Notice of Requested Architectural Services

Notice is hereby given of the commencement of the selection process for architectural services for the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT). KDOT is interviewing for an architect to do seven subarea modernizations that will be released for bid over the next one to two fiscal years; Atchison, Marysville and Lincoln Subarea Modernizations will be bid next spring; Stockton, Phillipsburg, Ness City, and Jetmore Subarea Modernizations will be bid as funding becomes available. Each project will have the existing subarea building demolished before completion of the new subarea, and a temporary office trailer with restroom facilities will need to be provided for KDOT staff as part of the project. These existing subareas will be replaced with a drive-in, back-out design or a drive-through design as outlined in the program. The project construction budget is \$2,000,000 for each subarea project (\$14,000,000 total).

Notice Concerning Proposed Kansas Air Quality Construction Permit

Notice is hereby given that the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) is soliciting comments regarding a proposed air quality construction permit. Koch & Company–Seneca has applied for an air quality construction permit in accordance with the provisions of K.A.R. 28-19-300. Emissions of volatile organic compounds (VOC), particulate matter (PM), PM with less than or equal to 10 microns in aerodynamic diameter (PM₁₀), PM with less than or equal to 2.5 microns in aerodynamic diameter (PM_{2.5}), carbon monoxide (CO), oxides of nitrogen (NO_x), oxides of sulfur (SO_x), and hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) were evaluated during the permit review process.

State of Disaster Emergency Proclamation

By virtue of the authority vested in me by the Kansas Emergency Management Act, Chapter 48, Article 9, of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, to meet the inherent dangers of disasters to which the State and its citizens have been exposed, and upon advice of the State Adjutant General as the Director of the Division of Emergency Management, I hereby proclaim a State of Disaster Emergency as follows:

NATURE OF THE DISASTER

The combination of strong winds and dry air is creating elevated fire danger, particularly in western and northwest Kansas with Red Flag Warnings issued by the National Weather Service over most all regions of the state. Local jurisdictions may require support from the state for fire suppression.

DATE THAT DISASTER AFFECTED THE AREA

March 12 2026 and continuing

AREA AFFECTED BY THE DISASTER

I hereby proclaim, direct and order the Adjutant General of the State of Kansas to activate the disaster response and recovery portions of the Kansas Response Plan and to utilize all available resources of the state to cope with the disaster as necessary. The Adjutant General shall coordinate local and inter-jurisdictional disaster plans applicable to the political subdivisions of areas affected by this Proclamation.

Any or all of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Kansas Emergency Management Act may be delegated to the Adjutant General as deemed appropriate during this period of proclaimed State of Disaster Emergency. This may be delegated by written orders, or oral orders subsequently reduced to writing with reference to this Proclamation.

I hereby suspend the provisions of any regulatory statute prescribing the procedures for conduct of state business, or the order or rules and regulations of any state agency which implements such statute, if strict compliance with the provisions of such statutes, order or rule and regulation would prevent, hinder, or delay in any way necessary action in coping with the disaster as set forth in KSA 48-925(c)(1).

This Proclamation shall be filed promptly with the Division of Emergency Management, the Office of the Secretary of State and each city clerk or county clerk, as appropriate, in the area to which this Proclamation applies. Further dissemination of this Proclamation shall occur by means calculated to bring its contents to the attention of the general public.

Senate Bill No. 348

AN ACT concerning the state corporation commission; relating to the jurisdiction of the commission over electric public utilities; exempting any electric public utility that is a not-for-profit wholly owned subsidiary of an electric cooperative public utility from the jurisdiction of the state corporation commission; establishing certain exceptions; authorizing the customers of such subsidiary utility to petition the commission to investigate the rates of such utility; authorizing the commission to order new rates if the commission finds that such rates are found to be unjust, unreasonable, unjustly discriminatory or unduly preferential; requiring the customers of such subsidiary utility to receive notice of and be provided access to meetings concerning electric rates; providing an option for the customers of such subsidiary utility to elect to terminate such exemption.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Kansas:

Section 1. (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, an electric public utility shall not be subject to the jurisdiction, regulation, supervision and control of the state corporation commission if such electric public utility:

(1) Is a not-for-profit wholly owned subsidiary of a corporation organized under the electric cooperative act, K.S.A. 17-4601 et seq., and amendments thereto; and

(2) provides retail electric service to customers in this state.

