Pursuant to K.S.A. 76-7,131(e), on behalf of the Kansas Board of Regents, Wichita State University gives notice that the State Educational Institution Procurement Committee will conduct a public hearing at 11:00 a.m. Tuesday, November 4, 2025, in Room #203 of the Rhatigan Student Center, 1845 Fairmount St., Wichita, Kansas. Visitor parking is available in the parking garage located south of the Rhatigan Student Center off WuShock Drive.

The purpose of the hearing is for the public to have an opportunity to comment on a request from Wichita State University to utilize a Construction Management At-Risk (CMAR) alternate project delivery method as authorized by the State Educational Institution Project Delivery Construction Procurement Act (K.S.A. 76-7,125 et seq.) for the University Stadium Project Phase 2.

The University Stadium project is a replacement for Cessna Stadium. Phasing has been developed around maintaining the spectator seating and other infrastructure required for the Wichita State Track and Field teams as well as the annual Kansas State High School Activities Association (KSHSAA) Track and Field Championship. Phase 1a (east side improvements) and Phase 1b (track/field improvements) are being handled under a separate contract anticipated to be complete in 2025. Phase 2 will include replacement and/or modifications to the existing west side stadium structure to include seating for 6500 spectators (including accessible seating areas), updated restrooms, a press box, and accommodations for future expansion/improvements.

Construction costs are estimated at \$17 million.

Notice is hereby given of the commencement of the selection process for architectural services for the Justin Hall renovation at Kansas State University. Justin Hall houses the College of Health and Human Sciences, which plans to create improved, applied learning spaces for Kinesiology, Nutrition, Aging, and Child Development. The vision for the college's future includes a laboratory to support health and wellness initiatives – such as yoga, UFM classes, pilates, and after-hours events – and to serve as a community outreach center. The scope of this renovation is to provide updated applied learning lab(s) to support these programs as well as to refresh and to renovate non-compliant ADA accessible restrooms, aged stairwells with non-code compliant features and accessibility concerns, and to begin an initial phase of improvements to replace the building's outdated and original HVAC system (in the zone areas associated with the applied learning improvements).

Design of roof replacement (in one or multiple phases) may be part of this scope pending alignment with the budget. In addition to the support of existing infrastructure and non-code compliant features and accessibility concerns, converting underutilized spaces into a flexible applied learning area will address multiple needs, enhance student, faculty, and staff success, and create an interdisciplinary resource for the college and university. The project construction budget is \$7,000,000.

In accordance with Kansas Administrative Regulations 28-16-57a through 63, 28-18-1 through 17, 28-18a-1 through 31 and 33, 28-16-150 through 154, 28-46-7, and the authority vested with the state by the administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, various draft water pollution control documents (permits, notices to revoke and reissue, notices to terminate) have been prepared and/or permit applications have been received for discharges to waters of the United States and the state of Kansas for the class of discharges described below.

The proposed actions concerning the draft documents are based on staff review, applying the appropriate standards, regulations, and effluent limitations of the state of Kansas and the Environmental Protection Agency. The final action will result in a Federal National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Authorization and/or a Kansas Water Pollution Control permit being issued, subject to certain conditions, revocation, and reissuance of the designated permit or termination of the designated permit.

Notice of Proposed Permit Action

The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) received a Hazardous Waste Facility Permit Application from Koch Fertilizer Dodge City, LLC (KFDC). KFDC is the owner and operator of the facility, which is located at 11559 US-50 Hwy., Dodge City, Kansas, and has EPA identification number KSD044625010.

KDHE is providing notice of its intent to renew the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Hazardous Waste Management Permit for the facility. The proposed renewal permit will require KFDC to continue corrective action for chromium and nitrate contaminated groundwater at the facility.

In October 1985, the State of Kansas received final authorization from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) to implement a hazardous waste management program in lieu of the federal program, except for those portions covered by the 1984 Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments (HSWA). In September 2013, authority for the corrective action portion of the RCRA program was delegated to the State of Kansas.

The draft permit sets forth, in a concise document, the applicable requirements that KDHE will require the permittee to comply with during the 10-year duration of the permit. The draft permit includes standard permit conditions, general facility conditions, and groundwater corrective action requirements for Solid Waste Management Units (SWMUs) and Areas of Concern (AOCs).

The draft permit is being considered for issuance under authority of the Kansas Statutes Annotated (K.S.A.) 65-3430 et seq. and Kansas Administrative Regulations (K.A.R.) 28-31-4 through 28-31-279a. Documents that support the permit conditions specified in the draft permit are part of the administrative record. Applicable regulations are found in 40 CFR Parts 124, 260 through 264, 268, and 270, as specified in this draft permit. All citations found in the draft permit to federal regulations are for the sake of convenience. Some modifications to federal regulations by applicable state regulations are noted in this draft permit, but all modifications to federal regulations by state regulations are incorporated. To the extent that state regulations exclude any sections of applicable federal regulations, those sections of federal regulations shall remain in effect but shall not be enforceable by the Secretary. In the instance of inconsistent language or discrepancies between permit conditions, state regulations, or federal regulations, state regulations shall govern.

State hazardous waste laws require that the public be given at least 45 days to review the administrative record for the draft permit prior to KDHE taking final action. The purpose of having a public comment period is to ensure that interested parties have the opportunity to evaluate the conditions specified in the draft permit and to provide their input into the permit decision-making process. The administrative record, which contains the draft permit, the fact sheet, and all information submitted by the applicant pertaining to this permit action, is available for public review. All data submitted by the applicant is part of the administrative record.
