The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is seeking the services of a consulting engineering firm for the KDOT project listed below. **Project Description**

U.S. 24 in Graham County. Antelope Creek Drainage bridge #002, located 3.56 miles east of the Graham/Sheridan County Line (24-33 KA-3930-01), South Fork Solomon River Drainage bridge #005, located 3.47 miles east of K-85 (24-33 KA-3960-01), and South Fork Solomon River Drainage bridge #006, located 4.79 miles east of K-85 (24-33 KA-3961-01).

The above three projects include bridge replacement, grading and surfacing and will be designed under one contract. These projects have undergone some preliminary design. Project milestones include Plans to Materials and Research (January 2019, have not been submitted), Field Check (October 2019), and Plans complete (May 2021).

Based on the qualifications submitted in the Letter of Interest and other information available to KDOT, on or about March 14, 2019, KDOT will shortlist not less than three nor more than five firms and notify all firms submitting Letters of Interest of the names of the shortlisted firms by return email. Thereafter, KDOT will issue a Request for Proposal (RFP) to the shortlisted firms soliciting a technical proposal. At KDOT's option, shortlisted firms may be interviewed by telephone conference call or asked to attend meetings or participate in other discussions with KDOT. Technical proposals will be evaluated on the basis of the following factors,

evenly weighted, to rank the most qualified firm in order of preference as first, second, and third, etc. Evaluation factors: 1) the quality of the response to the RFP; 2) qualifications and experience of consultant personnel proposed for services; 3) proposed approach to performance of services; and 4) past performance history. The Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) is seeking a consultant to provide Construction Inspection Services for Project 166-63 KA-3906-01. The Project is located on U.S. 166 in Montgomery County, 1.99 Miles East of the Chautauqua County Line.

**Schedule/Deadlines**

Letters of Interest (LOIs) are due on or before 12:00 p.m. (CST) March 15, 2019, to be delivered via email to James.Richardson@ks.gov. Evaluation and ranking of submissions will occur on or about March 20, 2019, after which time all firms that submitted will be notified of the ranking. Negotiations with the most highly ranked firm will commence immediately after the notifications. The contractor should start on the project sometime around March to July 2019.

**Scope of Services to be Performed**

KDOT will provide the project manager. The primary inspector provided is expected to work with and mentor the new KDOT project manager. They will assist with staffing needs to cover all construction operations. The inspector(s) must be capable and possess the required certifications to inspect any work on the project, which includes grading, AS-1 shoulders, concrete work, traffic control, HMA Paving/HMA Plant operations, PCCP Paving/Plant, RC Boxes, Bridges, Pipes, Subgrade, Base, Signing, Seeding, Erosion Control, Fencing, Pavement Marking, Lighting, and Final paperwork, etc. Anticipated staffing needs: Provide one project inspector full time during construction seasons. There may be additional inspectors needed, estimated at two, that will fluctuate throughout the project depending on the project needs. Provide all inspectors as needed to ensure inspection and material testing for this project are done correctly. for the HMA plant and concrete testing equipment. Construction is anticipated to be completed in 205 working days, this is expected to span both the 2019 and 2020 construction season. There may not be a need for inspection over the 2019-2020 winter.

6. Computer, nuclear gauge, and mentoring experience in assisting a new engineer for KDOT.

### Governmental Ethics Opinion

#### Opinion No. 2019-01

Written February 27, 2019.

**Synopsis:** Senate Bill No. 394 (2018) changes to the definition of lobbying may confuse attorneys' representation of clients with issues before state administrative agencies and lobbying. Notwithstanding the statutory changes, the interpretation by the Commission remains unchanged.

Cited herein: K.S.A. 46-222, 46-225.

To All Interested Persons,

Pursuant to K.S.A. 46-254, the Kansas Governmental Ethics Commission issues this opinion regarding lobbying laws and attorney practice on behalf of clients before governmental agencies.

#### Issue

Do the recent changes to the K.S.A. 46-225 definition of lobbying make representation of clients before state agencies lobbying?



**Analysis and Opinion**

The legislature recently amended K.S.A. 46-225 adding the following subparagraphs to the definition of lobbying:

(a)(2) promoting or opposing in any manner an action or nonaction by any executive agency on any executive administrative matter;

(a)(3) promoting or opposing in any manner an action by any judicial agency on any judicial administrative manner[.]

Standing alone, these changes make it seem that lobbying includes representation cases by attorneys practicing before state agencies. However, along with these changes, another change to the same statute adds new subparagraph (g)(2) to the same statute and it specifically excludes attorneys representing clients from the definition of lobbying

(g) "Lobbying" does not include:

...

(2) communications by an attorney representing a client involving ongoing legal work with respect to an executive administrative matter or judicial administrative matter, or an administrative proceeding or hearing and negotiations conducted by and with attorneys for executive agencies or judicial agencies, or interactions between parties in litigation or other contested matters, and testimony by a witness in administrative hearings or communications to or by investigators or authorities in the course of any investigation.

Consequently, attorneys representing clients before government entities are not lobbyists and need not register as a lobbyist.

Similarly, attorneys working in-house for organizations do not need to register as a lobbyist for the organization, so long as the attorney is not employed in a considerable degree for lobbying, is not formally appointed by their organization as a lobbyist and does not make expenditures of \$1,000 or more for lobbying. Pursuant to K.S.A. 46-222, such occasional lobbying does not necessitate registration as a lobbyist.

In closing, the Commission suggests that registered lobbyists may seek further guidance from Commission staff regarding services that constitute lobbying, pursuant to K.S.A.46-225.

K.A.R. 68-11-1 and 68-11-2 are being amended to increase application and renewal fees for pharmacists, pharmacies, and other facilities registered by the Board. In response to legislative requests in 2014 related to excess Board fee funds, the Board lowered fees by 20% for all application and renewal license types. In addition, the legislature swept \$800,000 from the Board fee fund to the state general fund after fees were lowered in 2014, depleting the

fee fund balance even more. These increases are within existing statutory caps, allow fees to remain competitive with other state boards of pharmacy, and are necessary to maintain a positive fee fund balance in FY 2020 and beyond. Based on the increases, which range from 25-46% for most licensure categories, the Board anticipates generating \$342,630 of additional revenue per year. For more details, please review the complete economic impact statement.

**Article 9.—MEDICAL AND HOSPITAL**

**51-9-7. Fees for medical and hospital services.** Fees for medical, surgical, hospital, dental, and nursing services, medical equipment, medical supplies, prescriptions, medical records, and medical testimony rendered pursuant to the Kansas workers compensation act shall be the lesser of the following:

(a) The usual and customary charge of the health care provider, hospital, or other entity providing the health care services; or

(b) the amount allowed by the “2019 schedule of medical fees” published by the Kansas department of labor, effective on March 29, 2019, and approved by the director of workers compensation on November 21, 2018, including the ground rules for each type of medical treatment or service within the schedule and the appendix, which is hereby adopted by reference.