(b) (1) Notwithstanding an electric public utility's exemption from the jurisdiction of the state corporation commission pursuant to this section, the commission shall investigate all rates, joint rates, tolls, charges and exactions, classifications and schedules of rates of such electric public utility if there is filed with the commission, not more than one year after a change in such utility's rates, joint rates, tolls, charges and exactions, classifications or schedules of rates, a petition signed by not less than 5% of such electric public utility's customers or 3% of the electric public utility's customers from any one rate class. If, after investigation, the commission finds that such rates, joint rates, tolls, charges or exactions, classifications or schedules of rates are unjust, unreasonable, unjustly discriminatory or unduly preferential, the commission shall have the power to fix and order substitutions to such rates, joint rates, tolls, charges and exactions, classifications or schedules of rates as are just and reasonable.

(2) The rates, joint rates, tolls, charges and exactions, classifications or schedules of rates under investigation shall remain in effect subject to change or refund pending the state corporation commission's investigation and final order.

(3) Any customer of the electric public utility that seeks to petition the commission pursuant to subsection (b) (1) may request from such utility the names, addresses and rate classifications of all the utility's customers or the utility's customers from any one or more rate classes. A utility, within 21 days after receipt of such a request, shall furnish to such customer the requested names, addresses and rate classifications and may require such customer to pay the reasonable costs thereof.

(c) An electric public utility exempt from the jurisdiction of the state corporation commission pursuant to this section shall provide not less than 10 days' notice of the time and place of any meeting of the utility or the utility's parent cooperative at which rate changes are to be discussed and voted on. Such notice shall be given to all retail electric customers of such utility. If the meeting is held by the utility's parent cooperative, the parent cooperative shall open such meeting to the customers of such utility. Violations of this subsection shall be subject to civil penalties and enforcement in the same manner as provided by K.S.A. 75-4320 and 75-4320a, and amendments thereto, for violations of K.S.A. 75-4317 et seq., and amendments thereto.

(d) An electric public utility exempt from the jurisdiction of the state corporation commission pursuant to this section shall maintain a schedule of rates and charges at the utility's headquarters and make copies of such schedule of rates and charges available to the general public during regular business hours. If such a utility fails, neglects or refuses to maintain copies of such schedule of rates and charges pursuant to this subsection, the commission may impose a civil penalty of not more than \$500 for each such violation.

(e) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, an electric public utility exempt from the jurisdiction of the state corporation commission pursuant to this section shall not issue any dividend payments, stock repurchase or direct cash payment that is meant to transfer the equity of the electric public utility to the utility's parent cooperative without the approval of the commission.

(f) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, an electric public utility exempt from the jurisdiction of the state corporation commission pursuant to this section shall be subject to the provisions of the renewable energy standards act.

(g) Nothing in this section shall be construed to affect the authority of the state corporation commission, as otherwise provided by law, over an electric public utility exempt from the jurisdiction of the commission pursuant to this section, including, but not limited to, the authority vested in the commission with respect to:

(1) Service territory pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,170 et seq., and amendments thereto;

(2) certificates of public convenience and necessity pursuant to K.S.A. 66-131, and amendments thereto;

(3) charges, fees or tariffs for transmission services, except any such charges, fees or tariffs for transmission services that are approved by the federal energy regulatory commission and recovered through an open access transmission tariff of a regional transmission organization;

(4) sales of power for resale, other than sales between:

(A) An electric public utility that does not provide retail electric service in the state and is owned and governed by four or more corporations organized under the electric cooperative act, K.S.A. 17-4601 et seq., and amendments thereto, one of which corporations shall be the parent corporation of the electric public utility exempt from the jurisdiction of the state corporation commission pursuant to this section; and

(B) the electric public utility that is exempt from the jurisdiction of the state corporation commission pursuant to this section;

(5) wire stringing pursuant to K.S.A. 66-183, and amendments thereto;

(6) transmission line siting pursuant to K.S.A. 66-1,177 et seq., and amendments thereto; or

(7) petitioning for relief pursuant to K.S.A. 66-144, and amendments thereto.

