoccurrence of abuse or neglect.

(3) The review hearing shall be set within 30 days from the date the application for expungement is received by the department. A written notice shall be sent to the applicant and the regional office that made the finding by the director of prevention and protection services or the director's designee at least 10 days before the hearing. The notice shall state the day, hour, and place of the hearing. Continuances of the hearing may be granted by the secretary or the secretary's designee only for good cause.

(4) A written recommendation to the secretary shall be rendered by the panel within 45 days from the date of the hearing. The recommendation to the secretary shall be submitted in writing and shall specify the reasons for the recommendation.

(c) Expungement.

(1) Based upon the application for expungement, other records in the expungement file, and the findings and recommendations of the panel, a decision to grant or deny the requested expungement shall be made by the secretary and shall be the final agency order. The secretary's decision shall be made with 60 days of the expungement hearing.

(2) The applicant shall be informed in writing of the secretary's decision, the specific reasons for the decision, and the applicant's right to appeal that decision pursuant to the Kansas judicial review act.

(3) Any record may be expunged from the child abuse and neglect central registry by the secretary or the secretary's designee when 18 or more years have passed since the most recent finding of abuse or neglect.

(4) Each record of a perpetrator who was under 18 at the time of abuse or neglect and has not been substantiated for more than a single event or incident while a minor shall be expunged five years after the finding of abuse or neglect is entered in the child abuse and neglect central registry if the perpetrator has had none of the following after entry in the registry:

(A) A finding of abuse or neglect;

(B) juvenile offender adjudication for any act, other than the event or incident that resulted in the offender's name being placed on the child abuse and neglect central registry, that, if committed by an adult, would be a class A person misdemeanor or any person felony; or

(C) criminal conviction for a class A person misdemeanor or any person felony. Article 35.—RADIATION

28-35-146a. Determination of hourly rate and full cost; fee payments. (a) Hourly rate. If the department charges a fee to provide the following and there is no established fee category in K.A.R. 28-35-147a, the hourly rate charged shall be \$79.00:

(1) Any radiation protection service that the department provides to a nonlicensee or nonregistrant; and

(2) any radiation control program activity.

(b) Full cost. For each full-cost category specified in K.A.R. 28-35-147a(d)(1), the initial application fee, annual fee, and amendment fees shall be paid in accordance with the following requirements:

(1) Each applicant shall pay a nonrefundable initial application fee of \$500,000 to cover the actual costs incurred by the department to review the initial license application.

(A) If the initial application fee exceeds the actual cost of reviewing the initial application, the overage shall be credited to the annual fee for the following fiscal year.

(B) If the initial application fee is less than the actual cost of reviewing the initial application, the difference shall be due within 30 days of receipt of written notification from the secretary. No license shall be issued until all required fees are paid in full.

(2) Each licensee shall pay a nonrefundable annual fee to cover the actual cost incurred by the department to service the license and any amendments to the license.

(A) If the annual fee exceeds the actual cost of servicing the license and any amendments, the overage shall be credited to the annual fee for the following fiscal year.

(B) If the annual fee paid for any fiscal year is less than the actual cost to the department, the difference shall be due within 30 days of receipt of written notification from the secretary.

(c) Fee payments. Each fee payment specified in subsection (b) shall be made in accordance with the following requirements:

(1) Each initial application for which a license fee is required shall be accompanied by the full amount of the fee. Any application for which a fee is not received may be returned to the applicant.

(2) On or before June 1 of the fiscal year preceding the fiscal year for which the annual fee applies, the licensee shall be notified by the secretary of the amount of the annual fee.

(3) Each fee payment shall be submitted within 30 days of receipt of written notification from the secretary of the annual fee or by July 1, whichever date is earlier.

(4) Each fee payment shall be made by check, draft, money order, or electronic fund transfer payable to the department. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 48-1606; effective Oct. 8, 2004; amended Feb. 22, 2019.)

28-35-147a. Schedule of fees. Each fee for an initial license application or initial registration shall be equal to the sum of the annual fees for all applicable categories.

Each annual fee for a license or registration shall be equal to the sum of the annual fees for all applicable categories. The following fees shall be paid as specified in K.A.R. 28-35-145 and 28-35-146:

(a) Special nuclear material.

(1) Licenses for possession and use of special nuclear material in sealed sources contained in devices used in industrial measuring systems.

(2) Any licenses not otherwise specified in this regulation for possession and use of special nuclear material, except licenses authorizing special nuclear material in unsealed form in combination that would constitute a critical mass.

Annual fee ..... \$2,250.00

(b) Source material.

