
## VOTER REGISTRATION INFORMATION

When you receive public assistance, you must be offered the opportunity to register to vote. You are **not** required to vote to receive assistance from the State of Kansas.

## You may fill out the voter registration application if:

- 1. You are a citizen of the United States of America whether by birth or naturalization. A naturalized citizen is a person who was born an alien but has lawfully become a citizen of the United States of America under the U.S. Constitutions and laws. A naturalized citizen has all the rights of a natural born citizen, except is not eligible to be president or vice-president of the United States: and
- 2. You are a resident of Kansas; and
- 3. You are not currently under felony sentence; and
- 4. You will be at least 18 years of age at the next election.



## You may <u>not</u> fill out a voter registration application if:

- You are a green card holder. A green card holder (permanent resident) is someone who has been granted authorization to live and work in the United States on a permanent basis. As proof of that status, U.S. Immigration Services grants a person a permanent resident card, commonly called a "green card;" or
- 2. You are not a citizen of the United States of America whether by birth or naturalization. A naturalized citizen is a person who was born an alien but has lawfully become a citizen of the United States of America under the U.S. Constitutions and laws. A naturalized citizen has all the rights of a natural born citizen, except is not eligible to be president or vice-president of the United States.