(h) (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the customers of an electric public utility that is exempt from the jurisdiction of the state corporation commission pursuant to this section may elect to terminate such utility's exemption by filing a petition requesting an election to terminate the utility's exemption pursuant to this section. Such petition shall be signed by not less than 10% of the customers of such exempt utility and filed with the board of trustees of the utility's parent cooperative. Notice of the proposition to terminate the utility's exemption pursuant to this section shall be presented to a meeting of the members of the parent cooperative, which shall be open to the customers of the exempt utility and held at a location in the service territory of such exempt utility. The parent cooperative shall provide written notice to the members of the parent cooperative and the customers of such exempt utility not less than 21 nor more than 45 days before the date of the meeting. Such written notice shall include the proposition to terminate such utility's exemption pursuant to this section and the time and location of the meeting.

(2) If the proposition to terminate the utility's exemption pursuant to this section is approved by the affirmative vote of not less than a majority of the customers of such exempt utility voting on the proposition, the parent cooperative shall notify the state corporation commission in writing of the results within 10 days after the date of the election. Voting on the proposition to terminate the utility's exemption pursuant to this section shall be by mail ballot. An election pursuant to this subsection may be held not more than once every two years.

Sec. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its publication in the Kansas register.

(d) Drawing winners will be announced to the public within 10 business days after the drawing has been conducted. The procedures set forth in K.A.R. 111-18-5 for contacting winners and the claiming of prizes shall be followed. The Kansas lottery is not responsible for electronic malfunction or player error.

(e) Each winner in each quarterly drawing will receive a pre-announced prize as shown on the lottery’s website. Taxes on any prize shall be the responsibility of the winner or winners. A prize awarded in the form of play credit shall be paid into the winner’s wallet within 72 hours of the winner announcement, and shall be redeemed within 14 calendar days of award or be forfeited by the winner. Article 301.—SPECIFIC LOTTERY FACILITY GAMES AT LOTTERY GAMING FACILITIES

111-301-77. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery may conduct a lottery facility game at the Boot Hill Casino & Resort in Dodge City, Kansas, entitled “Double Down Madness Blackjack.”

The rules and regulations for the game of “Double Down Madness Blackjack” are contained in K.A.R. 111-301-77 through 111-301-79, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-7-9-25, June 18, 2025; amended, T-111-2-18-26, Feb. 11, 2026.)

Article 401.—NORTHEAST GAMING ZONE

111-401-262. Name of the game; rules and regulations. The Kansas lottery may conduct a lottery facility game at the Hollywood Casino at Kansas Speedway in Kansas City, Kansas, entitled “Double Down Madness Blackjack.”

The rules and regulations for the game of “Double Down Madness Blackjack” are contained in K.A.R. 111-401-262 through 111-401-264, and applicable generic rules are contained in K.A.R. 111-201-1 *et seq.* (Authorized by K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-18-26, Feb. 11, 2026.)

111-401-263. Definitions. The following definitions, when used in the Northeast Kansas Lottery Gaming Zone and pertaining to the game of “Double Down Madness Blackjack,” shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

- (a) "A blackjack" shall mean an ace and any card having a point value of 10 dealt as the initial two cards to a player or a dealer.
- (b) "Burned" shall mean to remove a card from play.
- (c) "Dealer" shall mean the person responsible for dealing the cards at a gaming table.
- (d) "Discard rack" shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed after each round of decisions is rendered in a game.
- (e) "Double down wager" shall mean an optional wager made that doubles the amount of the player's current wager.
- (f) "Flush" shall mean three cards in the same suit.
- (g) "Hard total" shall mean the total point count of a hand which contains no aces or which contains one or more aces that are each counted as having one point in value.
- (h) "Hit" shall mean the player requests one or more additional cards be dealt to the player.
- (i) "Insurance wager" shall mean an optional wager made when the dealer's card dealt face up is an ace.
- (j) "Push" or "tie" shall mean the player does not lose or win the hand played.
- (k) "Score" shall mean the cumulative value of all cards in a player's hand or a dealer's hand.
- (l) "Shoe" shall mean the receptacle into which cards are placed to be held for dealing to the players and dealer.
- (m) "Soft total" shall mean the total point count of a hand containing an ace when the ace is counted as having 11 points in value. (Authorized by K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 74-8710 and K.S.A. 74-8748; implementing K.S.A. 2025 Supp. 74-8710; effective, T-111-2-18-26, Feb. 11, 2026.)