(1) Licenses that authorize only the possession, use, or installation of source material for shielding.

Annual fee ..... \$365.00

(2) All other source material licenses not otherwise specified in this regulation.

Annual fee ..... \$5,700.00

(c) Radioactive material or by-product material.

(1) Licenses of broad scope for possession and use of radioactive material or by-product material issued for processing or manufacturing items containing radioactive material or by-product material for commercial distribution.

Annual fee ..... \$10,900.00

(2) Other licenses for possession and use of radioactive material or by-product material issued for processing or manufacturing items containing radioactive material or by-product material for commercial distribution.

Annual fee ..... \$3,300.00

(3) Licenses authorizing the processing or manufacturing and the distribution or redistribution of radiopharmaceuticals, generators, reagent kits, sources, or devices containing radioactive material or by-product material. This category shall include the possession and use of source material for shielding when included on the same license.

Annual fee ..... \$5,450.00

(4) Licenses and approvals authorizing distribution or redistribution of radiopharmaceuticals, generators, reagent kits, sources, or devices not involving processing of radioactive material or by-product material. This category shall include the possession and use of source material for shielding when included on the same license.

Annual fee ..... \$2,350.00

(5) Licenses for possession and use of radioactive material or by-product material in sealed sources for irradiation of items in self-shielded units in which the source is not removed from its shield.

Annual fee ..... \$1,800.00

(6) Licenses for possession and use of less than 10,000 curies of radioactive material or by-product material in sealed sources for irradiation of items in which the source is exposed for irradiation purposes. This category shall include underwater irradiators for irradiation of items in which the source is not exposed for irradiation purposes.

Annual fee ..... \$3,300.00

(7) Licenses for possession and use of 10,000 curies or more of radioactive material or by-product material in

sealed sources for irradiation of items in which the source is exposed for irradiation purposes. This category shall include underwater irradiators for irradiation of items in which the source is not exposed for irradiation purposes.

Annual fee ..... \$12,050.00

(8) Licenses issued to distribute items containing radioactive material or by-product material that require device review to persons exempt from licensing, except specific licenses authorizing redistribution of items that have been authorized for distribution to persons exempt from licensing.

Annual fee ..... \$3,000.00

(9) Licenses issued to distribute items containing radioactive material or by-product material or quantities of radioactive material or by-product material that do not require device review to persons exempt from licensing, except for specific licenses authorizing redistribution of items that have been authorized for distribution to persons exempt from licensing.

Annual fee ..... \$3,050.00

(10) Licenses issued to distribute items containing radioactive material or by-product material that require a safety review of the sealed source or device to any person with a general license, except specific licenses authorizing redistribution of items that have been authorized for distribution to any person with a general license.

Annual fee ..... \$1,100.00

(11) Licenses issued to distribute items containing radioactive material or by-product material or quantities of radioactive material or by-product material that do not require a safety review of the sealed source or device to any person with a general license, except specific licenses authorizing redistribution of items that have been authorized for distribution to any person with a general license.

Annual fee ..... \$700.00

(12) Licenses of broad scope for possession and use of radioactive material or by-product material issued for research and development that do not authorize commercial distribution.

Annual fee ..... \$5,900.00

(13) Other licenses for possession and use of radioactive material or by-product material issued for research and development that do not authorize commercial distribution.

Annual fee ..... \$2,800.00

(14) Licenses that authorize services for other licensees, except the following:

(A) Licenses that authorize only calibration or leak-testing services, or both, shall be subject to the fee specified in paragraph (c)(16).

(B) Licenses that authorize waste disposal services shall be subject to the applicable fees specified in subsection (d).

Annual fee ..... \$3,050.00

(15) Licenses for possession and use of radioactive material or by-product material for industrial radiography. This category shall include the possession and use of source material for shielding when authorized on the same license.

Annual fee ..... \$6,100.00

(16) All other specific radioactive material or by-product material licenses not otherwise specified in this regulation.

Annual fee ..... \$1,250.00

(17) Registration of general licenses for devices or sources.  
Annual fee ..... \$225.00

(d) Waste disposal and processing.

(1) Licenses authorizing the possession and use of radioactive material, including by-product material, source material, and special nuclear material, for a commercial, low-level radioactive waste disposal facility.

Annual fee ..... full cost,  
as specified in K.A.R. 28-35-146a

(A) Amendment to license concerning safety and environmental issues.

Amendment fee ..... full cost,  
as specified in K.A.R. 28-35-146a

(B) Amendment to license concerning administrative questions with no safety or environmental issues.

