How do I get an advance by mail ballot?



Ballots are sent to voters who request one by completing an advance by mail ballot application.

Contact your local election office to have an application sent to you. Applications are also available for download at sos.ks.gov/elections/elections.html.

Do I have to sign or provide ID to get an advance by mail ballot?



State law requires a signature on advance mail ballot applications so county election offices can verify voter signatures match their voter registration records.

State law also requires voters provide their government issued ID number on the advance mail ballot application. You can also include a copy of your ID with your application.

Can someone request an advance by mail ballot using my name and address?



No. Local election officials verify the signature on the advance ballot application match the signature on voter registration records.

Once the ballot is returned to your local election office, staff will compare the signature on the envelop containing the ballot to make sure it matches the signature on file.

How do I return my advance by mail ballot?



You can return your advance mail ballot by delivering it to your local election office, sending it in the mail, dropping it in a secure election drop box, or at any polling location in your county on election day.

Is there a way to make sure my ballot is returned to the local election office?



The best way to ensure your ballot is returned to the local election office is to hand deliver it or place it in a secure election drop box.