111-401-264. Play and payouts. (a) Before play begins, all cards shall either be shuffled by an automatic shuffling device or manually shuffled by the dealer. If manually shuffled, after the cards have been shuffled, the dealer shall offer the stack of cards to a player to be cut. The player may cut the cards by placing a cutting card provided by the dealer. The cut card shall be placed in the stack so there are no fewer than approximately 52 cards on either side of the cut card.

(b) Before any cards are dealt, each player wishing to participate in that round of play must place a blackjack wager within the limits posted at the table and may make an optional Push 22 side wager.

(c) At the commencement of each round of play, the dealer shall deal one card to the dealer face down, and then starting on the dealer's left and continuing around the table, deal the cards in the following order:

(1) One card face upwards to each spot on the table game layout in which a wager is contained; and

(2) One additional card face down to the dealer, at which time the dealer shall turn the dealer's first card face up and place it on top of the dealer's second card.

(d) Whenever the first card dealt to the dealer is an ace, each player shall have the right to make an insurance bet which, except as otherwise provided herein, shall win if the dealer's second card is a king, queen, jack or 10 and shall lose if the dealer's second card is an ace, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, or 9. An insurance bet may be made by placing on the insurance line of the table game layout an amount up to one-half the amount bet on the player's original blackjack wager.

(e) If the dealer's face up card is an ace, king, queen, jack or 10, then using the peeking device at the table, the dealer will then check the dealer's second card to determine if it constitutes a blackjack. If the dealer has a blackjack, the dealer will turn the dealer's first card face up, collect all original blackjack wagers and Push 22 wagers, and pay all insurance wagers at odds of two to one, at which time that round of play is over.

(f) If the dealer does not have a blackjack, the dealer will collect all losing insurance wagers. Beginning with the player to the dealer's left, the dealer shall then have each player indicate whether the player wishes to stand by maintaining their current hand, hit by requesting an additional card or double down by wagering any additional amount up to the total sum of wagers the player already has in play at that time. This process shall be repeated until the player stands or the cumulative point value of the player's hand exceeds 21. If the player's first card is an ace, the player shall only receive one additional card. If the player's hand constitutes a blackjack, no double down is allowed. No splitting of pairs is permitted.

(g) If the player's hand constitutes a blackjack, the player shall immediately be paid at odds of three to two.

(h) As each player indicates the player's decision(s), the dealer shall deal face upwards additional cards, if any, necessary to effectuate such decision.

(i) If the cumulative point value of a player's hand exceeds 21, the player's blackjack wager shall be collected, the dealer shall remove that player's cards from the table game layout and that player shall not participate further in that round of play, except a Push 22 wager made by that player shall remain in play and will be settled at the appropriate time.

(j) After the decision(s) of each player has been implemented and all additional cards have been dealt, the dealer shall turn the dealer's second card face up. If needed, the dealer shall then draw additional cards to the dealer's hand face up until the dealer has:

(1) A hard total of 17, 18, 19, 20, or 21, whichever comes first; or

(2) A soft total of 18, 19, 20, or 21, whichever comes first.

(k) All remaining wagers shall then be settled as follows:

(1) If the cumulative point value of the dealer's hand is less than the player's hand or if the cumulative point value of the dealer's hand exceeds 21, the player's blackjack wager shall be paid at the odds of one to one;

(2) If the cumulative point value of the player's hand is less than the dealer's hand and the dealer's hand has a cumulative point value of 21 or less, the player's hand shall lose, and the dealer shall collect the player's blackjack wager;

(3) If the cumulative point values of the dealer's and player's hands are equal, the hands will be a push and the player's blackjack wager will be returned to the player; and

(4) If the cumulative point value of the dealer's hand is anything other than 22, each Push 22 wager shall lose, and the wagers shall be collected by the dealer. If the cumulative point value of the dealer's hand is exactly 22, the dealer shall pay each Push 22 wager at odds of eleven to one.