Amendment fee ..... full cost,  
as specified in K.A.R. 28-35-146a

(2) Licenses specifically authorizing the receipt of radioactive material, including by-product material, source material, and special nuclear material, from other persons for the purpose of packaging or repackaging the radioactive material. The licensee shall dispose of the radioactive material by transfer to another person authorized to receive or dispose of the radioactive material.

Annual fee ..... \$5,150.00

(3) Licenses specifically authorizing the receipt of pre-packaged radioactive material, including by-product material, source material, and special nuclear material, from other persons. The licensee shall dispose of the radioactive material by transfer to another person authorized to receive or dispose of the radioactive material.

Annual fee ..... \$3,700.00

(e) Well logging.

(1) Licenses for possession and use of radioactive material or by-product material, source material, or special nuclear material for well logging, well surveys, and tracer studies other than field flooding tracer studies.

Annual fee ..... \$2,350.00

(2) Licenses for possession and use of radioactive material or by-product material for field flooding tracer studies.

Annual fee ..... \$2,350.00

(f) Nuclear laundries.

Licenses for commercial collection and laundry of items contaminated with radioactive material or by-product material, source material, or special nuclear material.

Annual fee ..... \$11,550.00

(g) Medical licenses.

(1) Licenses issued for human use of radioactive material or by-product material, source material, or special nuclear material in sealed sources contained in teletherapy devices. This category shall include the possession and use of source material for shielding when authorized on the same license.

Annual fee ..... \$5,500.00

(2) Licenses of broad scope issued to medical institutions or two or more physicians authorizing research and development, including human use of radioactive material or by-product material, except licenses for radioactive material or by-product material, source material, or special nuclear material in sealed sources contained in teletherapy devices. This category shall include the pos-

session and use of source material for shielding when authorized on the same license. Separate annual fees shall not be assessed for pacemaker licenses issued to medical institutions that also hold nuclear medicine licenses under categories in this paragraph or paragraph (g)(3).

Annual fee ..... \$12,350.00

(3) Other licenses issued for human use of radioactive material or by-product material, source material, or special nuclear material, except licenses for radioactive material or by-product material, source material, or special nuclear material in sealed sources contained in teletherapy devices. This category shall include the possession and use of source material for shielding when authorized on the same license. Separate annual fees shall not be assessed for pacemaker licenses issued to medical institutions that also hold nuclear medicine licenses under categories in this paragraph or paragraph (g)(2).

(h) Civil defense.

Licenses for possession and use of radioactive material or by-product material, source material, or special nuclear material for civil defense activities.

Annual fee ..... \$650.00

(i) Device, product, or sealed source safety evaluation.

(1) Safety evaluation review of each device or product containing radioactive material or by-product material, source material, or special nuclear material, except any reactor fuel device, for commercial distribution. This fee shall apply to each device or product.

Fee ..... \$3,500.00

(2) Safety evaluation review of each device or product containing radioactive material or by-product material, source material, or special nuclear material manufactured in accordance with the unique specifications of, and for use by, a single applicant, except any reactor fuel device. This fee shall apply to each device or product.

Fee ..... \$3,500.00

(3) Safety evaluation of each sealed source containing radioactive material or by-product material, source material, or special nuclear material, except reactor fuel, for commercial distribution. This fee shall apply to each sealed source.

Fee ..... \$1,100.00

(4) Safety evaluation of each sealed source containing radioactive material or by-product material, source material, or special nuclear material manufactured in accordance with the unique specifications of, and for use by, a single applicant. This fee shall apply to each sealed source.

Fee ..... \$365.00

(j) Reciprocity.

(1) Licensees who conduct activities under a reciprocal agreement.

Annual fee ..... \$750.00

(2) Registrants who conduct activities under a reciprocal agreement.

Annual fee ..... \$200.00

(k) X-ray machines.

(1) Base registration fee per facility.

Annual fee ..... \$200.00

(2) Registration fee for each x-ray tube at a facility. This fee shall be in addition to the base registration fee.

Annual fee per x-ray tube ..... \$50.00

(l) Particle accelerators.

Annual fee ..... \$300.00

(m) Noncontiguous sites.

(1) An additional annual fee of 50 percent of the annual fee specified in this regulation shall be assessed for each noncontiguous site where radioactive material is stored or used under the same license, per category.

(2) "Noncontiguous site" shall have the meaning specified in K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 48-1606, and amendments thereto. (Authorized by and implementing K.S.A. 2018 Supp. 48-1606; effective Oct. 8, 2004; amended March 29, 2013; amended Feb. 22, 2019.)
